Introduction

The Huntsville-Madison County Historical Society was founded in 1951 through the farsighted leadership of several local residents. Two of the prime movers in forming the Society were Dr. Francis C. Roberts and Mrs. C. H. Russell. The first officers were: President, Henry Chase; Vice President, Judge Thomas Jones; Secretary/Treasurer: Felix Newman; Board of Directors, Reese Amis, Harry Rhett, Mrs. Sallie Gill, Mrs. R. J. Lowe, D. C. Monroe, and Josh Kelly.

The purpose of the Society as set forth in the bylaws is "to afford an agency for expression among those having common interests in (1) collecting and preserving information about any past phase of community life in Huntsville, Alabama, and (2) in recording the history of the section of which Madison County is a part."

In 1971, as a part of this commitment to "collect, preserve, and record" the Society began publication of *The Huntsville Historical Review*. Since that time, the Society has published twenty-seven volumes in sixty issues. A broad range of topics has been covered in these issues. These topics include, but are not limited to: the early history of Huntsville-Madison County; Civil War activities in the area; the foundation of industry and organizations; and important people, places, things and events.

Using the Listing & Index

This publication is divided into three parts:

- a. Historical Review List of Publications (pages 1-6)
- b. Subject Index (pages 7-15)
- c. Author Index (pages 17-23)

To use the publication:

The Historical Review List of Publications lists all issues and articles of the Historical Review that have been published through the year 2000. These are listed in the sequence of publication. The articles that appear in each volume are shown with the page number where they can be found. The first column, titled REF, is the reference number that has been assigned to each article and is used with the Subject Index and Author Index as explained below.

The Subject Index lists in alphabetical order the various subjects of the articles that can be found in all the Historical Reviews. To use this, find a subject in which there is an interest, Architecture as an example. In the column labeled "SUBJECT", find Architecture. On this line in the column labeled "Historical Review REF Number" the numbers "5, 97, 100, and 187" are shown. Each one of these numbers is found in the REF column in the Historical Review List of Publications discussed above. The "5", for example, shows that Architecture is found in an article beginning on page 18 of Volume 1, #2 (printed April 1971) under the title Early American Architecture Related to Consitution Hall State Park. The author of this article is J. Martz.

The Author Index lists in alphabetical order the authors of the articles in all of the Historical Reviews and the articles that were written by each person. To use this part, if Fisk, S.H. is the author of interest for example, one sees that Fisk authored three articles (one as a co-author with Smith, J.). Fisk is the author of an article in VOLUME 1, #3, in VOLUME 1, #4, and in VOLUME 1, #1. The title of each article is shown in the third column, the volume number (#) is in the fourth column, the publication date is in the fifth column, and the sixth column shows the page number in the volume where the article starts. The second column labeled REF in bold type refers to the Historical Review List of Publications that was discussed above.
