Summary Report



**Burton - Morton Cemetery, 71-1, Redstone Arsenal, Madison Co. AL, April 28, 2003
No inscribed tombstones found**

This cemetery is located in the east side of the arsenal, on the north shoulder of Redstone Road. As the caption of the above photo states, there are no inscribed tombstones above ground today. Accordingly, those who may be buried in this cemetery are unknown, leading to the assumption that this may a “black cemetery” due to the commonly encountered condition of few or no

tombstones in the black cemeteries. However, there is a possibility that the earliest landowners are interred here. If that were the case, initially establishing the site as a cemetery, it may have become used by later black families and landowners. There may have even been tombstones in the past, but sadly to contemplate, old cemeteries are often victims of neglect, and tombstones do get removed from some cemeteries through time.

Considering these facts, all that can be done at this time to learn the history of the people of this cemetery in the southwest quarter of Section 11, Township 5, Range 1 West, is to assume a connection to the early landowners. Results of research into the public records of land ownership are shown in the images inserted below.

This image from Margaret Cowart's book of original landowners in Madison County shows that the majority (east of the old Chickasaw Indian Boundary Line) of Section 11 was initially purchased from the government in 1811 by the heirs of John Turner. A small portion of Section 11 (57 acres) was purchased by Alexander G. Wall as an assignee of someone else in 1831. Research into the family of Alexander G. Wall has shown a close connection to the family of John Turner, as discussed in the Summary Report of the Lacy Cemetery, 75-1, which is nearby, to the southeast about a mile away.

The above "Index To Lands" page for T5-R1W by G. W. Jones & Sons shows no transfer through the year 1919 of the land out of the hands of anyone surnamed Turner, even though it does show that Henry B. Turner purchased some of the land in 1866 as "Grantee" from "Grantor(s)" William C. & Peter Binford. The index further shows that Alexander Wall sold some of the land near the cemetery to Thomas O. Burton, per Madison County Deed Book O, page 267, as recorded in 1833. It further shows that Thomas O. Burton transitioned land to M. A. Burton by Trustee, per Deed Book GG, page 448, as recorded in 1867. Eventually, as filed in 1875 after change of ownership several times (as inferred from the index for the SW/4), some of the land passed from the Burton family by Sheriff's sale or foreclosure. In 1907 Deed Book 95, page 340, recorded that Rufus & Mary Love acquired the land from H. S. & Belle B. Nance. This index to land sales does not show a transition to anyone by the name of Morton through the year 1919. However, a check of the on-line Madison County Records Center marriage index shows that Belle C. **Burton** was licensed to marry H. S. Nance on 6 November 1882. That license is recorded in Madison County Marriage Book 12, on page 321. It therefore appears that the Burton family owned the land until 1907, when it was sold to Rufus and Mary Love.

The Madison County General Index (Reverse) to Real Property, 1809 – 1919 (shown below), for the Burton surname includes the purchase of land from Alexander G. Wall in 1833 by Thomas O. Burton. This purchase would have been for the 57-acre tract that Alexander G. Wall purchased from the government in 1831. The index further shows the transition of the same parcels of land to Minerva A. Burton in 1867. However, it can also be seen that there are other entries for a "Mrs. M. A. Burton" for land acquisitions in Madison (town of) in 1891. Yet, before it can be inferred that there is a connection between the arsenal cemetery landowners and the John W. Burton of the town of Madison, it should be noted that there is also an entry for John W. Burton involved in a land transaction with Martha A. Burton, not Minerva A. Burton. Therefore, the entries for "M. A. Burton" appear to involve two different people.

The above page of the 1870 census shows (for reference) the family of the John Burton who became a pioneer druggist in the town of Madison, just northwest of arsenal lands. The Burton family enterprise was among the core businesses within Madison as it grew from a small village to a city.

The page of the 1870 census below shows James W. Morton, age 32, born in South Carolina, living in the household headed by Nancy Graham, of the south arsenal Rankin – Dickson Cemetery. In fact, Madison County Marriage Book Volume 5, page 1161, recorded the license for a marriage between James W. Morton and Margaret A. L. Dickson on 4 September 1871. Eighteen years later, on 5 February 1889 a license was issued in Madison County for the marriage of Nina Morton to H. W. Jamar, per Marriage Book Volume 16, page 426. However, James Morton was not the first of the surname found in the marriage records for the county.

In 1817, on May 5, a license was issued for the Joseph Morton and Sally Slaughter. The Slaughter family was among the very earliest of Madison County pioneers, with representation in the “squatters” on Indian lands known as the Sims Settlement in the period of 1806 – 1812. Today there is a road that forms part of the boundary between Huntsville and Madison that is known as “Slaughter Road”. It passes near the 1800s Lanford - Slaughter Mansion on Old Madison Pike near Indian Creek where Dr. John R. Slaughter lived for a number of years and practiced his trade. The old Chickasaw Indian Boundary line that ran through the arsenal area extends along a portion of Slaughter Road between Old Madison Pike and U. S. Highway 72.

Of course, at this time the exact connection of James W. Morton and his wife Sallie Slaughter to the Burton family of the arsenal is not known. However, the cemetery obtained its name somehow to tie the two surnames together, so it is still reasonable to assume that members of both families are buried there. The fact that both the Burton family and the Morton family were obviously “well-off” and “well-placed” among arsenal land pioneers further indicates that they would possibly have had some connections or ownership of the land around the cemetery at some time. The family of James W. Morton did not stay in the household of Nancy Graham, as the census of 1880 (inserted excerpts to be found later in this report) reveals.

It is likely that the person recorded as John W. Morton in 1880 is actually the James W. Morton of the 1870 census. This conclusion is based upon the age in each census and the fact that both are shown as having connection to South Carolina. It is not at all unusual for the record of the state of birth origin to vary from one census to another for the same person. The 1880 census in Word form for the Burton and Morton families on arsenal lands is shown below, with some of their more recognizable neighboring surnames.

Until more information is acquired by examination of actual deeds and probate records for the pioneer families discussed above, there can be few definite conclusions reached about the cemetery. Also, it is only a hope that examination of additional records will clarify the ambiguities encountered to date about this cemetery and the pioneers of the land where it is found. While only the white pioneers were researched so far, it is still possible that the cemetery derives its name from later black owners of the land. However, that is considered to be improbable from the current level of information presented above. Perhaps time will eventually allow these deceased citizens of long ago to be re-identified and possibly new markers erected for their descendants to know where they were buried. For now, the cemetery is well protected and maintained, even if nobody knows who may be in each grave.
