Nancy Astor (1879-1964)

Viscountess of Britain

Nancy Witcher Astor was the first woman to serve in the British House of Commons.

Robert Hobart (1760-1816)

Politician

American Outlaw

James Abram Garfield (1831-1881)

20th President of the United States of America

Serving the second shortest term in U. S. history (only 6 months), James Garfield was the second President of the United States to be assassinated.

American Outlaw

American Poet

English Poet

19th President of the United States of America

<u>Isaac Newton</u> (1643-1727)

Scientist, Mathematician

Isaac Newton is regarded as one of the greatest scientists and mathematicians in history. He described 3 laws of motion that also govern the entire earth and the celestial bodies surrounding it.
