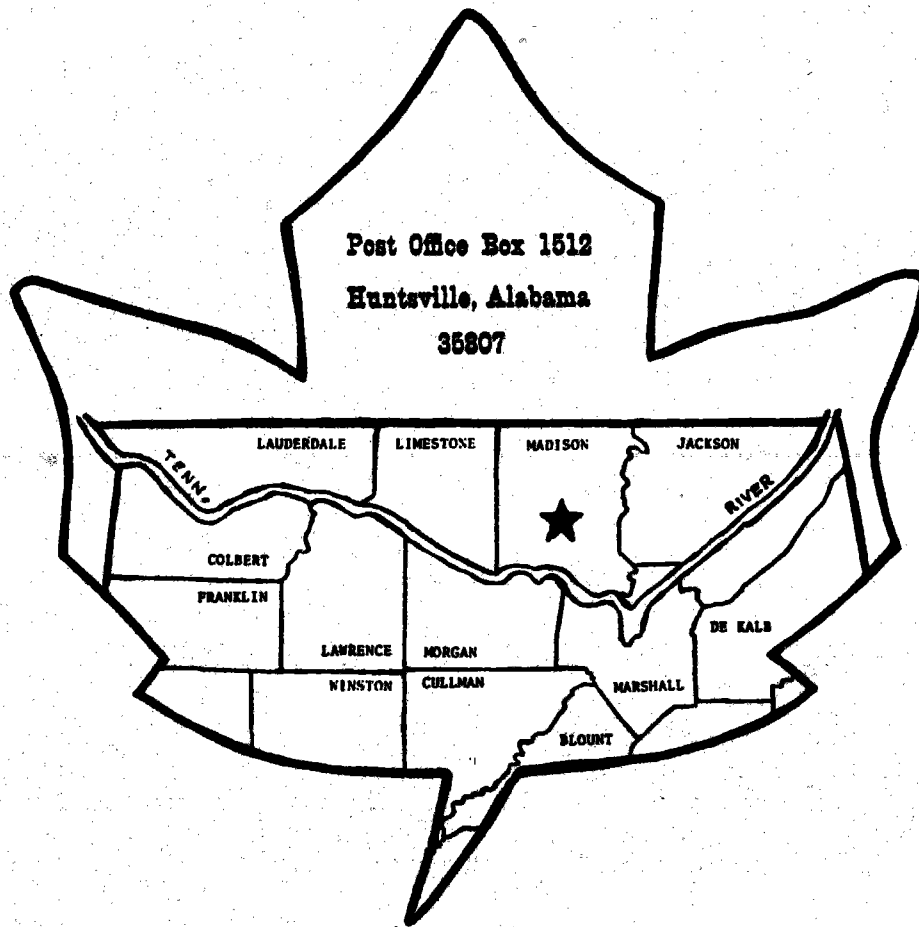

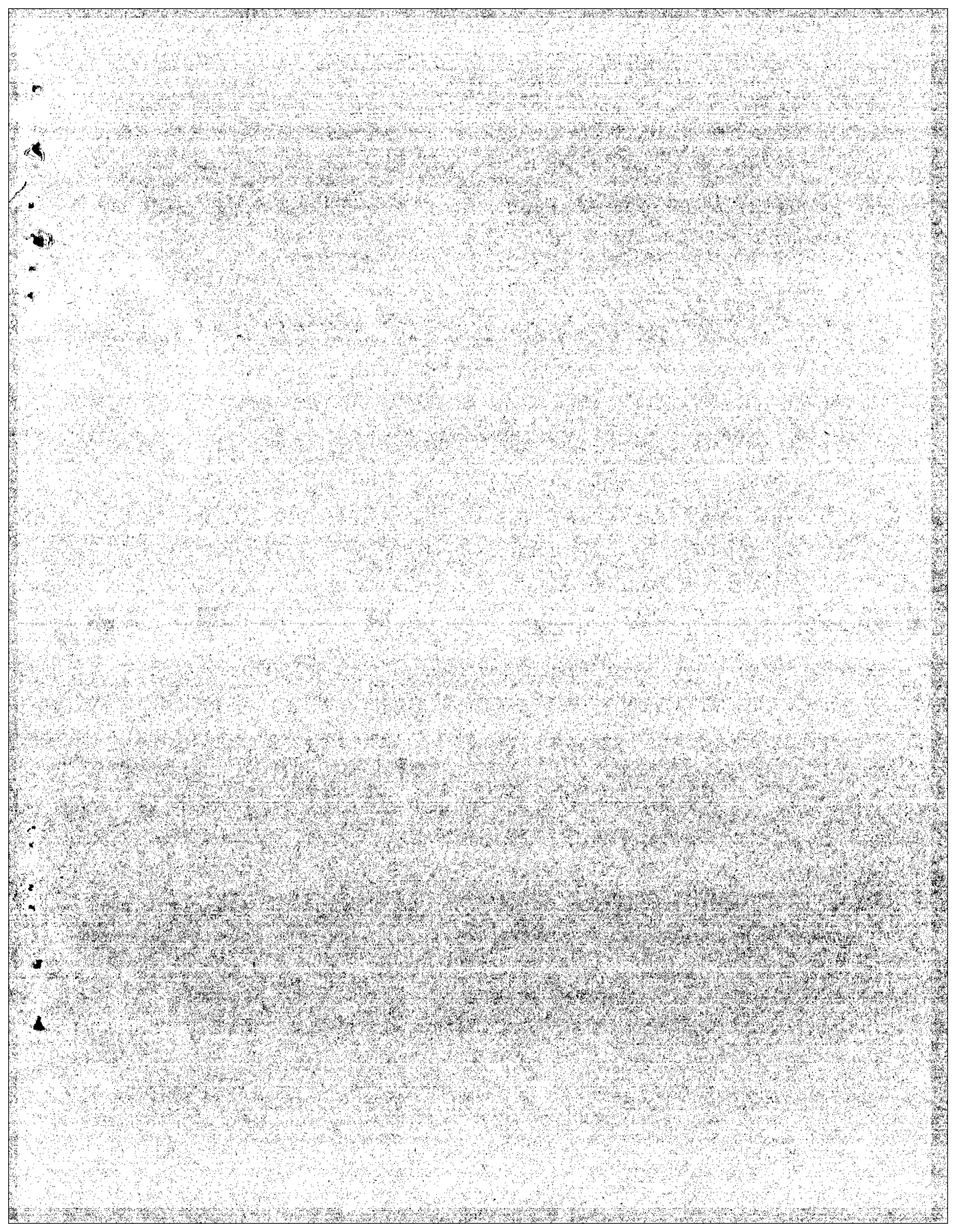

SOMERVILLE METHODIST CHURCH

Note: This delightful article was prepared by Mrs. Anna T. Blackwell, Route 1, Somerville, Alabama, and appears in the front of a small cookbook offered by the ladies at the Somerville Methodist Church. Mrs. Blackwell is quite interested in church, local and family history, and has graciously permitted us to reprint her article.

Like a thread of gold woven into a tapestry that grows more dim with every passing year, the history of the Somerville Methodist Church stands out bold and bright. The very first settlers of Somerville were Methodists but even before the exodus of the Indian we have stories of Methodists who lived in or near Somerville. Morgan County, or Cotaco as it was originally called, was created by the first legislature of Alabama Territory in session at St. Stephens, February 4, 1818. The County was named for Cotaco Creek which flows through the eastern portion of the county. The legislature designated the house of William Vaughn at Somerville to be the temporary seat of justice for the county.

Somerville was incorporated December 3, 1819. The community was named after Lt. Robert Somerville, a Tennessean, who was killed at the battle of Horseshoe Bend. The population of Somerville at that time was 1,000.

In 1830 the first Methodist Society was organized in Somerville. The Rev. C.A. Welch had come from Kentucky to settle in the county seat. Up to that time there had been no church in the town. Rev. Welch, with the help of Rev. Elisha J. Dodson and his junior preacher, F.C. Ferguson, established a preaching place and organized the first church. The original membership consisted of C.A. Welch, Eliza Welch, John T. Rather, Tunstill Banks, John F. Mosely, Robert Francis, Mrs. Robert Francis, Mrs. Martha T. Goff and Rachel Campbell. Since that organizational meeting in 1830 there has never ceased to be a Methodist Church in Somerville. For many years the Methodists preached and worshipped in the Court House. Then they built a church across the street where the Masonic Lodge Building is now located.

In 1836, the year the permanent court house was built, the Presbyterians also built their church and school. This church was a splendid structure, made of brick, with foundation stones approximately ten feet long. These were quarried out of solid rock by slave labor. It also had divided pews, separating the male and female worshippers, and a balcony where the slaves worshipped. Back of the church was the college. For many years this beautiful church stood symbolically located on a knoll overlooking the ruins of the college and a once thriving community that was now little more than nostalgic memories. When the Presbyterian Church was built Somerville was the most important town in the

county. There were two schools of secondary rating, a Men's Academy and a Female Academy, to which girls came from as far away as Texas and Arkansas, the Presbyterian Training School, a public grammar school, the court house and jail, in addition to a number of business establishments. It was the center of trade for the county and a cotton distribution point. During the Civil War an Officers Training School was located in Somerville.

The Civil War brought an abrupt halt to the town from which it was never able to recover. The Presbyterian School was discontinued and the building stood empty until 1887 when a Baptist Church was organized, having no place to worship they were happy to accept the invitation of the Presbyterian Church to use their building. However, by about 1900 the Baptist membership had gradually dwindled until finally their church was dissolved.

In 1909 the Somerville Methodist Church purchased the Presbyterian building. They used it until it burned in 1958. At that time it had just been repaired. Shortly after the church burned an attempt to rebuild was started and the foundation of the new church was laid. But the membership was small and composed of people in moderate circumstance. It was not until 1960 that an energetic building committee, with D.B. Mooneyham as chairman, began in earnest to work on the church. The entire membership was determined to keep on working until a house of worship worthy of the wonderful Methodist heritage of Somerville was completed.

Today that dream is a reality. Many people helped to make it come true but none deserve more credit than does the Rev. James M. Holland. He was the inspiration, the guide, the comforter and the prodder, who kept us going. Without his untiring efforts we would never have the beautiful sanctuary we now enjoy.

Although we remember with pride the past we are very proud and humbly grateful to all the people of Somerville who are working to uphold the traditions of yesteryear and to preserve for posterity the wonderful heritage which is ours.

MARRIAGE OF THOMAS M. PETERS AND NAOMI LEETCH

NOTE: The following contract between Thomas M. Peters, who became Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court, and Naomi Leetch, who was a first cousin to President James K. Polk, was submitted by Mr. Spencer A. Waters.

The State of Alabama, Lawrence County) Whereas, a marriage is about to be solemnized between Thomas Minott Peters and Naomi S. Leetch, and Whereas the said Naomi S. Leetch will be entitled to a considerable estate both real and personal as one of the heirs of her father William Leetch deceased, as also an heir of her brothers James and William Leetch deceased, to all of which property she will be fully entitled in her own right so soon as the estates aforesaid shall be ready for distribution; and whereas the said Thomas M. Peters is willing and desirous that said estate both real and personal, shall remain and continue for the sole and separate use of her the said Naomi S. Leetch and her children arising from her intermarriage with him the said Thomas M. Peters, subject however to the limitations and restrictions hereinafter mentioned: Now, This Indenture made this twenty fifth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred and thirty eight, witnesseth, that for and in consideration of said contemplated marriage he the said Thomas M. Peters does by these presents relinquish unto the said Naomi S. Leetch and her children, if any there may be arising from her intermarriage with him the said Thomas M. Peters, all right, title and interest which might or could by law accrue to him, by virtue of his intermarriage with her the said Naomi S. Leetch in the real and personal property of the estates of the said William Leetch Sr. deceased, and of the said James and William Leetch deceased, to remain and inure to the only proper use and behoof of her the said Naomi S., and her children arising from the contemplated marriage forever; free and exempt from any claim of right on the part of him the said Thomas M. Peters, or any other person claiming by, through, or under him; reserving however to him the said Thomas M. Peters the sole and entire control of the management and use of said property both real and personal so long as he may live, as trustee for the said Naomi S. Leetch, and her children arising from said intermarriage: and the proceeds and profits therefrom arising to be used for the support, maintenance, and comfort of her the said Naomi S. Leetch, and her children arising from said marriage: but should the said Naomi S. Leetch die before the said Thomas M. Peters, leaving no children arising from said marriage, then the whole of said estate both real and personal, shall vest absolutely in the said Thomas M. Peters; and should the said Thomas M. Peters die before the said Naomi S. Leetch without children arising from said marriage, then, the estates aforesaid shall vest absolutely and entirely in said Naomi S. Leetch and remain at her disposal forever. And as some difficulty may exist in relation to the distribution and division of the real and personal estate of William Leetch Sr. deceased, which could only be obviated by

compromise between the heirs at law of said estate, the said Thomas M. Peters hereby reserves to himself the right and privilege of making such compromise in relation to the portion of the said Naomi S. Leetch as to him may seem just, and such portion, when ascertained, shall be received by said Thomas M. Peters for the uses and trusts aforesaid and in no other right whatever.

In testimony whereof he the said Thomas M. Peters has hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and date first above written.

Thos. Minott Peters (Seal)

The State of Alabama, Lawrence County) This day personally appeared before me James Gallagher Judge of the County Court of Lawrence County aforesaid, Thomas M. Peters, and acknowledged that he signed, sealed, and delivered the within and foregoing deed of relinquishment on the day of the date thereof, and for the purposes therein specified and set forth.

Given under my hand at Moulton this
twenty fifth day of June 1838.

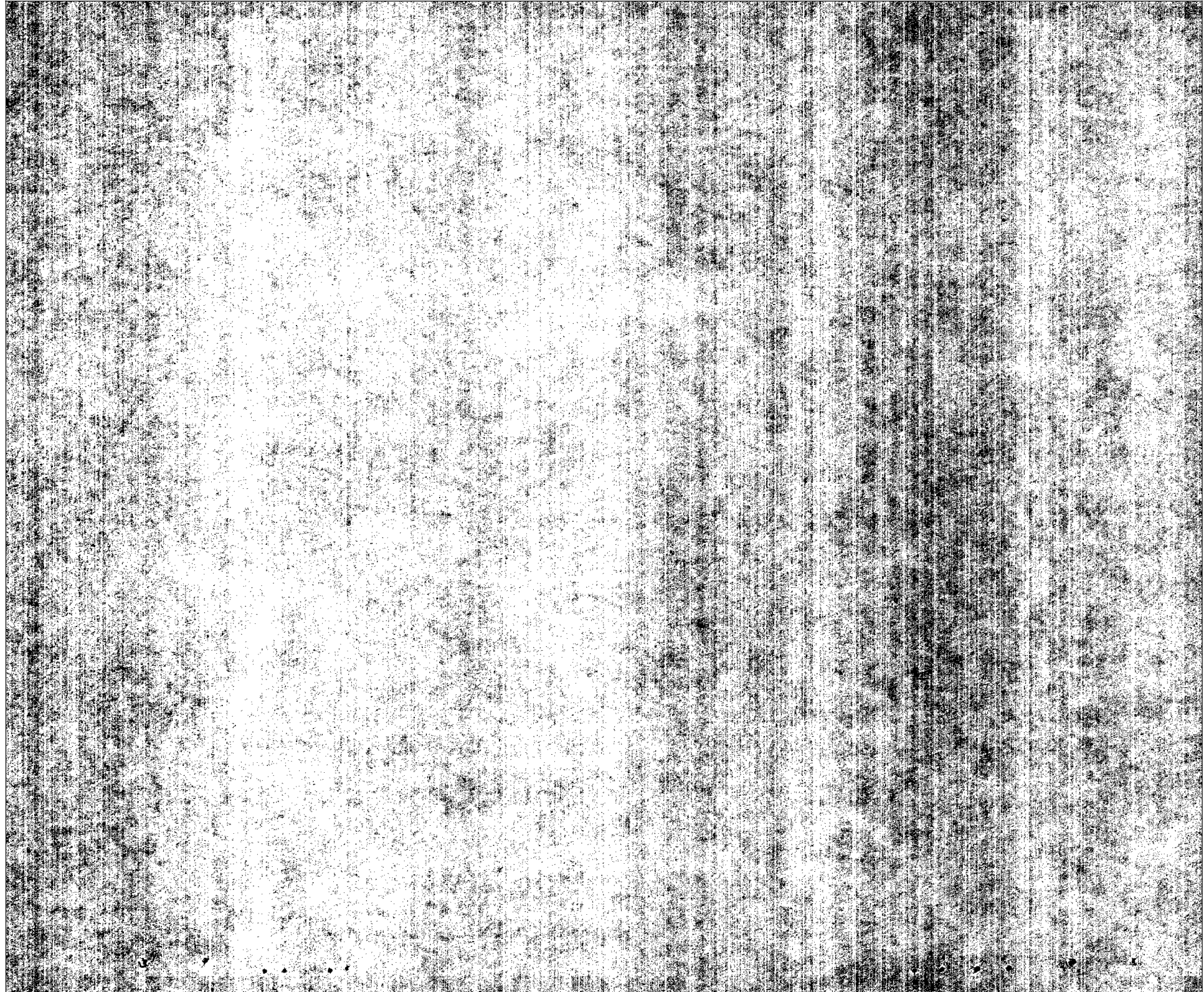

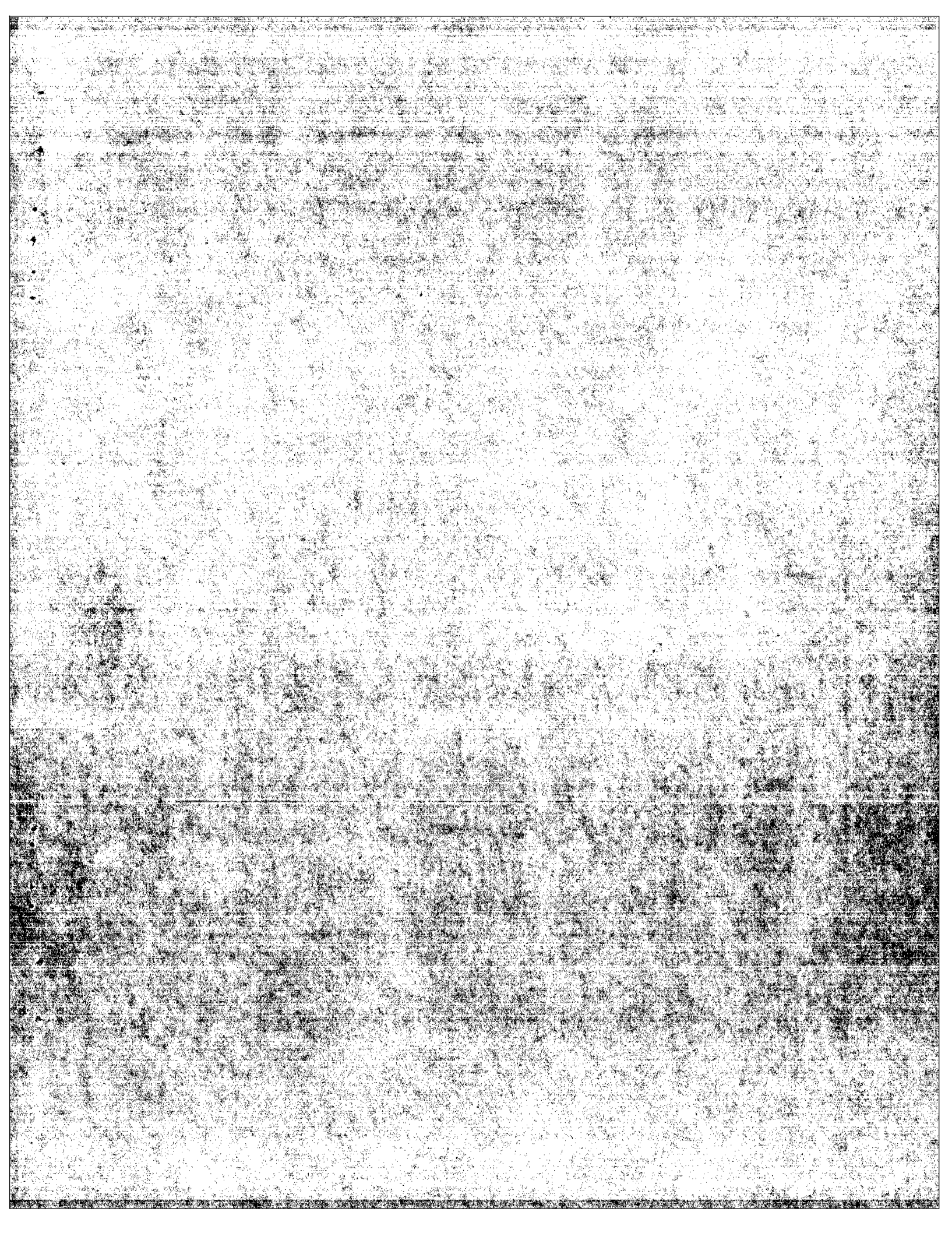

TVGS NOVEMBER 1967, MEETING

The Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society was indeed fortunate recently when Mrs. Howard C. Jones, Sr., of New Market, Alabama, spoke to our group. Mrs. Jones and her sister-in-law, Mrs. B. W. Gandrud of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, are the foremost genealogists in North Alabama. They have published 227 volumes (limited circulation) of genealogical records about North Alabama counties. Mrs. Jones spoke to us November 2, 1967, about availability of courthouse records in this area. We believe all members will be interested in the following transcript of Mrs. Jones' talk:

It was suggested that I tell something of the resources of the various court houses my sister and I have visited in the forty and more years we have pursued Alabama settlers. We have been fascinated by the settlers and their habits of seeking greener fields over the next ridge. This county (Madison) is one of the most fortunate, in that most of its judges have been interested in preserving what we have; however, there are some sad losses.

First, our marriage records are not very reliable until we get into Book A4, the first original one. From a certificate in Book 2, one surmises that it was in the 1850's, in Judge Hammond's term, the older records were copied--or, copied "at". Book 1, the Mississippi Territory period, must have been compiled from loose bonds, since none bear any record of execution--save three or four, of a prominent family; but they do not show bondsmen and if the originals did, they were not copied. We know and can prove that in several instances names are incorrect, and also dates (one of which is given after the groom had died and his widow made administratrix!). Some of the bonds must have been lost, since we were told of several Bible records regarding marriages solemnized in this county which are not in the book.

Book 2 covers the Alabama Territory period, and shows bondsmen. In a number of instances a name, which should be on the page three times, will not be the same in license and bond, leaving a question as to which is correct.

Book 3 contains one of the two original books ("C") which has survived. By checking 3 against C, I found that the copyist had completely omitted 99 marriages, by taking the top one on C's page, and omitting the bottom one; and, several times turning two pages at once and leaving out all four. He erred in dates, also, as well as a name, occasionally. The writing in C is very clear and legible, while that of the copyist definitely is not, especially the latter part of the name. Evidently no effort was made to check his work, and one can't but feel perhaps he patronized the Bell Tavern a bit too often. The last entry in C that we have is in August, 1828--and the records between then and Book 4, which starts with Book E, our other surviving original, in 1831, are gone. E's last entry is in January, 1836. Book 4 continues until September, 1843, the originals being lost. There are also some differences in a few of the E and 4 records; one can't be positive that the entries in these first four books are to be relied upon, without some other evidence. Also, it may be suspected that 4B missed some of the wartime marriages--there must have been more than are in it.

Some of the very early estates are gone--the Index lists some quite early files which are not in the cases, although some still are. We have no records of wills, save those in the deed books, before 1818, but seem complete since then. Part, at least, of the Orphans Court Minutes from January 1810 to July, 1817, is in the safekeeping of Myrtle Greene; it is a photostatic copy of the original which, I understood from Judge Jones, came from the Archives. Book 2 is there--Book 3 is not. At one time Judge Jones told me he had a handwritten copy, and I got the impression it came from the Archives. I started abstracting it--it seemed to have a good many cases concerning assaults, etc., and so far as I got, not many estate papers. Some crisis at home prevented continuing on it, and when a year or so later, I asked about it, Judge Jones had been replaced and the office knew nothing about it, nor have I seen it since.

The old files which remain are most valuable, but in the 158 years which have passed, many have disappeared. One suspects some have been carried away by searchers, but the most were taken out by lawyers, who were supposed to return them and didn't. Miss Fannie Cabaniss told me that there was a building across from the courthouse which contained numerous law offices; there was a fire, and the contents burned, which accounted for many of them. She also told me that when the recently destroyed courthouse was built, and contents from the previous one being moved into it, she came one morning to find the janitor burning a number of old books on the lawn; she rescued some belonging to her office. These old files, with the signatures of countless early residents, are most interesting, and many contain papers never put on the books.

The old accounts of sales give the names of persons here, not found elsewhere. We discovered that Margaret Pickens, mother of Joseph Pickens, came here with her four children, by finding her listed as a purchaser of two small items on two sales of household goods. Judge Chapman earned my undying enmity by, at a time when a number of Revolutionary soldiers were dying, listing on the final settlements all sums taken in and paid out, and then saying "there remains in the hands of the administrator the sum of so and so for distribution to the heirs"--and never a word as to their names!

The records of the court, sometimes Chancery, sometimes Equity, are extremely valuable, if the family one seeks was suing or being sued--there are transcripts of Virginia wills and deeds, details of relationship--recently the marriage of a Georgia couple was positively proved, by a suit versus her brother, here--in which he referred to his brother in law, Mr. Williams.

Of course, everyone knows the value of deed books (altho most inquirers ask first for wills--which too often are the "wife and children" and no names stated, sort). The deed indexes up in the record room list only deeds pertaining to land in the county; but the old one in the vault lists all, including those for land in other counties, other states, and personal property (including gifts of slaves). A few deed books have been copied and the originals lost.

The Tract Book shows the names of the ones receiving patents only--and if listed as "assignee" does not give the name of the

assignor, nor do the records in Washington. However, we proved the correctness of the tradition that Isaac Criner's wife was a daughter of Robert McCain, by finding she was reared on a certain quarter section, then abstracting it to the patentee; and getting the record from DC that one Robert McCain had made a number of payments, then this man took over. If we only had a list of those who first got certificates, we'd know where many had lived before coming here. Such a book was in Nashville, back in the 1920's, but recent inquiry was answered by the State Library that they knew nothing of it. Our Archives says they have "some" books, but many were thrown in the Alabama River before a stop was put to it, and if I'd come to Montgomery I might see what they do have! If you can find where anyone lived, the tract book will show if he patented it. But this book is not indexed by name. My father in law said that it was his considered opinion that not more than half the deeds executed before 1900 "ever saw the courthouse". No one then ever demanded an abstract, more is the pity.

Mr. Bragg is the one who has prowled the Circuit Court records - -I never had time to do much since much of the writing is very small, faded, and hard to decipher, but there are valuable items there- -the naturalization applications, the pension applications- -(but the minute book for the period most were filed seems gone), and other genealogical items.

As to other counties: Limestone County has very good records save their marriages start in 1838, with Will Books 1, 2, 8, and 10 lost. One Judge told us they sent their books to Georgia during the war- -another man said he was told they were distributed among the townspeople, but some must have been in the building when "the Russian Beast" let his Union soldiers burn it- -probably that Book 10 and the then-current marriages. Their Minute Books are apparently all there; and from them one can ascertain which estates were in the lost will books. Deed records are complete- -evidently in case of fire, the deeds are the ones most effort is made to save! Ante-bellum files are gone.

Lawrence County is in sad shape. We have a few records from there. I spent a day there some years ago, for a client, and first had to try to sort out the old books, helter skelter in a basement room. Later I have been told that basement was flooded, the books floating about in the water. Their final fate I do not know.

We spent a little time in Morgan County. Their marriages begin (Book A) with No. 132, July, 1821, so those between 1818 and that date may or may not exist. From there on seems complete; however, they are, almost surely, copies of older books, since they are on that peculiar blue paper one doesn't find till in the 1850's. I have found some quite old minute books, and other estate records, but never had time to work them systematically.

Marshall County has very good records, but they seemed, at one period at least, to file all an estate's records then put them in a book, at the same time. It has marriages and estates, and deeds, altho I looked at very few deed books.

My sister said Blount's records are in good shape, and we are told DeKalb's are, while the Cherokee Courthouse burned.

The destruction of the Jackson County records is usually attributed to Federal troops, but my father in law who did a great deal of surveying there before the day of the auto, and consequently had to stay overnight, told me that a number of persons said it was local arson which destroyed the building. . . "somebody wanted some papers in there to disappear". However, we have written evidence as to the fate of the marriage bonds, in the copy of a letter, dated Bellefonte, Alabama, August 23, 1863, from a Union soldier to his mother, saying "Yesterday morning Headquarters was moved to the courthouse and the Adjutant's office located in the room formerly occupied by the Clerk of the Court. We found all the old records of the county scattered over the floor. The documents are dated as far back as 1820. About fifty large books we reserved, while the remaining books and papers were collected in one great heap and burned. There were not less than three bushels of marriage licenses and bonds, signed by his or her mark- -not one out of ten could sign their own name. This building is an excellent one for this country; it is built of brick and two stories high." We spent one day in Scottsboro a number of years ago and found two old deed books, with no marking on the bindings; there may be more. The first estate book we found was PM A- -with the first 34 pages gone, beginning in February, 1856, and marriages beginning in September, 1851.

Lauderdale County has good records and I have worked through MR 5, and a good many estate books. Last year their Probate Judge had all their old marriage records laminated- -for which he should have a medal! This county (Madison) has some books which badly need it- -the original ORC minutes (altho the WPA did an outstanding job copying them), and several of the early Probate Records, as well as deed books A, B, C, and D which are brittle from age. But Madison County is so busily "progressing" it prefers to spend its money where more people will see it.

The burning of the Franklin County Courthouse many years ago destroyed all the records of that county as well as those of that part of Colbert, cut off Franklin.

Talladega has marriages and estates- -and deeds I am sure. But I found it a bit hard to find the books I wanted, in a two day visit there.

With my sister, I visited Marengo, which did have good records but has since had a fire; she was told last year that an effort is being made to restore the water damaged volumes.

She has done a lot in Greene, Dallas, Jefferson, Tuscaloosa, Sumter, and Bibb, all of which have much to offer; we also went to Perry, which is taking care of its records. Perry and Dallas were good places to work- -they have tables and chairs, while at a number of county seats one has to stand at a counter. In some, the staff is nice and helpful, in some- -not. Shelby was the most- -indifferent. We went there, hoping to get the papers on Isaac Criner's mother-in-law's estate, which had been copied and given us by Mr. Franke of Birmingham, and have xerox copies made. No, they didn't know anything about any old files. Maybe they were up in the attic- -the third story! We could not go up there and search, in a brief stay, so gave up. The old books they did have were

HUGE, and stored right next to the ceiling- -and no janitor to be hired to get them down.

Dr. Owen gathered up all the ante bellum newspapers from the various counties he could, and put them in Archives. However, several counties kept theirs- -Sumter and I believe Greene. We have the after the war ones, which are very brittle, and tear at a look. It is a pity some way could not be found to preserve them, for the microfilms are not very satisfactory, especially to eyes not too young, unless some way could be found to better enlarge them, and project them on a good sized screen.

So often people ask about tombstones. Alas, they are disappearing rapidly, since the law against desecrating a graveyard is so often ignored, and there are no kin to protest when a little and long abandoned graveyard is built or plowed over. There are several which we copied back in the 20's and 30's now gone. Many times one is "excepted" in a deed- -with "twenty feet square for a burying ground"- -somewhere on 160 acres! A Nashville descendant who took up cudgels with the State Highway Department saved the Isaac Welborn graveyard on Highway 231- -tho the only stone is that of Nancy King, his daughter.

Genealogy is a fascinating, often baffling, pursuit, and does give one following it a sense of history- -of admiration for those who made this country, and will perhaps help us to preserve it.

AUSTIN HACKWORTH - REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

Lucille A. Beard, 1201 W. Taylor, Lovington, New Mexico, submits the following information and Revolutionary War record about her ancestor Austin Hackworth. Austin Hackworth died 1846-47 in Morgan County, Alabama, and might be buried at Round Top, near Falkville, Morgan County, Alabama. His grand-daughters are buried at Round Top. Austin Hackworth married Ruth _____; their children:

The Revolutionary War record (#R 4410) for Austin Hackworth:

At Court, of Marion County, Tennessee, at town of Jasper, 21st November 1832- -AUSTIN HACKWORTH, a resident of Marion Co., aged 86, made the following declaration.

That he entered service of the United States at Bedford Co., Virginia- -was drafted as a private for a three month tour, under Capt. Thomas Bluford, 1st Lieut., Edward Golman, 2nd Lieut., Thomas Doolin, and Ensign Jonathan Conduff, against the Shawnee Indians. That he marched under said officers from Bedford Co. to Roanoke in Botetourt Co. where they joined the main army commanded by Gen. Lewis, Col. Fields and Lewis (has forgotten names of other field officers); that he was marched with army from there to the levels of Greenbrier, Va. where they were reinforced by Col. Christie's Regiment and there remained about six weeks; and then marched to the mouth of the Kanaway River at which place they encamped about two weeks, when on 10 Oct 1774 they were attacked and had a severe engagement with the Shawnee Indians, in which battle the applicant fought; that they remained thereabout two weeks after the battle; having served in said troops as a volunteer in the company in which he was drafted had expired and then returned home and was discharged, as he recollects, by Lieut. Doolin, his Captain having been killed in battle, which discharge he has lost.

That the applicant afterwards removed from State of Virginia to Green Co. North Carolina (now Tenn.), when in the month of August 1789, as well as he recollects, he was again drafted to serve a tour of three months duty in a company commanded by Capt. James Moore and Ensign Samuel Hall; that he was marched from Green Co. to Holston River, to Felice Plains, and to Lookout Mts. in the which he fought; shortly he returned home and was discharged. Has lost the discharge and has no proof.

That he was born in Caroline County, Virginia, in 1746- - the month forgotten, and his records lost; that he was living in Bedford Co. when drafted to first serve and in Green Co. the second time, but that after the second time, he moved to Buncombe Co. N C. for one year, then removed to Knox Co. Tenn., now Anderson Co., where he lived about 33 years, and from there he

removed to Marion Co. where he now lives.

He states that he knows well the following in his neighborhood, who can testify as to his character: Amos Griffith, Squire Hendrix, Luke Hendrix, Isaac Hicks, Esq., Major Henry Tatum, Solomon Hargis, and Rev. Michael Burkhalter.

(The above men testified as to his character- -and thought that he had served in Rivolutionary War as stated in his declaration.)

CHESTNUTT GROVE CEMETERY

From Mrs. Sam Liles files comes the following information: "The Chestnutt Grove Cemetery is on the east side of the Decatur and Danville Road, just south of Austinville. (It is now in the city limits of Decatur.) It was started as the LONG family cemetery; later became the cemetery of the Chestnutt Grove Church, which has been torn away."

According to information in the files of James Vassar of Decatur: "Solomon Scott Long originally gave either a quarter or half-acre of land for this cemetery. The Chestnutt Grove Church was Methodist, and was abandoned to meet in the Austinville M.E. Church".

As a matter of record, a member of the MEANS family is the earliest dated monument found here (1823), while that of the Long family is dated 1839. As can be seen by these records, the Means family used this cemetery and occupy a large plot. 30 October 1965. Submitted by Mr. Spencer A. Waters, 512 Coffey Street, Moulton, Alabama.

A LETTER BY MRS. HOWARD C. JONES, SR.

The following undated letter was written by the late Mrs. Howard C. Jones, Sr. of New Market, Alabama to a Mr. Lackey, and was submitted by Mr. Richard S. Lackey of Forest, Miss. There is much in the letter that will interest genealogists, and the entire contents are presented below:

Dear Mr. Lackey:

Your letter has just arrived, and has not been pondered over, as yet. But as I am so slow nowadays, I am going to make a superficial reply, and mayhap do better, later.

1. I would like very much to know where that Lincoln Co. Will Book is, I see yours is from a copy in Nashville, but where is the original? I have been in Fayetteville several times and assured that a book, starting about 1824, is the oldest they have.

2. William Campbell very surely lived right on the State line; or maybe it was just George who did, and that he already (had?) Edmund and Susan in possession. But the direction that James Walker and Samuel Davis set their value, is interesting, as they both lived in Madison Co...in fact, were among the earliest settlers to come in. I can get the location of their land if you wish. have walker's right here. He owned a good deal of land, later on but his first purchase was of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 8 T1 R2 E on Sept. 18, 1809. Here, let me explain about the land. About 1805 settlers began to drift in. I am told that Tennessee, and Georgia both claimed it, that Tennessee promised to grant it to her fighting men and they came and "squatted, awaiting title. But, the matter went to the courts and when the smoke cleared away both Tenn. and Ga. claims were thrown out and it was given to Miss. It took several years to survey it (Daddy Jones said they could work only in the winter, as in summer the rattlers made it too dangerous.) when it was all divided up into quarter sections, the Government put it on sale, at the Land Office at Nashville, the first sale being in August, 1809. I think it was sold on a bid basis..have never studied it but know they said Pope got the Big Spring because he was able to pay a lot more for it than John Hunt was. I know it was sold on the installment plan..John Doe made a down payment, with so much per year to follow, and received a certificate. If for any reason he wanted to move on, he could sell his rights to Richard Roe, and assign his certificate to him, on its back. Whoever made the final payment, got the patent. If Doe paid it out, the patent reads "To John Doe." On the other hand, if Roe paid for it, it shows "Richard Roe, assignee." I wish the records here showed the original entrant but one has to go to Washington, for that. It could be, the Nashville records do..

I have never been there to look. Anyhow, all the land in this county was sold by the U.S., except for three Indian Reservations, one tract whereby the heirs of a Rev. soldier were, by a Special Act of Congress, permitted to choose any tract they wished and they chose some another man had bought so there was a hassle about it...and one bounty land warrant issued in 1852, for a rocky mountain tract. There were many of those Bounty Land Warrants granted people here...but no desirable land, so most either moved to the midwest, or sold their warrants to people who did. The warrants themselves did not specify the land; the holder was free to go where land was available, and use it, to get his title there.

It looks very much as if you are right, and Lydia Campbell's daughter married William B. Campbell--a cousin, undoubtedly! I don't know about this particular case, but do know that a married woman did not inherit property..but her husband did! Of course, many of the estates do say "in right of his wife".. but many others don't give her so much recognition...many of the divisions simply list a number of Smith children, then "Lot No. to John Jones," without he was husband of old man Smith's daughter Mary. Therefore, if Elizabeth (Mrs Wm B.) was old William's daughter, it would have been perfectly according to the times for her husband William B. to have signed the deed in her stead. In Alabama, if it was a deed conveying real estate, she would have had to have signed also, but I found, in Franklin Co. to my irritation, the women didn't sign until almost 1850. I assumed Tenn. followed N/C procedure while Ala. laws were modeled more closely after those of Virginia, and land is always conveyed according to rule of the state in which it lies, regardless of the rules of the state in which some of them may be living.

On Aug. 14, 1810, Shadrach Webster bought the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 2 T1 R1 W, and on June 3, 1815, the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ went to Shadrach Webster, assignee. I have never been sure if the date is that of the original certificate, or the date the patent was issued, but suspect it to be the patent's date.

It might be that Lydia had a dower assigned her..and the tract on which she lived was that dower, which, on her death, reverted to the estate of old William, her husband. I know that in many cases there was a request for dower, despite the will.

William S. Allen was son of a Robert Allen of Amelia Co., Va.--I have a copy of pension application. In 1823 Wm. S. was in Madison C.; last payment made 1826 by Cahaba Agency to Giles B. Bullock atty for pensioner.

Inserted in the front of Deed Book C at Fayetteville, is the first volume of the Minutes of the County Court. First entry, Feb. 27, 1810. "This day according to the Act of the Assembly passed the 14th day of November at Knoxville, in the year 1809, the Justices commissioned for Lincoln County appeared at the house of Brice M. Garner...(and proceeded to elect county officers..this was the organization of the county. I have read it was taken from Bedford.)

Wonder if Geo. W. Hunt was old John's son? He had a grandson Geo. W. but I don't know his father's name--and everyone had a Geo. W., Thos. J...and I think, a Littleberry tho I have never been able to identify that particular hero. The Nancy A. Horton, sounds like a 2nd marriage, tho if Wm. signed stating he was her atty in fact, it doesn't sound as if he were her husband, Mary Beller was evidently a widow, by the 1834 deed.

You can't say a marriage didn't take place in this county... there is no knowing how many records were lost, by that "copying" business of Hammond's...and maybe some before him. But when a chap skips 99 between 1819 and 1827 (the only period on which we can check, because the original book survives) we feel he skipped just as many in other years. I think the evidence points to the territorial records having been just loose bonds, and not in a book at all..and if that was the case, dozens of them probably disappeared....

You mention the unaccounted for children in the Alen Lackey family; unless you have a Bible record with consecutive birth dates, remember the infant mortality of those days..including, of course, children as well, when the "average" span of life was short indeed and children were prey to many things now of minor importance. I started to say it would be easy to have nine under 15, but that is not the proper adjective...chronologically possible, perhaps, but definitely not "easy", especially on the

mother. However it sometimes happened, especially if any of them doubled up. But, many families did take in orphaned kin.. someone had to. If Adam Lackey's father was under Marion, he might have been in Chester Co., S/C. as my ancestor was.

At the sale of the effects of Alexander Perryman, here in the New Market area somewhere, 13 Feb. 1818, purchasers included Geo. W. Hunt, George Campbell, Eli Beller. In 1817, Shadrach Webster was a J.P. and was one of the appraisers of the estate of Isaac Stewart in 1816.

I will tell you a story about these Townsends, as I heard it. There were several brothers en route from Virginia to lands further on--they, their livestock--and a very large group of slaves. The man were evidently not the type one is drawn to. They stopped and camped at Hazel Green. One of the slaves was ill, and they called for a local doctor, who refused to go.. excuse, not told me. But the Townsends swore a mighty oath that there they would stay..and "make a cotton patch of the town." And that they did. They were not, I think, gentlefolk...but were strong, ruthless--and in some respects at least, unmoral. Two of them died old bachelors--well, one, I heard, was married briefly but the lady--and she was a lady, stood him but a short time, and returned to her people. This man's will asks that 4 slaves be freed, because he "has every reason to believe them his own", and that the rest be taken and settled in a free state. The executors purchased land near Xenia, Ohio--the people very willingly sold the land, but when the negroes arrived, staged riots...I don't know the outcome, but a granddaughter of the executor wrote a thesis on the matter. The one brother who did leave progeny also left them the family disposition and even several generations along, were known for their violent tempers. In some way or another, they did manage to acquire all the land about the little town and pretty well put it off the map, for a time. I think..without being sure, that the present Hazel Green is somewhat further north than the original site, but the Townsends are buried in its edge, so that may be wrong. Anyhow, they left their mark on the county's history; the land the Lackey's sold Edmind was a very small part of their eventual acreage. I think John Molloy Sr. and wife Nancy must have sold to Edmunt Townsend alone--no wife Nancy. Molloy was from Ga.; there is a chancery suit, showing he had bought a huge tract in "Doublehead's Reserve (down near Florence) from that crooked" Georgia Land Co."and then when he went to find it, he couldn't; and anyhow the Ga. Land Co. didn't own it. You know, scratching about in old deeds, makes one bless that modern invention, the abstractor! The suits I have read show it was a very dangerous thing, then, to buy land from strangers, and not always safe, if you tho't you knew them well,

JAMES McILHENY, REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

I James McIlheny of Huntsville in the Alabama territory deposeseth that I served as a private in the 12th Virginia Regiment of the Continental establishment under Col. Gresham, Captn. Lapsley and Lieut. Brackenridge from the month of March in the third year of the revolutionary War untill the regiment was broken up and Joined to the 16th. I afterwards served in the 16th regiment of Virginia on the continental establishment untill the year 1781 being three years in the whole. When the British army went off to the southward, myself and some others whose time of service was nearly at an end was left behind, I was shortly after sent under a Captn. Philips, from Philadelphia to little York escorting prisoners to that place and after I arrived there I received my discharge from him about the 1st of March in the 6th year of the war as well as I can recollect it was the year 1781, I was at the battle of Mornouth, at the taking of Stony Point and Powles Hook, at the latter place I was under the command of Col. Nathl Guest and have been in several other skirmishes at different places.

I am at present unable to support myself either by manual labour, yearly income or any property whatsoever. I am now in the sixty fifth year of my age, and enfeebled in body, mind, and memory. I make this my application for the benefit of the Act of Congress giving relief to persons in my situation, and I solemnly swear that the foregoing statement is true.

Witness my hand, Huntsville October 9th 1818

In addition to the above, I received an honorably discharge, which I sent to Richmond by my brother to obtain a land warrant, where I believe it remains in the proper office.

Mr. McLehany says his father died about the year 1823 or previously thereto and he thinks that his father was at the time of his death on the pension roll but that he had not drawn his pension. Col. LeRoy Pope act as agent in 1823 or thereabouts and said as M. McL thinks that the Pension was allowed but could not be paid because of the Pensioner's death, and I suppose this induces him to believe that his father's name was on the Pension Roll when he died. Now will you please to inform me whether James McLehany's name was on the Pension Roll & if so when his pension commenced and its amt and much oblige the said Moses McLehany and the writer hereof.

JABEZ PERKINS OF MARSHALL CO., ALABAMA

Heirs of Jabez Perkins (died 13 Jan. 1859, intestate) as described in the petition of the administrators William Perkins and John J. Dillard. File No. 426, Marshall Co. Court House:

1. A surviving widow, Sarah Perkins, who resides in this county (Marshall),
2. A daughter, Nancy Wilder, widow of Joab Wilder, of full age, who resides in Jackson Co, Ala.,
3. A son, Isaac Perkins, of full age, who resides in Madison Co., Ala.,
4. A son, William Perkins, of full age, who resides in Marshall Co.,
5. A daughter, Melvina Derrick, wife of David Derrick, who resides in Marshall Co.,
6. A son, Zachus (sic)(Zacchaeus) Perkins, of full age, who resides in Texas,
7. A daughter, Amey, wife of A. B. Kennamer who resides in Marshall Co.,
8. A son, Timothy Perkins, of full age, who resides in Marshall Co.,
9. Two granddaughters, Elizabeth Law, wife of F. M. Law and Permelia F. Parkhill, wife of J. B. Parkhill, children of Martha (Patsy) Perkins Hodges, deceased. Mrs. Law and Mrs. Parkhill reside in Marshall Co.,
10. One granddaughter (?) Eliza E. Fletcher, wife of J. B. Fletcher (also referred to as Benton Fletcher) daughter (?) of Allie (Allin or Allis) Perkins Kennamer, who resides in Marshall Co. (this relationship unclear),
11. A son, Jabez Perkins, a minor over the age of fourteen years who resides with his mother,
12. A son, John W. Perkins, a minor over the age of fourteen years, who resides with his mother.

Final settlement on this estate was not rendered until 25 June 1869. By this time one of the administrators, J. J. Dillard, had died, also the widow Sarah and one unmarried son, Jabez.

The total estate of \$5075.53 was distributed in 10 shares of \$507.55 each to (1) John W. Perkins, (2) Melvina Derrick, (3) Nancy (Elizabeth ?) Law and Permelia Parkhill, (4) Eliza E. Fletcher, (5) Timothy Perkins, (6) Nancy Wilder, (7) Amy Kennamer, (8) Isaac Perkins, (9) Zacharia (sic) Perkins, and (10) William Perkins.

Mrs. Will Miller, Box 715, Corsicana, Texas submitted the above material. She comments that:

It is unusual to find so many relationships established and clarified in one property settlement, and this gives these

documents unusual genealogical value. In addition, they establish the exact death date of Jabez Perkins.

Jabez Perkins appears on the earliest census of Jackson Co., Ala. (1830) but was cut off into Marshall Co. when it was formed in 1836. He came from Whitley Co., Ky. and settled east of Woodville. He was a Primitive Baptist preacher as early as 1824. His wife was Sarah Welder also of Whitley Co., Ky. It is stated that they married in that county in 1824 and left after the wedding for Alabama.

Jabez (b ? 1797 Va.) was named for his father Jabez Perkins Sr. who died 1836 in Whitley Co., Ky. Jabez, Sr. (b 6 Nov 1766) was the son of Timothy Perkins of Grayson Co., Va., but a "Jabish" Perkins is to be found on the early records of Wilkes Co., N.C. (ca 1800). The family was originally from New England.

ASSOCIATION FOR RECORDS AND CENSUS INDEXING

The need for indices among genealogists and historians is rapidly increasing. This applies to all types of records which are now being searched repeatedly by many different people. Particularly important are the Federal Census records. Many records, however, other than census records should also be indexed, such as marriages, probate, Bible, land, tax lists, and passenger lists.

During the mid 1930's some indexing of original records was initiated to provide work for unemployed people. When the available funds were expended the work was discontinued. With the onset of the Social Security program, an applicant often had to furnish proof of his age. The difficulties experienced by many persons led to financing by the Federal Government of the indexing of the Census records of 1900 and 1920, and of part of the 1880, using the Soundex system. Nevertheless, indexing of the vast number of early records remains to be done and is still urgently needed.

Automatic data processing, as a means of analyzing and indexing records, has become commonplace in recent years by all progressive establishments, including colleges and universities. Genealogists and historians should do no less. To this end a non-profit association has been formed and was incorporated on August 28, 1967; the name of which is the Association for Records and Census Indexing.

At present the Association is continuing the transcribing and indexing of the 1850 census of Tennessee, which was formerly sponsored by the National Genealogical Society. Tennessee is being used as the pilot state. Considerable care is being given to details so as to develop a workable pattern which can be used for similar purposes in all other states.

Work on the Tennessee census is progressing very well. To date more than 75 percent of the transcribing has been completed by volunteer workers. Two different volunteers separately transcribe the census for each county. These are now being compared to assure accuracy. Methods of programming the data for electronic computer processing to compile the indices are under investigation. Upon completing these phases of the work, the data will be ready for key punching and indexing. Each volunteer worker participating in the transcribing and associated activities, and each organization which donates processing services will be given recognition as each indexing undertaking is completed. Additional volunteers are invited to aid in this work.

JEREMIAH GURLEY, REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

APPLICATION FOR PENSION: Application for pension for services in Revolutionary War. S 13231. Son of John & Elizabeth Gurley, he was born December 29, 1759 in Johnson County, N. C. He enlisted in February 1781 and served as a private in Captains Hardy Bryan's and Asa Bryan's Companies, Col. Eaton's N. C Regiment; was in the battle of Guilford and in the battle of Camden under Col. Read and was discharged May 13, 1781; he served about 2 months as a trooper in Capt. Lewis Gurley's Co. of Light Horse and was discharged Aug. 7, 1781. The said Lewis Gurley was the soldier's brother; he served 15 or 20 days as a trooper in Col. Benjamin Exum's Regiment of S. C. Troops; and from September 1781 to close of the war. He served about 1 year under Col. Robert Rayford. He was allowed pension on his application executed October 30, 1832 at which time he was living near Brownsboro, Madison County, Alabama. It is stated that he moved in 1817 from Maury County, Tennessee "with his family" to Madison County, Alabama. It is not shown whether soldier was married.

LAST PENSION PAYMENT: The last payment of pension from records of Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Washington D. C.: In the case of Jeramiah Gurley, Certificate No. 19 995 Alabama Agency, it was certified by the clerk of the Orphans Court for Madison County, Alabama that satisfactory evidence was exhibited to show that the pensioner died in Madison County, Alabama on October 28, 1843, leaving no widow, but the following children: John Gurley and Ann King, wife of Thomas M. King. The records also show that the pensioner lived in Madison County for about twenty-five years before his death, and that previous thereto he lived in the State of Tennessee. The arrears of pension due, covering the period March 4, 1843 to October 28, 1843, were paid at Huntsville, Alabama on April 12, 1844 to the surviving children.

OBITUARY: From Huntsville, Alabama Democrat Nov. 16, 1843: Died - at the residence of his son in this county on the 28 Oct. 1843, Mr. Jeremiah Gurley, in the 84th year of his age. Mr. Gurley was a native of N. C. and for several (years) belonged to the Southern army, faught under General Greene two distinguished battles of Eutaw Springs and Guilford C. H. The subject of this short notice enjoyed an unusual good share of health even up to the day of his death and left this world at his breakfast table, without a struggle or a groan; the weary wheels of nature stopped without apparent cause. Thus once after another of those heroes are dropping off and soon the last will be gone to his reward, and will live on earth only in minds of an enlightened and virtuous people.

WILL: Recorded in Madison County, Alabama, in Probate Book II, page 45: In the name of God Amen I Jeremiah Gurley of Madison County and State of Alabama, being of sound mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God for the same, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and constitute this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following - that is to say First, I give and bequeath to Thomas M. King and his heirs forever, one negro man named Harry, also one negro woman namely, Mariah, Westly,

Ezekiah, and Malvina, with their increase forever. Secondly - I do hereby appoint my son John Gurley, in this my last Will and Testament, my Executor &c and I give and bequeath to him, the said John Gurley, the balance of my negroes of every description whatever, them and there increase. Also the balance of my property, consisting of stock horses &c. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal, this the 24th day of March in the year of-our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, one thousand eight hundred and thirty two.
