



TVGS MEETING, July 1968

The regular bi-monthly meeting of the Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society was held July 11 at the Huntsville Public Library, with the president, A. E. Terry presiding. Following the business meeting, Mrs. Richard H. Gilliam, Jr. introduced as speaker of the evening Dr. Frances Roberts, professor of history and chairman of the Department of History at the University of Alabama Dr. Roberts received her BS degree from Livingston College, a masters degree and Phd. from the University of Alabama; she taught history in the public schools of Huntsville until she joined the staff of the University of Alabama in 1952. At present, Dr. Roberts is president of the Alabama Historical Association, member of the board of the Buritt Museum, member of the board of the Twickenham Historical Preservation Association, and consultant for the Madison County Court House

In her speech, "Research in Mississippi Territorial Papers at the Mississippi Department of Archives and History," Dr. Roberts stated that she began that particular search to determine just how Madison County was created, and how it developed politically, socially, and economically over a period of sixty years. She began with Carter's "Territorial Papers of Mississippi" (Volume 13 which pertains to Madison County, now Alabama) which lead ultimately to the papers that dealt with Alabama Territory. The group was advised that some of this material is on microfilm in Montgomery but that to really delve into all aspects of Madison County development, one should go to Jackson, Mississippi, because so much information can be had from searching the official documents and finding additional documents other than those for which you were searching.

Dr. Roberts stressed two points. There is a science to research. "You must map out a plan." She suggested that a searcher start with available sources; consider footnotes, go to the original point where documents are stored; move to the place where clues tell you to go; and when you take notes, "put down the source. There is an art to research. You must know how to put the bits and peices together." Illustrating that there can be five or six people living in the same place, at the same time, with the same names and not be related at all, she gave several specifics in the early history of this county. Dr. Roberts stated that tax records can substantiate time lines and that a searcher must know how to evaluate what he finds and be able to prove himself wrong as well as right!

In conclusion, Dr. Roberts informed the Society that Belle and Howe, Ann Arbor, Michigan, is microfilming old newspapers and old books at a very reasonable price and that catalogs may be received upon request to Belle and Howe.

During the business meeting, officers for the coming year were elected. The next meeting of TVGS will be September 12.

JAMES ELLIOTT, NATURALIZATION

James Elliott, now of the County of Franklin, in the State of Alabama, with permission of the Court and in pursurance of the Acts of Congress upon the subject of naturalization of aliens, Reports here to be entered of record, that his name is James Elliott, that he was born in the Town of Jedburgh in the County of Roxburgh, Scotland and of the United Kingdoms of Great Britian and Ireland, that he is twenty seven years of age that at the time of his birth in the aforesaid, he owed allegiance to the King of the United Kingdom ..., that he resided in the County of Roxburgh afore said until the 20th day of April 1818, at which time he emigrated to the United States of America, where he has ever since resided, that he intends the county of Franklin aforesaid to the place of his furture residence, all of which is sworn and subscribed to in open, and is thereupon ordered to be entered of record and to be certified accordingly.

County Court Minute Book B. January 26, 1827; Page 429 Lawrence County, Alabama

County Court, January Term, 1327:

Be it remembered that on this day, James Elliott exhibited in open court, certificates of his report of Registry and of his intentions of becoming a citizen of the United States as made and declared in the said County Court of said County of Lawrence, being also a Court of record, which certificate is ... to-wit:

"At a County Court held for Lawrence County at the Courthouse in the Town of Moulton on the first Monday in Jan. in the year 1324, Present the Honorable Peter W. Taylor, Judge.

James Elliott now of the County of Franklin in this State. with the permission of the Court and in pursurance of the Acts of Congress upon the subject of naturalization of foreigners reports hereto be entered of record; That in the year 1818. being then a subject of the United Kingdoms of Great Brittain and Ireland, he emigrated from Kelso in the County of Roxburgh in Scotland and on the 17th day of July in the same year, landed at Philadelphia, that every since his arrival he has resided in the United States, about two years of the time in the State of Alabama and about 18 months thereof in the aforesaid County of Franklin, That in further pursurance of said Act, he declares on oath that it is in intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State, or Sovereignty whatever and particularly to the Kingdoms of Great Britian and Ireland, all of which is "certified."

And therefore it appearing to the satisfaction of the

Court by the testimony of John Gallagher, that the said James Elliott hath resided in the United Staes more than five years and within the State of Alabama more than one year hath behaved as a man of good moral character,....and the Court now here permitting him ... to take the oath prescribed he the said James Elliott is therefore and thereupon admitted to all the rights and priveleges of citizenship in the United States of America.

The following is a copy of the records contained in Madison County, Alabama Marriage Book Two as now deposited in the Court House Record Room, Huntsville, Alabama.

It is generally agreed that Marriage Book Two is a somewhat inaccurate copy of the original which is lost. It is quite obvious that many pages are missing and that names are inaccurate since the same name is often spelled three different ways on one page. This interpretation of the script was compared with the old index downstairs (D) in the History Room, itself probably a copy and incomplete. Another comparison was made with the upstairs index (U) found in the Record Room. Only when the indexes varied were notations made. Marriages were omitted in both indexes. Minor differences in spelling of first names were not noted. In some cases, the same marriages seemed to be recorded again in Marriage Book Three. These duplications are noted for the convenience of anyone desiring to make further comparisons.

Mrs. Howard Jones, an experienced Alabama genealogist wrote shortly before her death a few notations about this marriage book (K.J.). She wrote, "The minister so often mentioned as T. M. Baker is the Rev. Zadok W. Baker, a Baptist preacher."

Marriage bonds were signed by Henry Minor, R. O. C., Wm. H. Winston, R. O. C., or Thomas Brandon, C. C. C.

Every variation of spelling for bride's, groom's, and bondsmen's names is included in the index of this volume.

TVGS MEETING, September 1968

The marking of all family photographs with names and dates for posterity was advised at this TVGS meeting. Mr. W.H. Jenkins of Decatur, Alabama told the group that he found an old family album recently, but was unable to identify the relatives since the photos were not marked.

Mr. Jenkins suggested that beginners in genealogy begin investigation in the immediate family, later contacting eldest living relatives. He said the next step is to check public records such as wills, deed, censuses and tax lists. Cemeteries can then be inspected. As a genealogist progresses in a search for data, maps become quite useful and he recommended the elaborate collection in the map room of the Birmingham public library.

Mr. Jenkins belongs to the Alabama Historical Society and the North Alabama Genealogical Society, of which he is president.

TVGS MEETING, November 1968

Dr. L. Wayne Johnson spoke on "The Use of Maps in Genealogy" at the November meeting of TVGS. Dr. Johnson was born in Winfield, Kansas, received his PhD at Princeton University. Prior to his retirement, he was a professor and head of the mathematics department at Oklahoma State. At his retirement he accepted an appointment as professor of mathematics at the University of Alabama in Huntsville. He is a member of the Oklahoma Genealogical Society, the Oklahoma and Kansas Historical Society and TVGS.

Dr. Johnson gave an interesting talk on maps in genealogy. He described many commonly available sources of maps such as maps at gasoline stations, State Highway Department maps and the U. S. Geological maps. The later maps show information useful to genealogists such as churches, cemeteries, communities, and even residences. Some maps are free and those that aren't are very inexpensive.

The grid system by which unsettled lands were surveyed and divided into townships were described. He pointed out that topographical maps which show geographical features such as streams, hills and valleys are frequently used in locating a parcel of land described in some ancestors will or deed. Older maps which can be found in libraries sometimes show early immigrant trails west and provide many clues in looking for traces of migrating families. Tract books which show the original grantees of all Alabama lands by counties are available in each county Probate Judge's office. These tract books are most helpful in determining when the first ancestor came into the state.

Dr. Johnson's enthusiasm for maps was quite infectious.

MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI TERRITORY TAX LISTS 1810, 1811, 1812, 1813, 1815

This series was discontinued after Part IV when microfilm of the original records became available, thus permitting a more detailed study. The list was republished in its entirety in <u>Valley Leaves</u>, Vol. 4, #4, June 1970.

The Madison County, Mississippi Territory Tax Lists are located in the Department of Archives and History in Jackson, Mississippi. Dr. Frances Roberts of Huntsville, Alabama has allowed the Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society to use her copy of these lists in making the following compilation. Mrs. F. Edward Williams of Huntsville alphabetized all of the lists and they are presented here as a guide in locating the early residents of Madison County, Alabama. It is suggested that anyone desiring absolute authority and more information consult the original records in Mississippi. The 1810 Tax List has been compared with similar lists made by Mr. Richard S. Lackey of Forest, Mississippi and the late Mrs. Howard C. Jones, Sr. of Huntsville Alabama.

An "X" indicates that the person paid tax on property for that year. The number of "X's" indicates the number of returns made in that name for the year, either the same person or two men with the same name. As is common in most old records, there is a variation in spelling of names. There were no tax returns in 1814.

John Kelly, now of the County of Lawrence in the State of Alabama, with the permission of the Court, which Court is a Court of record and General Common Law jurisdiction and in pursurance of the Acts of Congress upon the subject of naturalization of Aliens, reports here to be entered of record that his name is John Kelly, that he was born in the Town of Dromore in the County of Tyrone in Ireland, one of the Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, that he is about thirty-five years of age, that at the time of his birth in the Town, County, and Kingdom aforesaid, he owed allegiance to the King of the United Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, that he resided in the Town, County, and Kingdom aforesaid until the 20th of May, 1825 at which time he emigrated thence to the United States of Amreica and arrived in Said United States of America on the 1st day of August, 1825 where he has resided ever since, and that he intends that the County of Lawrence aforesaid to be the place of his future residence.

And in Pursurance of said Acts of Congress, he, after being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, declares that it is his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States of America and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State, or Sovereignty whatever and particularly to the King of the United Kingdoms of Great Brittain and Ireland, which report and declarations is ordered to be admitted to record

S. degree was earned at the University of Chicago during summers between school terms. When she retired from teaching after forty-three years of service, she went to Washington, D. C. to work three weeks in Continental Hall on the Registrar General's staff and continued there for seventeen years. She began searching records in court houses, cemeteries and Bible records on her own family in 1898 and from this began to help friends and She published six books of records beginning with the Reprint of the Land Lottery of 1827 (Ga.). TVGS MEETING, JANUARY 23, 1969

The Huntsville Public Library. The regular bi-monthly meeting date was changed to the fourth Thursday of the month. Mrs. Richard H. Gilliam, Jr. announced that on a trip to the Department of Archives and History in Montgomery, Alabama she had located the following original Madison County records on deposit in the newspaper room: Superior Court Appearance Docket, 1811-1816, Orphans Court Minutes 1810-1819, Superior Court of Law and Equity Minutes 1810-1812, and 1811-1819 (two books), and an untitled book with the first thirty-four pages missing probably a Register of Estate Settlements 1818-1819.

Mrs. Robert L. DeYoung, Sr., speaker, shared with the group her knowledge of the records in the Madison County Court House. Books available from the year 1809 to the present are Marriages, Estates, Orphans Court Records (until 1850 when Probate Court Records begin), Deeds (containing wills and other material also), and Plat Books. Many other books and newspapers are available.

Mr. Wesley S. Thompson reviewed his book, The Free State of Winston, a history of Winston County, Ala. Winston County was unique in the fact that it seceded from the state of Alabama when Alabama seceded from the Union.

SOUTH CAROLINA-ALABAMA MIGRATION

Many of the early settlers of Alabama were natives of South Carolina; therefore, we have a common bond of interest. Such hearty emigrants as John Gayle, Andrew B. Moore, James E. Belser, Franklin W. In anticipation of South Carolina's three hundredth anniversary celebration in 1970, the Tricentennial Commission is currently gathering as much material as possible on significant family and group migrations in the 1800's. Your assistance, and that of your readers, would greatly benefit our tracing of migration patterns. Two graves, among many, in the Ferguson Cemetery, a few miles northwest of the Old Town Creek Baptist Church on the Russellville-Moulton Highway, Lawrence County, Alabama. (See page 90 of this issue.)

Jepthah West born July 25, 1803 died April 5, 1896 married September 19, 1822 Elizabeth, wife of J. West born November 2, 1799 died January 8, 1858

Elizabeth Ferguson, wife of Jeptha West was born in North Carolina. She was the daughter of Robert Ferguson who located in Greenville Co., S. C. about 1810, where he died leaving a will dated January 28, 1841, proved 23rd August 1850. In his will he names wife, Cassender, all land, stock, etc.; at her death estate to be equally divided among six children: Lucy Bruce, Polly (Mary) Bruce, Elizabeth West, Sally Few, Ann Graves, John Ferguson (to have \$150 before equal distribution). Mentions son, Clement Ferguson (see will page 90 of this issue) having already been provided for and son-in-law, Hardin Bruce. It appears all of Robert's children except Sally Few and Lucy Bruce were in Lawrence Co., Ala by 1850--most there by 1840. Daughter Lucy was the wife of Hardin Bruce; they were in Greenville Couty, S.C. at the time of the will. Mary was the wife of Silas Bruce. Ann was the wife of Thomas Graves.

II. Austinville, Cardinal Street. These graves are now between two multiple apartments, Cardinal Apts. All of the streets in this sub-division are named for birds. A new swimming pool was dug across the North end of a portion of the burial plot. The construction foreman of the job related that no graves were encountered in digging the pool. III. Austin Cemetery, located on Cedar Street, just west of Spring Street, in Decatur, (Austinville), Alabama. Presumably the town of Austinville, which is now part of Decatur, was named for this man. There are two unmarked graves here.

DECLARATION FOR A PENSION UNDER ACT OF Feb. 14, 1871 State of Alabama, County of Madison.

On this 14th day of July 1871, perseonally appeared John Shields aged (96) ninety six years, a resident of Madison Co. Ala. who declares that he is married, that his wife's name was Betsey Curtis to who he was married near Nashville, Tennessee on or about the 15th day of August 1796 (1814 is the date given by Elizabeth, below); that he served the full period of sixty days in military service of U S in War of 1812; that he enlisted in Capt. John B. Long's Company, Col. Thomas H. Benton's Regt. at McMinnville, Tennessee on or about the 10th day of Mar. 1813 and was honorably discharged at Fort Hawkins, Georgia on or about the 10th day of March 1815. Two weeks after his enlistment he was ordered with company to Nashville, Tennessee thence to Huntsville, Alabama, thence to Talladega, Alabama, thence on an active campaign against the enemy, and participation in the battle of the Horse Shoe Bend on the 27th day of March 1814, after said battle he was stationed at Montgomery, Ala. then to New Orleans, La., took a part in battle fought on 8 Jan. 1815. From New Orleans he marched to Fort Hawkins, Ga. I shal now endeavor to show the ages of your Grandparrents and thir conduct in life------

Your GrandFather and my Father, he is shortly departed this life, and I shal say all about him now as he is dead and the rest are all a live to day and try to give you as complete a history of him as I can----

He was born in the year 1773 about he time of the Revolutionary war and was born of Pore parrentage and in a time of Greate Confution (confusion) in the United States and in quancequence of that, opportunity never favord him with an Education there fore he never was now (known) in Publick affairs But my sons he was of one of the greatest men that lived in his day he Marrid in his Twentyth fourth year of his life and an Honest sober and industrious home staying man all ways, study (steady) to his business, a good husband and a good master, a good neighbor, and my sons I have undertakin to write this book for your satisfaction when I am dead and gone. Therefore I will state the truths to you as near as I can as I wille condem my self in sore (so) doing. My Father I believe was the Honests and Virtous man I ever saw in my life. I personally node (knew) him for Twenty years and I wille tell you of a truth that I never saw any thing by him deshonest or unvirtous. down Earley, got up earley, and attended to his own buisness. He had no buisness at evry publick place nor he wod (would) not go unless buisness call him thare. When in companey he had nothing to do with fighting and Quorling and gambling. He

paid his debts when dew (due,) he never was suid (sued) unless it was threw a mistake he sud (sued) nor warrested (arrested) but few He went no mans security. In fact he was nothing to do with law and yet he was a man that hil (held) his rights as sacred as anny man. He was in the late indian and british waw (war) and actted his par (part) as well as anny man. My sons your Grandfather Strong was a man of the most stability I ever Saw, he was the same thing today and tomorrow and all One thing he was not proud, yet he was jenteel. come to a close on this Subject though I am in hops (hopes) that if I shold not live to council with you my children that when you redde (read) this, and my far will (farewell) advise (advice) to you that you wille indever for the sake of my sake and of your Grand Father, to pay serious hed (heed) these things which I have in deavored to leave behind for your instruction as they are from your dearest friend in this life. Your Grand Father left to his estate perfict satisfaction and I am the youngest Child. He had given them all equal justis and \$7500.00 worth of land and one negro, hors (horse), cow and then left an estate worth Twenty one or two Thousand Dollars and Departed this life the 18 day of August about nine oclock in the night after a short an attact of siven days of Putride Bilious fever and lived about forty Eight years of his life in perfect health. He was borne in January the 15 1773

And so ends the History of man my sons though I have no dout (doubt) but he is happy in the Eturnal World where you and I must be and my Children we must be preparde for it or be forever lost.

Charles W. Strong was born Aug. 11, 1804, Goochland Co., Va. and died Feb. 23, 1871, Madison Co., Ala.; married Oct. 10, 1828 in Madison Co., Ala. to Didama Allison Humphrey who was born July 2, 1806, Bedford Co., Va. and died Jan. 25, 1878, Madison Co., Ala. Note: The original paper in the handwriting of Charles W. Strong was for many, many years in the possession of Miss Willie McClellan, a granddaughter of Charles Strong. Miss Willie lived alone and died in 1955 at an advanced age. Noone knows what happened to the original paper, but most likely it was inadvertently destroyed when Miss Willie's house was "cleaned out" after her death. Mr. Thompson R.
