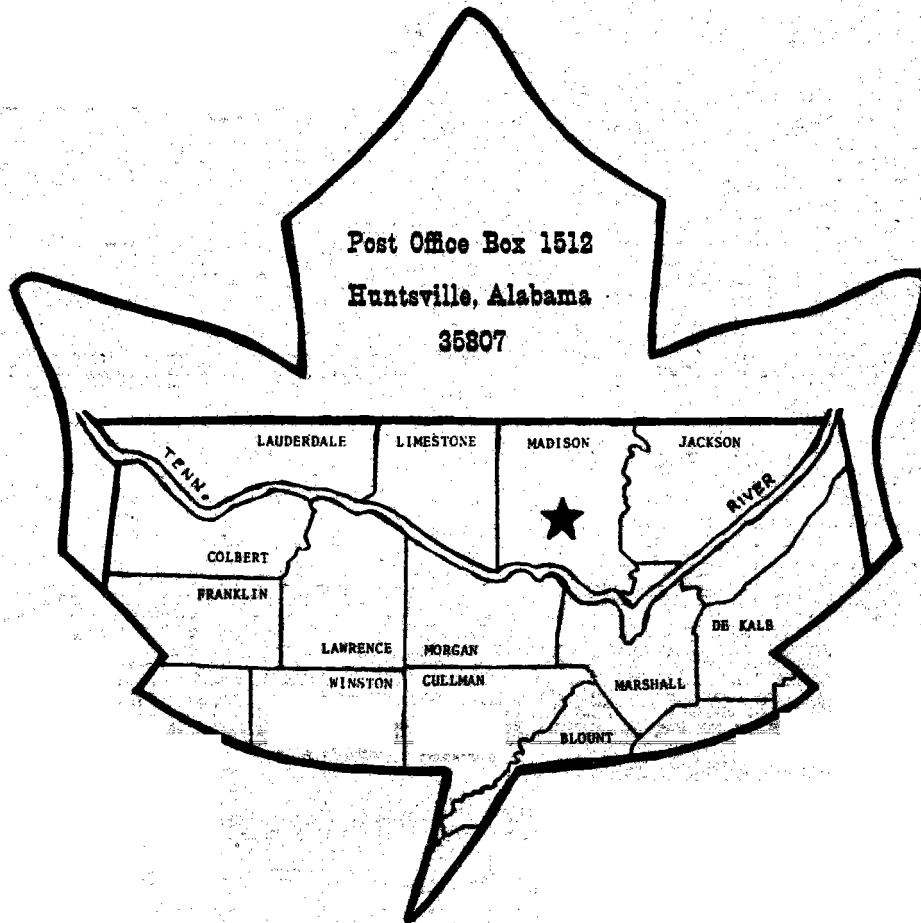

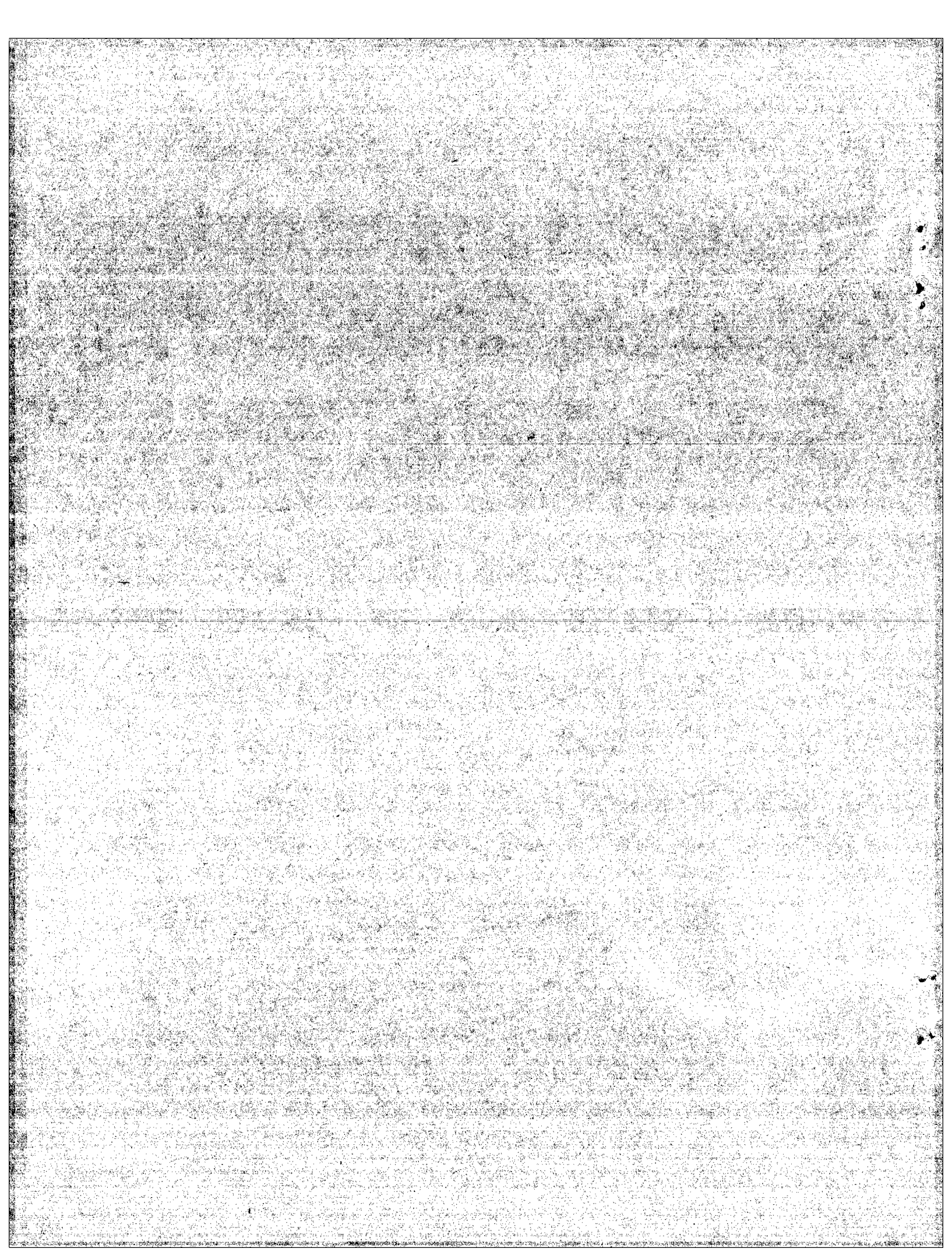

CAPTAIN H. L. CLAY'S COMPANY IN 1847
War with Mexico

(From the Southern Advocate, Huntsville, Alabama, 11 June 1847, page 3, column 2; Company "letter" and Regiment "number" not given; locations believed to be place or county of soldier's birth; entire newspaper article copied; contributed by Editor.)

CAPT. CLAY'S COMPANY

For the following list of the officers and privates of this Company, we are indebted to Hon. C.C. Clay, Jr., contained in a letter to him from Sargeant Dennett, formerly of the Advocate Office. At the last accounts the Company were encamped near New Orleans, waiting for their uniforms. The Captain and some ten or more of the men had been troubled with diarrhea:

The original muster roll paper is in the Public Library, Huntsville, Alabama. It is an over-size printed-form thirteen-column sheet with the same headings on both sides. The sheet has been folded, torn and, unfortunately, taped together making several entries almost illegible. By some of the private's names "penciled notes" have been added, and these are shown in quotation marks on this copy. It is interesting to note that of the 21 men who died none are listed as having died in action. The handwriting on the sheet is very small, thus a great deal of information is provided.

The 13 columns are headed: (1) No. (2) Names: Present and Absent-(Transferred, Discharged, Died & Deserted) (3) Rank (4) When Enlisted (5) Where Enlisted (6) By Whom Enlisted (7) Period Enlisted (8) Last Paid by Paymaster (9) Last Paid to What Time (10) "3 mos. extra pay" to "Re-enlisted Soldiers" - Paid/Due (11) Bounty - Paid/Due (12) Names of Commissioned, Non-Commissioned Officers, Musicians, Artificers & Privates-Present (13) Remarks: 1. "The Reasons for, and time of their Absence.....shall be inserted opposite the name of the respective absent Officers and Soldiers.....Date and Place of all Transfers, Discharges, Furloughs, Deaths, Desertions, Apprehensions, &c.....noted....." 2. "In noting stoppages to be made, whether on account of extra issues of clothing; for loss of, or damage done to arms and accoutrements, or other public property, &c, the articles will be inserted at large in the column of 'Remarks' opposite to the Soldier's name."

OBITUARY: Lieut. Josephus J. Tatum of Capt. Delay's company of Mississippi Volunteers is no more! - Lieut. T. was about 24 years of age, a native of Madison Co. Alabama, where he became an Artist under the tutelage of his Brother. In the fall of '45 or Spring of '46 he settled in Oxford, Miss., .....In May 1846, when his adopted State was called on for Volunteers for the Mexican War, Lieut. T., remembering the wrongs and sufferings inflicted on a Brother while in chains in the castle of Perote, whence he had but a short time before been released,.....hesitated not, but dropped his canvass and his brush and was among the first to give himself, an offering on the bloody Altar to avenge the wrongs of the Brother and defend the honor of his country.....Lieut T. declined the office of commander, preferring to undergo the hardships of a private.....earnest solicitations of the company compelled him to accept the office of Lieutenant.....taken sick at Monterey.....refused to return home on furlough as there was a prospect for a fight at Victoria.....died at Inares on the 20th of Jan..... Huntsville, Tusculmbia, Florence, Athens, Ala., Holly Springs, Columbus, Miss., and Nashville, Tenn. papers will please copy. - Aberdeen (Miss.) Advertiser.

Peter Perkins in the War of 1812; that her said husband (in the fall of 1814) enlisted at Huntsville, Madison Co. for the term of 6 mo and cont'd in actual service in said war for the term of 6 mo and whose service was terminated by reason of Treaty of Peace at Huntsville, on the 1st day of \_\_\_ 1815. She further states that the following is a full description of her husband at the time of his enlistment - farmer, born in Tenn., height 5 ft 8 inches, light hair, blue eyes, fair complexion.

She further states that she was married to the said John Seaton in the Co. of Madison and in the State of Ala. on \_\_\_\_\_ by one Rev. McClure, that her name before her said marriage was Racheal Jackson and that she has not re-married since the death of her said husband and she further declares that her said husband John Seeton died at L. Whitaker's in Alabama on the 24 day of Dec. 1864 and she further declares that the following have been the places of residence of herself and her said husband since the date of his discharge from the army, viz, Always resided in Madison Co., Ala. She has hitherto made no application for..that her residence is New Hope, Madison Co., Ala. and that her P.O. is New Hope.

Pettigrew, now of the County of Lawrence, Alabama, with permission of the Court, and in pursurance of the Acts of Congress upon the naturalization of foreigners, reports here to be entered of record, that in the year 1824, being then a subject of the United Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, he emigrated from Portadown in the County of Armagh, in Ireland, and about the latter end of June in the same year landed at Youngstown in the State of New York by way of Quebec in Canada, that ever since his arrival he had resided in the United States, about two months of that time in the State of Alabama, in the aforesaid County of Lawrence, and in further pursurance of said Act, he declares on oath that it is his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Soveriegnity whatever, and particularly to the Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, all of which is ordered to be certified.

## GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA

Chapter XXXI - History of the Kennamer Family (October 17, 1945)

In the records of this family we find their name spelled in several different ways-Kennemur, Canamore, Cennemur, etc.

The first Kenamer settlement in the U S was in Fairfield County, S. C. Hans Kennemur, who lived there, later came to Madison county, Ala, and was the forefather of the Alabama branch.

The Kennamers came to Kennamer Cove at least as early as 1815. In 1830 we find Hancel Cannemer, between 90 and 100 years old, his wife, between 80 and 90, and their daughter Mary, between 50 and 60, living in the Cove, which was then in Jackson county but has been in Marshall since 1836.

Hans Kennemur built a log house about 100 yards south of Pisgah cemetery near the big spring that runs from under Gunter mountain. There remains very little evidence of the old house site, except some small pieces of broken pottery and dishes.

In this cove which bears his name and in which many of his descendants now reside, he lived until his death in 1836. One hundred years later his descendants placed a marker at his grave in Pisgah cemetery.

Chapter XXXII - History of Pisgah Cemetery (October 24, 1945)

This history was compiled by John R Kenamer:

"Pisgah cemetery is on a gravelly hill near the center of Kennamer Cove. Upon this hill stood a large white oak tree.

"Once when Rebecca, wife of Stephen Kennamer, was passing on a visit to a neighbor, she sat down under the tree to rest. She was then in feeble health and suggested that when she died she wanted to be buried under the oak.

"We are pretty sure she was the first person to die and her request was granted. She died in 1821. Her daughter Susan died quite young. Rebecca and her little daughter are now sleeping under one large mound with a holloy tree as a head marker.

"This hill is now covered with graves. Many of them are unmarked by any tombstone, save a small limestone rock at the head and foot of each. Most of the people buried there are Kennamers. Others are Welders, Woodalls, Pages, Hodges, Hills, Elkins and Wrights, most all of whom are related to the Kennamers by blood or marriage.

(General History of Marshall Co., Ala., continued)

"There was built in 1858, a small house over the grave of Elizabeth (Hodges) Kenamer, wife of Abe Kennamer, but it is now in a delapidated condition.

"Hans Kennamer and wife Rachel are buried a little east of the center of the cemetery. At the suggestion of our historian, Willard C Kennamer, a committee of Judge Charles B Kennamer, Pat H Kennamer and John R Kennamer was appointed to raise funds and erect a monument to Hans and Rachel Kennamer with a suitable inscription.

"We have failed after searching diligently for 20 years to find out who Rachel, wife of Hans Kenamer, was before her marriage. She was a great woman, the saintly mother of ten honorable sons and five modest and industrious daughters.

"This monument was dedicated Aug. 22, 1936, just 100 years after the death of Hans, who lived a century."

Chapter XXXIII - Kennamers only Bros. Ever On U. S. Bench (October 31, 1945)

Judge Charles Brents Kennamer, U S District Judge for the middle district of Alabama, is a son of Seaborn F and Nancy Elizabeth Mitchell Kennamer. Judge Kennamer was born in Kennamer Cove Nov. 25, 1874, a great grandson of Hans and Rachel Kennamer. He studied law at Georgetown University, Washington.

He married Birdie Hooper of Guntersville, Dec. 2, 1907. Children: Charles Brents, Jr., Ralph, Mary Virginia, Seaborn Alexander and Samuel Rexford.

He began to practice law at Guntersville in 1903; became county solicitor in 1905; was assistant United States Attorney, Northern District of Alabama, 1907-14; special assistant U. S. attorney 1914-16; U. S. District Attorney, Northern District, 1922-31; U S District Judge, Middle District, since 1931.

He has held court by special assignment in Mississippi, Georgia, Louisiana, Texas and New York.

He and his brother Franklin Elmore Kennamer, of Tulsa, Okla., are the only two brothers ever to occupy the Federal bench at the same time.

He was an alternate delegate to the Republican National Convention of 1912, and a delegate in 1916, 1920, 1924 and 1928.

As the Republican candidate for Congress from the 7th Congressional district in 1920, he was defeated by the Democratic candidate by less than 500 votes out of a total vote of over 40,000.

He is a member of the Church of Christ and resides in Montgomery. He has attended every reunion of the Kennamer family Association of Alabama, Incorporated.

I have known Judge Kennamer for years. He is a man of a brilliant mind and believes in dealing out justice to all men.

Chapter XXXIV - Julius L. Burke Was Mayor 14 Terms (Nov. 7, 1945)

Julius L. Burke was born in 1850 at Rome, Ga., son of Yancy and Sarah Lindsay Burke, natives of County Connought, Ireland, and Scotland, respectively. They moved to Rome about 1834, living there until 1856, when they moved to Cherokee, now Etowah county where they remained the rest of their lives.

Julius Burke received his early education in Georgia and in 1863, when he was 13, succeeded in enlisting, after several unsuccessful attempts, in the Confederate army. He participated in several engagements, was wounded at Chickamauga, and discharged in 1864.

After the war, he continued his schooling at Adairsville and in the University at Athens, Ga. He became local editor of the Rome Daily and subsequently worked on various other papers in Georgia.

In 1870 he began to study law in the office of William M. Martin of Gadsden and established the Etowah Shield. In 1872 he moved the paper to Gunter-ville, and two years later sold it to the Southern Immigrant Company.

For a short time thereafter he was connected with the Nashville Banner, and after its consolidation with the American, traveled a while in the interest of that paper.

He was admitted to the bar in 1876, but did not immediately take up law practice, having become secretary of the Decatur and Chattanooga packing company.

In 1886, he took up active law practice at Gunter-ville and became associated with G. W. Jones. He represented Marshall county in the state legislature one term. He served as a delegate to Democratic conventions several times. He was member of the Christian church; of the Mystic Circle of Philadelphia, Pa.; and of the Legion of Honor.

He served as mayor of Gunter-ville fourteen times and was adjutant of the camp of Confederate veterans at Gunter-ville.

Married (1) March 1876, Mary C. Adams of Gunter-ville, daughter of James and Nancy Fields Adams; (2) in 1898, Mrs. Mattie Livingston, of Gadsden.

Children: James, Lillian, Yancy, Mamie, Robert E., William, Rupert and George, of these, Mamie, William and George are now living.

Chapter XXXV - I. B. Hyde Was Peace Officer 25 Years (Nov. 14, 1945)

Isaac Baales (Brove) Hyde, was born Feb. 10, 1879 in Greenville County, S. C.

He came to Marshall county in 1881, with his parents, N P Clark and family and H H Hyde and family moved together in wagons. III Hyde, Brove's father, worked a yoke of oxen when he came.

I B Hyde was elected bailiff of Beat 21 in 1907 and served 2 years. He served as Chief of Police of Guntersville from 1913 to 1919. He was elected Sheriff of Marshall county, served 4 years and went back on the police force of Guntersville till he was elected the second term for sheriff. He served again as Chief of Police of Guntersville till 1940.

He was appointed Register of Chancery, which office he now holds. He served as Chief Deputy Sheriff under J L Sparks.

Brove like all other officers made some enemies. There is no living human that works for the public but what has made enemies.

He and I were boys together, went to school together, and played together.

I have heard prisoners say when Brove was Sheriff he gave them to same to eat he had on his table and he was good to them.

Prisoners can make it hard on themselves. Brove had to arrest some of his own folks when he was in office but he said he took an oath that he would uphold the law.

I always, when I have time, when I go to Guntersville, call at his office. He will say, "How are you James Arthur_."

Brove and I have gone through helping clear land and settling up the county. We never did say go hungry, but rations in the day we lived weren't bountiful. We have gone through times when corn bread and sorghum tasted good.

I hope our children will never have to go through what Brove and I have faced.

Chapter XXXVI - History of Ruth (Nov. 21, 1945)

The late JJ Hutchison gave me this history. He said: "I bought my place from Samuel Green. I was born in Talledega county, Ala. I moved to Marshall county in 1895 and lived on the late John Knight place near Friendship church.

"My father, Daniel Hutchison fought in the war of 1812 and in the Civil war. Came home on a furlough and died at home. My mother, Mrs Cressie Hutchison was born in 1861 and died in 1897. She is buried at Gilliam Springs."

(Note: The 1861 birthdate for Mrs. Cressie Hutchison obviously an error. -Editor)

(General History of Marshall Co., Ala., continued)

Mr Hutchison's first wife was buried at Gilliam Springs.

Mr Hutchison had a horn over 200 years old. It belonged to Sterling Mize of Georgia, a relative of his.

The first person buried at Mt Oak cemetery was a child of Jack Ivey and the second was child of Gatewood Norrell.

The place where C N Peek lived once belonged to Alfred Banks.

The late G M Blanton was born in 1861 at Apple Grove, Morgan County. His mother, Mrs Mary Johnston Blanton Morrow was the wife of the last soldier in that community.

David Johnston ran a horse power mill and gave the people wheat straw to feed their stock on to make a crop.

Mrs Norrell the mother of J G Cleckler, was laid to rest at Mt Oak.

Dr J H Maples lived in this community in the 90's on the Cagle place.

John R Saylor came from Georgia in the early 80's and settled near the top of Brindlee mountain, where you go down the mountain at the Light gap into Coctaco Valley. His youngest son, Willie Saylor, lives at the old home. John R Saylor was born in 1856, died in 1927; Mary A Cagle Saylor, born in 1859, died in 1927.

Arthur M Saylor was born in 1879, died 1911. He was married to Miss Ada Wheeler, daughter of J C Wheeler. Mr Wheeler was brought from Tennessee to Alabama in 1852 by his mother.

J G Cleckler, one of Ruth's postmasters, born 1859, died in 1909. He was married twice. He was a half brother to Samuel Norrell and Gether Norrell.

Clinton R Morrow, born 1871, was killed by a boiler exploding in 1906. He was married to an Isenhour and his widow married to the late E H (Zeke) Johnston.

Mrs Mary Jane Morrow, born 1831, died 1918.

William M Blanton, born 1903, was drowned in Smith Lake near Warrenton, July 4, 1919.

Chapter XXXVII - The History of J. J. Dobbs & Family (Nov. 28, 1945)

This information was given to me by P H Duett, Arab 2.

Jabez J Dobbs, born 1826, died 1892. He was married to Miss Elizabeth Dodd. They had 4 sons and 4 daughters.

(General History of Marshall Co., Ala., continued)

The Dobbs family came from Tennessee to Alabama.

Several of the Dobbs family are preachers: Rev S L Dobbs, C D Dobbs, George Dobbs, Wallace Dobbs, B L Dobbs and Bishop H M Dobbs.

Mollie Dobbs married J N Feemster; Margaret Dobbs married James Starkey and Fannie Dobbs married a Duett.

JJDobbs was an overseer on a farm, where they owned slaves. One of the young negroes was hungry and had them to bake him an ash cake and he was washing the ashes off and his mistress came by and pinched it out of his hand. The negro made some remark that his mistress resented and she ordered J J Dobbs to take him out to the barn and whip him. He carried him behind the barn and told the negro to scream every time he hit the tree. When the negro returned to the house his mistress taunted him, and said, "Oh yes! you caught it didn't you? I am glad of it."

J J Dobbs moved from Ft Payne to a place north of Samuel Feemster's mill. It was a hollow kind of a cove at the foot of Brindlee mountain. They called it "Dobbs Hollow." He lived there for some years and moved to Brindlee mountain close to where Askea Grove church was built. He died there. Some folks called him "grandpap" and some "Uncle Jabe."

His widow lived with her daughter Mrs Mollie Femster, till she died. They called her "Aunt Bettie" and "grandma" Dobbs. If there ever was a saint of God, she was one. She and her husband took some orphan children to rear. Rev P H Duett, their grandson was left on orphan and lived with them. He said, "I was small. My grandparents were old and weren't able to work. I plowed an ox and made a small crop."

Pat, Robert and Sonnie Dobbs, cousins of his, and this scribe played together on Sundays and had a lot of fun. We never had any crosses, everything went well. There were poor educational advantages those days and Pat didn't get to go to school till late years. He married Miss Willie Fielding. They never had any children but reared some orphan children and educated them. Pat has farmed and been in the mercantile business. He and his wife have retired. They are in bad health. He has pastored churches, and has married a lot of folks. He has helped people who couldn't help themselves, has been liberal in charitable gifts. He was born May 16, 1878 and I was born May 22, 1878.

He wasn't born when his father died and his mother died when he was small. I have owed his peddling truck high as \$25. He has been a help to me.

His uncle, Elijah Dobbs, lived near J R Thomason. He wore a beard but once he shaved it off and put on a coat wrong side out and went to the Thomason home and hollered "Hello," and asked Mr Thomason if he knew where he could get some spirits. He didn't know him.

Family Origins and Favorite Recipes designed and illustrated by John C. Kittrell, Jr. Hard back; mottled, dark-brown cover; with frontispiece of gold letters and sketch of knight in armor; 212 pages (11 x 13 3/4); \$19.95, plus \$1.00 each copy for handling and mailing (Alabama residents, please add 4% sales tax). Published by: JOEL PUBLISHERS, 10002 Willow Park Drive, S.E., Huntsville, Alabama 35803. (Allow four weeks for delivery.)

At the February TVGS Workshop, we were privileged to examine Mr. Kittrell's book and are pleased that he has presented a copy of this innovation to family record-keeping to the Huntsville Public Library. This unique publication contains a Preface; Directions (for obtaining, compiling, and arranging genealogical data and recipes); Index for Surnames (a form); Genealogical Data Section (which consists of about 100 pages for photographs, coat of arms, or documentation and forms for ancestral information); and about 100 pages for treasured family recipes (the 28 categories being suggested in the Contents, i.e., Beverages, Soups, Meats, Breads, etc.). Mr. Kittrell has allowed generous space for writing which will certainly be easier for most genealogists and recipe-writers than are the forms which have come to this reviewer's attention. In addition to the beautiful frontispiece, the lovely art work throughout this book will be an inspiration to you and will enhance your arrangement of material.

In the Preface, the designer delights you with his recollections of earlier family life. Whether or not your experiences are the same, the reader will still recall poignant experiences he, himself, had by "going home". Also in the Preface, Mr. Kittrell states: "The purpose of this book is to provide a vehicle for you to create a priceless heirloom for your family, a record beyond value that will be treasured always, not only by those people you know as your family today, but by future descendants you may never know, but who will know you by this book. The fact that you will enjoy many happy hours in compiling the various facets of family information and tradition is a plus in preparing your niche for immortality."

We agree with Mr. Kittrell that two of the more important things to a worthy legacy are a sense of Family and the continuation of Tradition passed down through the generations. One could not choose a more perfect gift for a special person or a more beautiful manner in which to present and preserve that which you treasure than this handsome publication.
