



#### BOOK REVIEW

Cemeteries of Madison County, Alabama, Vol I, by Dorothy Scott Johnson. Blue cardstock cover, full name index and cemetery index, 371 pages (plus Chapter Key Map, Acknowledgment, and Introduction), 82x11, \$13.00. Available from Johnson Historical Publications, 2409 Gaboury Lane, NE, Huntsville, Alabama 35811.

Researchers are delighted about a book that has just been released. This publication is a record of tombstone inscriptions in all known white cemeteries (totaling 122) in the west half of Madison County, Alabama, except Memory Garden. The work is divided into seven chapters, with a map for each chapter, indicating location by legal description (range, township, and section) so that a searcher can go directly to (now or in the future) most of the graveyards described.

In addition to a few Bible records and newspaper articles, some 1850 Madison County Census records and old marriage records have been included by the compiler to identify more clearly the names found on markers. Mrs. Johnson's thoughtfulness is revealed by the fact that she has allocated space for Family Notes in several locations throughout this publication. This reviewer has long realized a need for such space as she utilized other cemetery records.

From personal experience, your reviewer knows that Mrs. Johnson has insisted on verifying other copists! interpretation of markers. With tenacity, in the three years that were taken to complete this work, she has crawled over, through, and under fences; she has scrambled through bushes and briars; and she has trudged patiently in dirt and mud to copy markers - many of which have never been copied. Her efforts have produced a marvelous primary evidence tool!

(Abstract of a typed letter from Robert Dyas to Miles C. Gorgas.)

1710 Broad Street, Nashville, Tenn., May 23, 1916.

My Dear Cousin Miles;

Yours of 15th inst. duly to hand. Thank you for the Posey data. When in Florence last year I had a telephone talk with Mary Kirkland, who was a Posey descendant, and found she knew nothing back of Judge Sidney Cherry Posey. She sent her family bible to me to examine and I copied the records therein - the same that you enclose me - said a fire a few years before had destroyed all the old family papers and that she remembered nothing of what her mother had told her of the old generations. Told me that about three years ago a young man named Posy called on her in Florence to ask about the family....told her a good deal she could not recall, he was from Illinois somewhere...... Mary Kirkland has a Florence friend now living in North Carolina who has told of knowing some of the Poseys in that State. .......Robert D

The name of Sidney Cherry Posey is identified with the annals of Lauderdale. He was born in Pendleton district, South Carolina, May 1803. His mother was a Miss Brooks. His family was among the earliest settlers of Madison, and there he grew to manhood and was educated. When twenty years old he taught school in Tuscumbia to obtain money to enable him to read law. This he did, was admitted to the bar, and remained several years in Tuscumbia. In 1832 he same to Florence, where he soon attained to prominence in his profession. In 1835 and '36 he represented the county in the lower house, and in 1837 served a session in the senate of the general assembly. He was again in the senate from 1844 to '47, and had previously served as judge of the county court five or six years. In 1847 he was elected circuit judge over Messrs. John E. Moore and Wm. Richardson—a position he filled till 1850. He was a member of the secession convention, and refused to sign the ordinance, but was true to the South. In 1861 he represented Lauderdale in the lower house. In 1865 he was appointed judge of the circuit court by Governor Parsons, and served till the following May. He died at his home four miles from Florence, Dec. 22, 1868.

Judge Posey was a man of decided ability, and left a character long to be respected and remembered by those who knew him. He married a Miss DePriest, and left descendants here.

(Full copy of a handwritten letter from Miles C. Gorgas to Robert Dyas.)

Navy Yard, Mare Island, Cal., May 15th 1916

My dear Cousin Robert

Herewith I enclose some data of the Posey family which I have just received - prsumably from Mrs. Campbell as the envelope is postmarked Florence and the address is in her handwriting - no letter accompanying just two sets of carbon copies - I keep one set & send you the other. The Poseys are only connected with us through Phars T Posey & Judge Sidney C. Posey; but the data is interesting to have.

You know, Phares T. Posey had two children by his wife Elizabeth Atwood (Mrs. S. D. Hutchings) - Ellen and Ann Jesse. Ellen married 1st W. P. Bedlock & 2d — OReilly & had one son by 1st marriage. Ann Jesse Posey married Alexander Porter Greene & had two daughters 1. Posey Beauregard Greene who married her half 1st cousin Frank L. Coffee (Mrs. McD's brother): & 2. Lady Greene who died unmarried.

I have just written to Mrs. Campbell to thank her for the data (it is most evidently taken from a family bible.) I again told her how interested I was in the Coffee ancestry & spoke of her grandfather, Gen John Coffee, being claimed as a cousin by Rice Coffey & others. And I said I was thinking of employing a professional genealogist to look up the Coffee records in Prince Edward or other counties in Va. Then I said - "His death marriage will & children ought to be matters of record and I hope to get some information" (I didn't underline "will" in my letter to her but just slipped it into the remarks.

Did you ever find out any Tanner who married a Hutchings? I see there is a Tanner family in Athens Ala. in the book on Northern Alabama that we have.

As yet I have not received any reply from Mobile to my letter to Mrs. Winston Jones - maybe she is dead - but some one has got the letter. No news to tell - all are well & join me in love & best wishes to you.

TVGS member Dorothy (Browne) Stewart (Mrs. D. B.), 5204 Whitesburg Drive, Huntsville, Alabama 35802 supplied us with copies of this book which is now in her possession. The small catechism (4" x 62") has been handed down in her family through the following generations:

- 1. Anna Peerce who married Peter Higdon
- 2. Mary Higdon who married Thomas Millay in Knottsville, Ky.
- 3. Mary Ellen Millay who married W. A. Coomes in Knottsville, Ky.
- 4. Susan Katherine Coomes who married Isaac Joseph Owen in Owensboro, Ky.
- 5. Sadye Ann Owen who married James McClellan Browne of Ohio
- 6. Dorothy Browne who married D. B. Stewart.

At the age of eleven, Dorothy Browne learned from her great grandmother, Mary Ellen (Millay) Coomes, that W. A. Coomes' father had studied for the priesthood, went completely deaf before ordination, married and died before the birth of his son. Mrs. Stewart states that some of the Higdons settled in Georgia and Alabama. END

Before me, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public in and for Navarro County, Texas, on this day personally appeared Mrs. Margaret H. Miller, known to me to be a person of unquestioned veracity, who deposes and says:

On Tuesday, November 10, 1946, I made a trip from Corsicana, Texas, my home, to Midlothian, Texas, in the company of Mrs. T. Walter (Ruth Peevey) Erwin, Jr.

We visited in the home of Mrs. Fannie Middleton and there I copied the following records from her family Bible. Mrs. Middleton is 92 years old and her full name is Margaret Ann Fannie Matilda Penelope Evergreen Peevey Middleton. I give her full name because in the Bible record her initials are used in several places.

Mrs. Middleton's daughter, Mrs. Pearl McKennon did not wish the Bible to be removed from the home but graciously permitted us to transcribe all the records found therein. Her address is Box 94, Midlothian, Texas, if any further corroboration than this affidavit is required.

Notes by Mrs. Miller:

Robert Watkins Peevey (1801-1856) married Susan Cromer 21 Dec. 1822, Madison Co., Alabama. He was the son of Dial Peevey who was on the Madison Co., Ala. 1830 census, and then was on the Pope Co., Ark. 1840 census age 80-90 as a Revolutionary Soldier. His wife was Elizabeth (Wade? Watkins?). This Peevey family was in the Ellis-Dallas Co., Texas area by 1860. They had originally migrated from Orange Co., N.C. and Fairfield Co., S.C. and through Georgia into Alabama.

#### NORTH ALABAMA OBITUARIES FROM TENNESSEE NEWSPAPERS

- CRITZ, Mrs. Mary, died on the 19th ultimo in Lawrence County, Ala., wife of George Critz; formerly of Williamson Co., Tenn. (Independent Gazette, Franklin, Tenn., 2 March 1822.)
- DARBY, Henry T., on the 6th in Colbert's Reserve, Col. Sam W. Thompson, late of the 10th Tennessee Infantry, accidentally shot Henry T. Darby, who died the next day. (Memphis Avalanche, 12 Jan. 1866.)
- GIVHAM, Patrick, killed by his father-in-law, W. A. Collier, a lawyer of Clanton, Ala. Givham threatened to kill his family; justifiable homicide. (Maury Democrat, Columbia, Tenn., 27 June 1889.)
- JONES, Charles C., 75, Confederate veteran, died at St. Florian, Lauderdale Co., Ala.; no family or kin survives. (Nashville Banner, 26 May 1913.)
- KEYES, J. A., formerly of Sheffield, Ala., died in Jasper, Ala.; buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Tuscumbia, Ala. (Nashville Banner, 19 Feb. 1913.)
- LURINGTON, Henry Feb. 24, Brownsville, Ala.- "This morning near west end of Eagle and Phonix Dam, a skeleton was unearthed by torrential rain-remains of Henry Lurington, who was killed 15 April 1865 by Wilson's raiders...buried near China tree on bank...in 1874 rain opened grave and he was reburied...tomorrow to be buried again. (Maury Democrat, 1 Mar. 1888.)
- MESSENGER, Asa, died on the 13th at home of N. A. Messenger; born 1801 in Connecticut, moved to Ohio as a small boy; in 1827 moved to Tuscumbia, and established newspaper the North Alabamian 36 years ago...editor and proprietor of paper...contributed much to the growth of Tuscumbia. (Memphis Avalanche, 18 March 1866.)
- MILLER, Henry A., of Florence, Ala., is dead; born in Lauderdale County; Confederate soldier; age 75; one of county court commissioners. (Nashville Banner, 5 March 1913.)
- RICE, Mrs. Lizzie L., has died; had fall last November; native of Pulaski, Tenn.; parents native of Virginia; married 1858 to Jackson V. Rice; lived in Florence, Ala.; husband was uncle of Gov. Patterson of Tennessee. (Nashville Banner, 15 April 1913.)
- ROUTT, Col. Willis, aged about 50, died in Madison County, Ala., on the 16th; farmer of Lincoln Co., Tenn. (Fayetteville, Tenn., Observer, 16 Dec. 1851.) (Note: this was the sixth and final husband of Elizabeth Dale Gibbons-Flannigan-Jeffries-High-Brown-Routt of Hazel Green, Ala.)

- (The tales surrounding the deaths of the husbands of Mrs. High-Brown-Routt, as she has come to be known, have been oft-told by Madison County history buffs. When one visits her once beautiful, now abandoned home, the hats of these men can "almost be seen" still hanging in the hall. -Editor)

#### "NEWSY NOTES" on 1885 Folks from The Huntsville Daily Mercury

Sunday, 30 August 1885, Daily Mercury, Huntsville, Alabama

"Mr. Walter M. Grubbs, is up from Decatur, on a visit to relatives."

"Mrs. F. W. Ward, and infant, of Memphis, Tenn., are on a visit to Mr.
L. H. Wilson's family."

"Mr. E. A. Cain and wife, are on a brief visit to relatives in Madison."

#### THE TENNESSEE (LAND) COMPANY or "THE YAZOO SALE(S)" before 1810

## One man once owned all Marshall County

(From an article written in 1936 by the late O.D. Street of Guntersville.)

Columbus discovered America in 1492, but it was late in the 18th Century before the white man began to be in any sense a factor in the history of the region where we dwell.

His first appearance here was in connection with two stupendous land speculations known as "the Yazoo Frauds."

The title to the soil of North Alabama was claimed by and. subject to the Indian right of occupancy, legally belonged to the State of Georgia. The nature of the Indian occupancy, and the attitude of the state and federal government toward it, were not as well understood then as later. Consequently it was frequent in those days for enterprising individuals to band together for the purpose of purchasing large tracts of country from the Indians, hoping to obtain later a recognition of their titles by the state or federal government. This hope, however, was doomed to disappointment.

About 1783 a company consisting of William Blount, afterwards governor of Tennessee, and other citizens of North Carolina made extensive purchases from the Indians of lands lying in the valley of the Tennessee River in what is now Alabama. They presented a petition to the Georgia Legislature setting out their purchase and urging the expediency of laying out a new county to include the territory lying north of the Tennessee River in what was called the "Big Bend" of the Tennessee. The proposed county embraced what are now all or parts of Marshall, Jackson, Madison. Limestone and Lauderdale Counties.

This endeavor was authorized, seven commissioners were appointed and an attempt made to set up the county, but the Indians present hostile and rest less John Donelson, who appears to have been the most active in the enterprise, was killed by the Indians and the commissioners

never had another meeting. (Mr. Donelson's daughter later became the wife of President Andrew Jackson.)

We come now to consider two of the most remarkable land speculations in the history of our country, and the soil of Marshall County was involved in both of them.

The failure of the attempt to organize "Houston County" did not discourage the land speculators. A new company was soon organized known as "the Tennessee Company."

At the head of it was Zachariah Cox, a native of South Carolina, a man of boldness and determination. Like many of the prominent men of his time he was a practical land surveyor.

Having once beheld the beautiful Tennessee Valley, which the French philosopher De Toqueville pronounced the loveliest region his eyes had ever rested upon, Cox determined to possess it. He accordingly organized "the Tennessee Company" and procured a grant in December 1789 from the State of Georgia of 3,500,000 acres of land, embracing what are now the northern counties of Alabama including Marshall, for a little over \$6,000 or about 1½ cents per acre.

President Washington issued a proclamation forbidding any person to engage in the enterprise, fearing it might cause trouble with the Indians and with Spain.

But Cox paid no attention. In January 1791 he, with obout 40 followers, made his preparations to descend the Tennessee from the junction of the Holston and French Broad Rivers to Muscle Shoals.

On being informed of his plans, the secretary of war sent a messenger to warn him that if he did so the Indians would be notified and permitted to act toward his party as they might think proper.

For a time they were intimidated by these warnings but in the spring of the same year Cox with a party did actually proceed to Muscle Shoals and built a blockhouse and other defensive works. Soon, however, the Cherckee chief Glass, appeared with a body of Indians and threatened

them with death if they remained. After some parley it was agreed that the company should be allowed to withdraw without injury. They returned to Knoxville and the Indians destroyed their works.

On the return to Knoxville, Cox and the others were arrested by the federal authorities charged with trespassing on Indian lands. An effort was made to have them indicted but the grand jury refused to return a true bill.

Encouraged by this victory over the authorities, Cox boldly proclaimed that he would renew the attempt that autumn with a large force gathered from Maryland. Virginia, the Carolinas and Georgia. His fortunes seemed now so prosperous that he found ready purchasers for many thousands of acres of land.

But the enterprise fell through from failure of Cox and his associates to make the deferred payments to the State of Georgia. The grant was rescinded and the purchasers from Cox lost all they had paid. This was known as the "First Yazoo Sale."

Cox was still undiscouraged. He soon obtained another grant from Georgia to the Tennessee Company, known as the "Second Yazoo Sale," the consideration being about 2½ cents per acre.

This extensive grant included all of what is now Marshall and six other counties and parts of ten others. The Georgia legislature passed the act in 1795.

Its passage at once aroused throughout Georgia a storm of the utmost indignation, the charge being freely made and sustained by proof that votes in favor of its passage had been procured by previous agreements to share with such members the lands they were about to grant.

It also created alarm among the Cherokee Indians, whose title to the lands in question had not been extinguished by any treaty. The apprehension that the Cherokees might go to war on account thereof excited the fears of the federal exthorities also.

President Washington on Feb. 17, 1795, sent a special message to Congress concerning the matter.

He said, "These acts embrace an object of such magnitude and in their consequencies may so deeply affect the peace and welfare of the United States, that I have thought it necessary now to lay them before Congress."

The grand juries of a majority of the counties of Georgia expressed their condemnation of the grant in unmeasured terms and demanded its regeal. The succeeding elections turned mainly on that issue and resulted in the defeat of every man who had voted for the grant.

The new Legislature promptly appointed a committee to investigate the methods by which the grant was procured. The committee obtained abundant proof of bribery and corruption. A bill was promptly passed declaring the grant void, the records of its passage were expunged, and the original bill itself was burned in the presence of a great concourse of people in the streets of Louisville, Ga., the then state capitol.

Unawed by all this. Cox and his associates went right ahead with their efforts to dispose of their stupendous grant, bidding defiance to the combined authority of the United States, Georgia and the Cherokee Indians.

The grant was surveyed and laid off in townships and lots. More than one attempt was made to locate companies of settlers in the territory. Cox issued glowing accounts of the beauty and fertility of the country and offered to each purchaser of 1,000 acres a lot free of charge in a projected town called "Elk."

To use a current slang, Cox appears to have been "the whole thing." He conducted the correspondence, executed powers of attorney, and it seems clear that he was the moving spirit as well as the chief owner of the Tennessee Co.

The validity of his title found its way before the Supreme Court of the United States in 1810, and that august tribunal decided that the grant, being in the nature of a contract, could not be ty \$5; outside the county, \$7.

impaired by any future Legislature, and that therefore Cox's title was good.

Title, however, proved powerless against a united hostile public opinion, and Cox, as well as most of the other claimants, finally entered into an arrangement with the United States government whereby they received "script" which was receivable in payment of lands to be located within the territory granted to the Tennessee Co.

It must, however, be conceded that his title was good, and that therefore all of Marshall County at one time legally belonged to one man.

### Historic cemetery near Boy Scout camp

A few hundred yards from Camp Ross, the Boy Scout camp near Streets Bluff, is a cemetery more than a hundred years old that was used by the two families the bluff was named for.

It was called Beards Bluff before it was called Streets Bluff. The five graves in the cemetery are those of Beards and Streets.

Mrs. Wright Ross, whose husband owns the land the Scout camp and cemetery are on, is a descendant of members of both families.

The two oldest graves are those of her great-grandparents Arthur Campbell Beard and his wife Pheriba Jane Beard. Mr. Campbell was born in 1810 and died in 1877. Mrs. Beard was born in 1816 and died in 1853.

Three of their grandchildren

lied in the other three graves in the 1880's. They were children of Thomas Atkins Street and Julia Beard Street, who were Mrs. Ross's grandparents.

Mr. Street was probate judge 24 years, longer than anybody else in the history of Marshall County.

After his death Mrs. Street moved to Boaz to live with her daughter. She joined a Methodist Church there and became one of its most active members. After her death, in gratitude for what she had done for it, it was renamed the Julia Street Methodist Church. It is one of the three largest churches in Boaz.

Besides Mr. and Mrs. Street's three children who died young, they raised six others. There was no school in that vicinity, so Mrs. Street taught the children at home.

When the oldest, O. D. Street Guntersville, Ala., Mar. 18, 1971 who died in childhood were bur- || (Mrs. Ross's father), was old

enough to go to college he went to the University of Alabama at Tuscaloosa and told them his mother said for him to enter the sophomore class. They gave him a test and found him qualified for that class, so enrolled him as a sophomore. Later the second son, Atkins, went there with a message from his mother that he was ready for the sophomore class. They gave him a test and he too qualified as a sophomore. When the third son, Ed, showed up at Tuscaloosa they asked him what class his mother told him to enter. He said the sophomore class, and they put him in it without bothering to give him a test.

All three became lawyers. Ed practiced at Waco, Texas. O. D. practiced at Guntersville and became a well known historian and one of Alabama's leading Republicans. Atkins went to the Phillippine Islands where he helped codify their laws, and became a member of the Philippine Supreme Court.

#### GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA

Chapter XXXVIII - New Friendship Church (Dec. 5, 1945)

The church was first named Ebenezer and some confusion arose among some of the members and they met and made friends. Mrs Sarah Hill said: "We have made friends, let's call it New Friendship."

The church was organized April 10, 1886, the presbytery consisting of Elder P J Corley, P M Williamston and J K Kelly. Members joining were: T J Smith, S M White, James Jernigan, Ellen Gona, M J Jernigan, Ludie White, Mrs Hardin and Metilda Smith. Minutes were signed by P J Corley, Moderator and James Jernigan, church clerk.

All of the charter members are now dead. Mrs M J Jernigan was the last that died.

The first house was built out in the field now owned by F C Lee.

When this history was given Mrs F C Lee said, "I went to school to the late Isaac Brown about 45 years ago. It was built in 1886. That was the date of the organization of the church."

The late Rev J E Canon, J M Thompson and William Walls cut the first timber to build the church and J E Canon said, "I stuck the first axe in a post oak tree to make the sills."

The frame building was built in 1900. JJ Henson, J E Owens and W W Rowe were the building committee.

Rev B Chambers, pastor, 1886-89; WW Rowe and J H Ellenburg, clerks. Rev M K Taylor, pastor 1890-92; W W Rowe, clerk. Rev J S Phillips, pastor, 1893 and part of 1894. From then to 1905, J B Davidson, N B Holsenback and T E Forrester were clerks, Rev J E Canon, pastor, 1917; T E Forrester, clerk, Rev. M H Owens, pastor, 1918; O. Owens, clerk, Rev F S Tune, pastor, part 1918, till 1920; JO Smith, =clerk; Rev J E Canon, pastor, 1921-24 and part of 1925; J O Smith clerk. Rev J M Cash, pastor, part of 1925, till 1929; F C Lee, clerk. Rev L F Campbell, pastor 1930-34; F C Lee clerk. I haven't the record of Rev L F Campbell, the rest of his pastorate, Rev G W Helms, served awhile. They are building a brick building now.

Deacons--J T Tidmore, William Knight, John Owens, T E Forrester, A J Furgerson and J W Jones and probably others.

There is a school named Friendship. Among the teachers: Carpenter Jetton, Miss Maletta Perkins, Mrs Dewey Hipps, Miss Ora Perkins, Mr & Mrs Luther Gibbs, Miss Lou Dorsett, Melton Smith, Miss Stead, Miss Violet Wright, G W Jones Robert Culvert, J W Prantice and others.

I had a letter from W W Hyde, Knox City, Texas, about the write up of his brother, I B Hyde. He said the yoke of Oxen belonged to the late N P Clark, that his father, the late Harley Hyde, moved in a one horse wagon.

(General History of Marshall Co., Ala., continued)

He said there were four families that came, Gus Cox and family, N P Clark and family, Harley Hyde and family and Thomas Long and family.

He said they were on the road 17 days. They traveled 20 1/2 miles per day. The folks that had mule and horse teams had to wait on Mr Clark with his ox team. He made inquiry about B V Alexander, J W Cobb and J H Coker.

Mr Hyde and family left Brindlee mountain and went to Texas in the 90's. He was a rural mail carrier 34 years and has been retired 5 years. He was a son of Harley and Mrs Harriet Cobb Hyde Alexander. He married Miss Isabelle Hallmark, lived near New Caanon church.

Chapter XXXIX - S K Rayburn Was leader in early G'ville (Dec. 12, 1945)

Samuel King Rayburn, merchant and Major General of Militia, was born in Beach Grove, Bedford County, Tenn., in 1812 and died in 1892 at Guntersville.

He received a common school education and in 1819 came to Alabama with his parents. In 1834 he went to Guntersville, where he engaged in the mercantile business and with the exception of two years was in that business until 1847, when he volunteered as a member of Capt. John McGee's Independent company and served in the Mexican war.

He returned to Guntersville in 1848; was elected in 1849 as clerk of the Circuit court, which office he held for eight years; in 1857 was elected to the State senate; and in November 1858, was elected president of the Tennessee and Coosa Railroad company holding the office until 1868.

In 1861, at the outbreak of the war of secession he was elected by the people of Marshall, Jackson, Dekalb and Cherokee counties as Major-General of Militia. He resigned in 1862 and was appointed on the staff of Gov. Moore. In the fall of the same year he raised a company of volunteers, was commissioned Captain of Co. B, 48th Alabama Infantry, was compelled by sickness to resign, returned home, and in early 1863 was appointed Register in Chancery, holding the office until his death; 1870-1876, he was county solicitor; was justice of the peace and mayor of Guntersville several times; was one of the organizers of the Tennessee and Coosa Railroad; was one of its directors and for about ten years was its secretary.

He was a Democrat and a member of the Cumberland Presbyterian church. Married (1) in 1840 to Mrs Sarah Davenport, who died in January 1860; (2) in 1861 to Mrs Evergreen (Rainey) Hendley, who was killed by the explosion of a shell of the enemy at Gunt rsville in 1862; (3) in 1863 at Guntersville to Nannie Nix, who died November 1874; (4) in 1880 to Jane Warren of DeKalb County.

Children by first marriage: Capt John Rayburn, a graduate of Cumberland University, and a Captain in the Infantry; by third marriage: Mrs Bessie R. Rayburn Samuel; Samuel King Jr., born June 21, 1876, a teacher in Guntersville Academy, died in 1888; John S; William C; Mrs Jennie Chandler. Two of his children live in Guntersville now: W C Rayburn, lawyer,

and Mrs Jennie Chandler, widow of John D Chandler. (Series to be continued)

# BOWLING GRAVES AND WILL, LAWRENCE COUNTY, ALABAMA

The following Bowling data was contributed by Helen Bowling McKnight (Mrs. Wm. B.), Huntsville, Alabama, who copied these tombstones in 1961; her personal notes about them are in parenthesis; for additional information on this family see Queries in <u>Valley Leaves</u> Vol. 3, Nos. 2 & 3.

BOWLING GRAVES IN OLD TOWN CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH CEMETERY, LAWRENCE COUNTY, ALABAMA

This cemetery is located in Lawrence Co., Ala. on the south side of Highway 24 at its intersection with Highway 101, about 3 miles west of Landersville in the same county. Highway 101 dead-ends here. Old Town Creek Baptist Church Cemetery is partially recorded in Dorothy Gentry's Life and Legend of Lawrence Co., Ala., published in 1962; and also partially recorded in Jones and Gandrud's Alabama Records, Vol. 89. There is no known complete reading of this cemetery which contains a thousand or so graves, and is still being used. The church by the cemetery was organized about 1818, and some minutes dating back to 1857 are extant.

> Sacred to the Memory of Alex Bowling Born 13 April 1781 Died 27 January 1843

(This monument is the tallest one in the old part of the cemetery, that east of the church. It is at least 8 feet high and has a base 18 inches square, only one side of which is engraved. A member of the church told me in 1963 that this spire has often been toppled by high winds, and that it has been replaced on its base several times in his life-time. The object originally atop the spire, legend says, was a brown jug put there at the request of my great great grandfather, Alex" Bowling. It is said he was a "drinking man" and wanted the jug there as a reminder to others that drinking did not pay. One can see that whatever was originally there has been broken off. In the plot around the base of this tombstone there are several broken and worm slabs. The only two that could be read are below.)

Sacred to the memory of James M. Bowling Who was born on the 11 day of November 181 (?5 or ?3) and departed this life the day of February (Worn, but other records show he died in 1844.)

In memory of Alex Bowling Born Oct. 10, 1819 Departed this life Oct. \_\_\_ 1850 (Jones-Gandrud, Vol.89 gives death date as "Oct. 3, 1850")

(James M. & Alex were sons of Alex Bowling.)

James M. Bowling George W. Bowling William H. Bowleng and Mildred Wilkerson Item 2nd. I will and bequeath to my son Preston Bowling Alexander Bowling Jr. and my Son in law Andrew J. Walton each five dollars and for them to have nothing more or interest in my estate. Item 3rd. I do will and bequeath to my son W H. Bowling two quarter sections of land vz. one quarter on which my dwelling house is on known as the Lester quarter and the quarter lying due west known as the Vining quarter.... his Mother to live on the land her life time....(more division of property and money, same names mentioned again -Editor)....my Brother William Bowling and my Son James M. Bowling executors of this my last will and testament....set my hand & seal

This Marshall Co., Mississippi transcript of Alexander Bowling's will is the only known copy, as the original estate papers for Lawrence Co., Alabama are also missing.

NOTE: This 1819-1832 Register, located in the Alabama Archives. contains the Civil Appointments for all of the counties in Alabama created before 1832. Those published to date in Valley Leaves are: Blount Co., Vol. 5, No. 1; Decatur Co. & Franklin Co., Vol. 5, No. 2; Jackson Co., Vol. 5, No. 3; Lauderdale Co., Vol. 5, No. 4; and Lawrence Co., Vol. 6. No. 1 (this issue). Those to be published in Vol. 6. Nos. 2. 3 & 4 are Limestone Co., Madison Co., and Morgan Co., in that order. All entries in this Register before late March 1823 are in the same handwriting, which indicates they were copied from an earlier list; however most remarks appear to have been entered "later." Some pages have no or only a few entries, others are full, and for some unknown reason appointments were written on unnumbered pages in the back of the Register when there were still blank pages in the front part. The Alabama Historical Quarterly. Summer 1944, published the "Register of Gubernatorial Appointments, Civil and Military, Feb. 8, 1818- Oct. 4, 1822" for the entire state. Although there are some duplicate 1819-1822 entries in these two Alabama Registers, there are also some original appointments and remarks shown in both.

# NEW YORK CITY "FARM SALE" — HEIRS IN 1907 LETTER

(Letter and family notes contributed by Mrs. V. W. Hamner, Jr., Huntsville, Alabama, who, after a ten year search for her great, great, great grand-mother's maiden name, found it (Allbright) in this letter which had been "stored" in a shoe-box under her Mother's bed. Mrs. Hamner thinks Hannah Allbright and John McGowan married about 1785, probably in South Carolina.)

Rainbow, Tex Oct 20th (NOTE: Envelope is postmarked Rainbow, Tex Oct 22, 1907; received Tuscumbia, Ala. Oct 24, 1907)

"My dear Granddaughter,

"Did I write you all that there is a prospect of the McGowan heirs inheriting a fortune. It seems Grand Pa's Grandma McGowan had a grand-uncle who once owned part of New York City as a farm. I think his name was Edwards - his only sister married an Allbright and her daughter, only child - married McGowan. Well he sold all of his farm but 40 acres - that was in the heart of the City - that 40 acres he leased for 100 years - a bachelor, went back to Ireland & died. The lease expires next year and the Lessees are looking up the heirs. Congressman Gillespie wrote to us about it - his mother, like Grandpa, one of the heirs. Many of the family think there will be no trouble about it - only hope they will get it.

"During the War there was a good deal of talk of the Southerners' property being confiscated - & the Lessees wrote to your great Grandpa S(hackelford) about it - but I had forgotten all about it. I like Mary Chapman, Mr. G(illespie)'s mother so much. We correspond.

## MORE ON HUGH FINLEY OF TUSCUMBIA, ALABAMA

On page 166 of <u>Valley Leaves</u> Vol. 5, No. 4 there appears the 1848 newspaper obituary of Hugh Finley, "the first white man who settled where Tuscumbia now is." The following shows he wasn't quite the first.

Two Hundred Years At Muscle Shoals, by Nina Leftwich, pages 45 & 46

"Michael Dickson was the first known white resident of the town....."

"In the next year or more four of Mr. Dickson's brothers-in-law came to town (Tuscumbia); they were Isaiah Dill, James McMann, Hugh Finley and Mr. Matthews."

(During his talk on Colbert Co., Ala. at the TVGS July 1971 meeting, Judge Gresham Hale also reported that Michael Dickson was the first white settler at Tuscumbia. but this. of course. was long before there was a town. —Editor)

# COLBERT COUNTY, ALABAMA WILL OF ARTHUR HENLEY KELLER, FATHER OF HELEN

Recorded in Will Book "A" - pages 301, 302, 303, 304 (Abstract)

I Arthur H. Keller of the County of Colbert, and State of Alabama,....
my beloved wife.....I am indebted to the estate of John P. Spalding of Boston, Massachusetts....my two life insurance policies....one payable to my wife Kate A. Keller, and the other to my two sons, James and Simpson Keller....my wife and children....my estate of every kind be divided into six equal parts, (Except the Hyde Store).....my wife and each of my children, Share and Share alike....the three youngest children until they shall come of age.....my said wife Kate A. Keller, the lot and Store house thereon in Tuscumbia known as the Hyde Store....my dear sister Evalina K. Keller who has been as a Mother to me and my children retain during her life her present home....wife Kate A. Keller executrix....at my residence in Colbert County, Alabama on this 27th day of August 1896.

Witnesses C. R. Palmer E. F. Adams Thos R. Roulhac Arthur H. Keller (Seal)

Recorded at Probate Court January the 26th 1897, Colbert County, Alabama

(The copy of this will was provided by Judge Gresham Hale, who spoke to the TVGS members at their July 1971 meeting on the history and records of Colbert Co., Alabama. About the will, Judge Hale commented, "I think it strange, that with a daughter with an affliction like Helen's, that her father didn't make a special provision for her in his will. He didn't even call her by name." Some additional Keller data published in 1921 follows. -Editor)

Arthur Henley Keller was born Feb. 5, 1836, Tuscumbia, Ala. and died there August 28, 1896; son of David and Mary Fairfax (Moore) Keller, the former a native of Hagerstown, Md., born 1788, emigrated to Knoxville, Tenn., a merchant there, moved in 1820 to Alabama; the latter a native of Rockbridge Co., Va., born 1796, second cousin to Robert E. Lee. Arthur H. Keller married (1) Nov. 12, 1867, at Tuscumbia, to Mrs. Sarah E. Rosser (d. 1877), daughter of William Simpson. Issue: Fannie Keller, d.y.; James McDonald Keller, d. 1906; and William Simpson Keller, present state highway engineer of Ala., resides Montgomery, m. in 1904 Aileen Moore of Columbia, Tenn. who d. 1911. Arthur H. Keller married (2) July 1, 1878 at Memphis, Tenn. to Kate Adams, daughter of Gen. Charles W. and Helen (Everett) Adams of Memphis. Issue: Helen Adams Keller, b. June 27, 1880, unmarried; Mildred Campbell Keller. m. 1907 Laban W. Tyson, Montgomery; and Phillips Brooks Keller, Meridian, Miss.
