

Good news from Limestone Co., Ala. - TVGS member Woody Kelley, 2003 Morningside Dr. NW, Huntsville, Ala. 35810, is now writing a genealogical column "Missing Links" for The Limestone Reporter, weekly newspaper of Athens, Ala. 35611 (Subscription - \$7 per year out-of-county). Woody invites you to send him queries concerning your Tennessee Valley ancestors. ---- Mrs. Eulalia Wellden, P. O. Box 781, Athens, Ala. 35611, has contributed additional marriages from Limestone Co. Marriage Records, 1832-62 (1832-34 marriages were in V. L., Vol. 7); now we shall be able to publish additional marriages from this book. ---- Your editor has abstracted Limestone Co. Deed Book 1, 1819-25, for Valley Leaves. Mrs. Wellden has offered to have photocopied, for a fee, any LIMESTONE Co. marriages and deeds we publish and will undertake limited courthouse research there. Write her about your needs from this county.

Sometimes deciphering the handwriting in these old books is almost impossible - a few look-alikes we have found are Edward/Edmund; David/Daniel; Love/Lane; Moore/Moon; Hankins/Hawkins; Hames/Harris; Martin/Mastin; George/Glaze; Walton/Watters; Rives/River; Jos(for Joseph)/Jas(for James), etc. A photocopy is useful in checking anyone's transcription of handwritten records.

Perhaps this newspaper ?correction? of a marriage announcement will interest you:

MARRIED on Tuesday evening the 7th inst. at the house of Richard Noell, by the Rev.
Daniel K. Hunter, Mr. Henry W. Pickens to Miss Lucy W. Nowlin, daughter of the late
Wade H. Nowlin, Esq. of Madison Co.

(Madison Co. Marriage Books show no Perkins licenses then; however, the October 1845 Pickens/ Nowlin marriage is recorded here. Obviously The Democrat staff had trouble with handwriting too.)



In Vol. 7, No. 1, are Bullen Cemetery, Franklin Co., Ala.; "McClusky Family Reunion" from Leighton News, Oct. 15, 1914; "Sugg Bible Record", Franklin Co., Ala.; and "James M. Ormand Bible Record", Franklin Co., Ala.

Settlers of Northeast Ala. (\$5.00 per year, P. O. Box 674, Gadsden, Ala. 35902; 40-50 pages per issue) Vol. 11, No. 4, has "Earliest Marriage Records, 1818-19, Blount Co., Ala." abstracted from Marriage Record 1, 1818-41, Jefferson Co., Ala. courthouse. Blount is one of our neighboring counties. Valley Leaves strives to bring you items from our Valley Counties that are NOT already available through other genealogical publications; so please do not send us records you have already had published in other quarterlies. We shall try to inform you of "Valley County" items in other publications. We hope to avoid unnecessary duplications.

Ann Cochran is continuing her Lauderdale Co. Will Abstracts, and Rebecca and Ezell Terry are continuing their Madison Co. Will Abstracts. Catherine Gilliam is continuing with 1850, 1860, 1870, and 1880 Mortality Schedules for our Valley Counties (plus DeKalb, a neighboring county). All of these are long-term projects that will be appearing in Valley Leaves future issues, along with an interesting variety of other materials contributed by subscribers and local researchers. Note: The following list of stockholders was taken from the Memphis and Charlesten Rail Road Company Annual Report for 1856-1857. The original book is in the Washington, D. C. office of Southern Railway System, purchaser of the M. & C. R. R. in 1898. The "Eastern Division" included all of this RR in Alabama (see map at end of stockholders list). The Mississippi and Tennessee part of this RR was called the "Western Division." Several other lists of stockholders are given in the Annual Reports for different years, but this is the only list showing place of residence. All of the 1853-1897 Memphis and Charleston Rail Road Company Annual Reports are on microfilm in the Public Library, Huntsville, Alabama.



The M.&C.R.R. was completed to Stevenson in 1857, and was never constructed, as originally planned, to Charleston, S.C.)



Notes about above map: Stevenson was originally called "Crow Creek". "Crighton" should have been Leighton on this map. The name "Jonesboro" was later changed to Town Creek (about 1876). Dickson had been called "Buzzard Roost"; see "Buzzard Roost F. U." on 1842 map of North Alabama in <u>Valley Leaves</u>, Vol. 7, No. 3, p. 110.

BURTON-MOSS FAMILY RECORDS, Franklin County, Alabama

These records were found in a Bible owned and used by Walter Scott Moss, son of Jackson Carroll Coffee Moss and wife Emily Ann Burton. The loose sheet containing the Burton family records appears to be older than the Bible in which the Moss records were written by a different individual. Mrs. Hazel Moss Lindsey of Robert Lee, Texas, a granddaughter of Walter Scott Moss, owned the Bible on May 17, 1970 when the records were photocopied. Contributed by TVGS member Mrs. R. L. Evans, 1012 North Jackson Ave., Russellville, Alabama, and submitted with photocopies, typescript, and notes by Jackson R. Stell, 310 Limestone St., N. W., Russellville, Ala. 35653, also a TVGS member.

Notes about those included in these records:

Drury Burton was born in Cumberland Co., Va. and was the son of Allen Burton and his wife Mary (nee Burton, the daughter of William Allen Burton.) Allen Burton moved to Caswell Co., N. C. where he died leaving a will probated in August 1841. Several of Allen Burton's descendants moved to Alabama: Allen Burton, Jr. lived in Lawrence Co.; son Thomas located in Sumter Co.; Hutchins, Drury, possibly son David, and a daughter who had married a Weir located in Franklin Co., Alabama.

Drury Burton married first (Bond in Caswell Co., N. C. 4 Oct. 1808) Jane Huston ("Jenny Hughston") and second (Bond in Caswell Co., N. C.) Margaret "Peggy" Richmond who survived him. All of the births of Drury's children by his second wife Margaret are given in the following records; but Jane's sons Drury, Jr., who remained in or returned to Caswell Co., N. C. where he died, and James Burton are not included in this family record.

Drury Burton, Sr. died about 1835 in Franklin Co., Ala. to which he had removed about 1820-21. Of his children:
Elizabeth married William Arthur Bowen in Franklin Co., Ala. 5 April 1834 (Reference: Bible record of their son William Drury Bowen)
Drury Burton, Jr. born 1 Feb. 1815 and died 17 Dec. 1892 (Reference: W.P.A. Tombstone Inscriptions, Hightower, Person Co., N.C., located in N.C. Archives)
married Catherine McMullian (Caswell Co., N.C.) 22 Oct. 1836
Emily Ann Burton married Jackson Carroll Coffee Moss (born Christian Co., Ky. died Jack Co., Texas.)(Reference: Mrs. Jacob A. Miller, 2604 Beaty, Odessa, Texas 79763, a descendant)
Mary S. Burton married William S. McDaniel in 1853 in Franklin Co., Ala. (Reference: Goodspeed's Arkansas, Columbia Co.)

The Moss family left Franklin Co., Alabama in 1850 and settled in Columbia Co., Arkansas, where by the 1860 census were also found the McDaniels and Margaret (Richmond) Burton, the widow of Drury Burton, Sr.

GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA by James Arthur Thomason

(As published in the 1945 & 1946 issues of The Guntersville Advertiser and Democrat. This series began in Valley Leaves, Vol. 4, No. 1, September 1969.)

Chapter 61 "Arab's Gins, Mills, Banks and Doctors" (May 15, 1946)

Those that have operated gins at Arab: Kennedy and Thompson, Thompson and Hartsfield, Kennedy and Bohanon, E D Kennedy, Ellenburg and Brown, Brown and Skidmore, J E Skidmore.

The first gin put up at Arab, JRN Thompson operated it. Had one gin head and packed cotton by man power. They fed the gin by hand.

The first grist mill was operated by J R N Thompson. Others that have operated mills: E D Kennedy, H M Gibbs, Fulmore Clemons. M A Robinson, J G Carter, W L Clark, S P Carroll, Edward Chambers, Riley Douglass, William Harrison, Benjamin Hazlewood, Farmers Exchange and maybe others.

Those that operated saw mills and planers: Clark and Kennedy, E D Kennedy, J R N Thompson.

The first steam circular saw on Brindlee mountain was operated by G W Thomason, who lived four miles east of Arab. It belonged to Jasper Smith of Warrenton.

A mail route went out from Arab, 1893 to Eddy, Ruth and to Austin. N M Skidmore was the carrier. Postmaster at Eddy was W M Perkins; at Ruth, Goden Cleckler, at Austin, J P Julian. F M Perkins was postmaster at Eddy, once H L Wright was postmaster at Ruth.

Ivey Hyatt carried the mail from Arab around to Austin with an ox and jenny.

The first cotton warehouse was built in 1910. Next 1931, another 1933 and they built another. The Brindlee mountain warehouse belongs to J M Leak.

The Bank of Arab was established and opened July 20, 1909. JRN Thompson presented the first check of \$2. Hogan Jackson was the president. Those that have served as cashiers: JJ Bain, JA Hanson, GA Brown, TW Milner and JL Scott.

Those that have served as assistant cashiers and clerks: T L Cox, L S Thompson, E W Carter, Thomas E Chambers, J K Howard Thomas Howell, T W Milner, Earl Parr, J L Scott and others.

Those that served as directors: JRN Thompson, WT Hinds, RJ Riddle, Russell Rice, ML Hinds, JJ Bain, Hogan Jackson, CE White, CB McClure, Jesse Knight, JA Hanson, HS Camp and probably others.

The first physicians who lived at Arab were Dr Thomas M Barclift, 1886; Dr M L Hinds, 1890; Dr J H Maples, 1895; Dr W T Hinds, 1889; Dr R E Cochran in the 90's; Dr M L Johnson, in the 90's; Dr Frank Barnard, 1918 (he died Oct. 21, 1918); Dr R M Crawford, 1930 and Dr J R Watwood practiced medicine a while with Dr R M Barnard.

When the first doctors came to Arab there weren't any phones and people had to come to Arab or go to Summit after Dr A W Haden, 8 miles.

Dr M L Hinds was a young man when he came to Arab. He had a big territory to go over, practiced in Blount, Marshall, Cullman, and Morgan counties. He rode a bicycle a while, went on horseback, in a buggy and in later years in a car.

He was married to Miss Julia Wharton, a daughter of Mr and Mrs William Wharton, of Summit. Dr Hinds bought the late Picken Butler place one among the first settlers of Arab, and divided it up into town lots and sold the lots at auction. They brought him \$14,000. Frank Hyatt bought 23 lots off the Butler tract and got the log house of the homestead. M L Skidmore bought the lot where the log house stood.

Chapter 62 "Electioneering in the Old Days" (May 22, 1946)

In 1899 I attended a picnic at the Boiling Spring in Brown's Valley, down in Brown's Creek bottom, during a political campaign. They had barbecued meat. About the time they had dinner spread there came a big rain and you could hardly eat the loaf bread and meat.

One of the speakers cursed before the ladies. I said to myself, "if I could vote I wouldn't vote for you."

A lawyer from Guntersville had him a few drams and wanted a drink of water. They had a broad plank that ran out over the spring and he walked out on the plank and fell in the spring and got wet.

The late J M Thomason and the late W M Coleman were out on a political campaign. They were in a certain community about noon and Mr Coleman said, "I know where a fellow lives, we will get our dinner."

They went to this man's house and he was in the field plowing. They rode up and Mr Coleman called him by name, but the fellow pulled his mule around at the end of the rows and kept plowing. He didn't pay them any mind.

Mr Thomason said, "It got away with Mr Coleman."

They were in another community where there was a church building that had on it "M. E. Church." Mr Thomason said to Mr Coleman "what kind of a church is that?" Mr Coleman said, "Jim, that is North of Jesus Christ and you and I belong to the one south of Jesus Christ."

J D (Tobe) Gross, lived near Beech Creek in Brown's valley was in a campaign. He called at a home and said "I am running for tax assessor on the Populite ticket." The lady said her man was in the field, but "you needn't go down there, you can't pop him."

Another man running for office called at a home which a crowd of women were quilting. He told them what he was running for. The women didn't know him. One of them said. "I guess you need to be elected for we haven't any officer now. "She was talking to the man himself. He laughed about it.

In our effort to locate and abstract all the wills of early Madison County, no matter where recorded, we have so far found two wills which are not recorded in any of the usual places. Since there is a possibility that they are not recorded in any record book, we are transcribing them in their entirety, lest they be lost forever.

Although the first of these wills is plainly signed James Fitz Jarrell, the person writing the will used Fitz Garrell throughout -

These two tombstones were found in a field near Pulaski Pike, Huntsville, Alabama by the children of Mrs. Sharron J. Moore of Greenmeadow Road in Huntsville. She reports the stones had lain there only a day or two as the grass was still green under them, and that she brought them to her house for safe keeping. The surmise is that they had been in someone's barn for many, many years before it was decided to "dump" them. The gravesites of these two people is unknown, but it is known that the White family had a tan-yard on Pulaski Pike in the early days of Madison County.

Book reviews

The Folks From Pea Ridge in Covington and Conecuh Counties Alabama by Wyley Donald Ward c. 1973. Blue card-stock, stapled, tape bound \$12 or hard-cover \$15, 8½ x11, 202 pages, indexed. Order from author, 3428 Darlene Circle, Huntsville, Alabama, 35810.

This neat clearly printed, easily read volume includes a touching and appropriate dedication, sections of early history and life style of the area, and genealogical data of the Bagley, Beck, Brooks, Feagin, Gafford, Godwin, Hassell, Hart, Kendall, Knowles, Lunsford, Mock, Padgett, Thomasson, and Ward families.

Ward traces the families, concentrating on those members arriving in the Pea Ridge area in the early to mid 1800's, well into the 1900's with numerous background references prior to their arrival in Alabama. He apparently reports only recorded facts in the seemingly thoroughly researched genealogical data in a manner that entices one to look for more facts, proof, and yet undiscovered information about these people.

Cemetery records are cited and location of same is given. Five interesting area maps are included. Excellent use is made of old family and community photographs.

The Kennamers of Alabama, Georgia and the U.S. should be grateful to Woody and Nelda for republishing this book. The original book has been printed in its entirety and has long been known as the definitive book on the Kennamers of Kennamer Cove in North Alabama. Unfortunately there were too few copies of the original edition still around due to the fact that only 300 were printed and many of those were burned in a Post Office fire.

The book begins with Hans Kennamer who came to Kennamer Cove between 1798 and 1805 and his thirteen children (Jacob, Mary, Samuel, Susan, Stephen, Rachel, David, Abram, Sallie, John, Levi, Zacheus and one unnamed). The book was written in haste and does include some errors which Woody hopes to correct in the near future. He is now writing a supplement to The Kennamer Family which will bring the family up to date since 1924 (some five more generations in some cases) and he will correct the errors and add material found since it was originally published.

This book is selling fast. There are a lot of Kennamers! 100 copies have already been sold and the big Annual Kennamer Reunion held the last Saturday in August at the Kennamer Pavilion at Kennamer Cove will see many more sold. Better get your copy now and put your name on the list for Woody's supplement.

This second Edition is the work of three TVGS members, the publishers Woody and Nelda Kelley and Lewis Wendell Page, Sr. who prepared the 5,000 name index. We are indeed proud of them and hope others will copy the idea of republishing family histories when it is possible to get permission to do so.

This is the true story of a mission maintained by the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Alabama between 1923 and 1953 in Sauta Bottom (Jackson Co.), Alabama. The book, which reads like a novel, centers around Augusta Martin, whose strong faith and determination gave many people a chance they would not have had without a school, some clothing and much love.

Although the book has very little genealogical data, it does give an interesting history of mountain life during those thirty years in Jackson County.
