

#### THE EDITOR'S LEAF

Those of you seeking records of families who lived in the area now included in COLBERT COUNTY, ALABAMA are reminded to check articles from Franklin and Lawrence Counties also. Colbert Co. was created from the northern part of Franklin Co. in February 1867; then it was abolished in November 1867 and re-established in December 1869. In 1895 Colbert County annexed a triangle from the northwestern part of Lawrence County.

The program for our September TVGS meeting was a history of Lauderdale County, Alabama taken from Jill K. Garrett's various books on Lauderdale County and presented by Mrs. V. L. Gibson of Florence, Alabama. Mrs. Gibson also gave us an inventory of records presently located in the Probate Judge's Office at the Lauderdale County Courthouse in Florence.

Two publications that have recently been given to the Huntsville Public Library might interest you:

1)Cullman, the county seat of Cullman County, Alabama, celebrated its 100th anniversary in April 1973. The city's Business and Professional Women's Club (Lorene Scott, president) produced a 164-page commemorative album Cullman Centennial, 1873-1973 which contains histories of several families, towns, businesses, &churches and includes many old snapshots. The town's founder Col. John G. Cullmann of Bavaria first immigrated to Cincinnati, Chio about 1855 and several years later interested 15 Cincinnati families in settling Alabama land purchased from the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Co. Col. Cullmann had lived in Florence and Tuscumbia while exploring the land for his dream colony. Until Cullman County was created in 1877 the area had been part of Morgan, Blount, Winston, and Walker Counties. To see how Cullman County was formed, compare the 1842 map of Alabama in V. L., Vol. 7, No. 3, March 1973, p. 110, with a current map of northern Alabama. (Sorry, I don't know if the commemorative album is still for sale.

2) Magazine of Bibliographies, Vol. 1, No. 3, Spring 1972 (56 pages, 9"x6") featured the Five Civilized Tribes - Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Creek, and Seminole Indians. (Order from Magazine of Bibliographies, 1209 Clover Lane, Fort Worth, Tx 76107. Single copy, \$5; subscription, \$15) Each issue of the quarterly is a bibliography of a different historical subject. This issue contained a Bibliography of the Five Tribes, naming publishers and prices of books now in print, as well as a brief inventory of the Indian Archives in the Oklahoma Historical Society Building in Oklahoma City and research suggestions. Interested readers should check the above issue for potential sources; Cherokee and Chickasaw Indians inhabited our area of Alabama.

HELP!!! Ann Cochran has gone far beyond the "call of duty" in helping get information from our Valley counties for you readers. We are now asking for some assistance from you researchers in the Florence, Ala. area. Could someone (or several of you) abstract some wills of IAUDERDALE COUNTY for us? Ann has completed the wills in books 5 & 6 and has abstracted several from book A. If you can spare a few hours to help others, please send me a postcard so I can tell you where to begin. The many long drives from Huntsville to Florence for the scle purpose of abstracting for Valley Leaves (with no reimbursement for time and travel and having no ancestors in that area) would only be undertaken by someone as dedicated to helping others as Ann Cochran is. Won't someone share the work? (Bible and cemetery readings are also needed. Please see our "TVGS Policies" in Vol. 8, No. 1, September 1973.)

NORTH AIABAMA NEWSPAPERS - Do you have copies of or clippings from any newspapers published in one of our Valley counties before the 1870's? If so, will you please send a postcard to your TVGS editor giving name of newspaper, place published, and date of the issue. Many newspapers published in the 1800's have been microfilmed but many issues were never located and therefore are not preserved on microfilm. Some rolls of film have almost an entire year's papers missing. Some newspapers published in limited numbers for a short time during the 1800's have not been preserved at all. If you happen to have an issue heretofore unlocated, we would like to have a chance to abstract and/or copy it. Would you also consider donating it to the Alabama Department of Archives and History? Please check your old trunks and attics and note the dates on any old North Alabama newspapers; then please notify us of any you find dated before the 1870's especially. Thank you.

Could you please send us a copy of your Family Tree Chart (sometimes called a Five-Generation Pedigree Chart)? TVGS is trying to get one from each member. We already have several collected in the Family File in the Huntsville Public Library's Heritage Room.

# SOME 1818-51 NORTH ALABAMA MARRIAGES FROM NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE NEWSPAPERS

Contributed by Mrs. T. T. Garrett, Jr., 610 Terrace Dr., Columbia, Tenn. 38401. Mrs. Garrett selected these marriages at random over a period of several years without intending to have them published. She sent them to us realizing that her notes would be invaluable to those seeking early Alabama marriages from Franklin Co. (courthouse records before about 1890 destroyed); Colbert Co. (formed from Franklin Co. in 1867), Jackson Co. (marriages before 1851 destroyed), Morgan Co. (Book A begins 1821: some earlier marriages in Orphans Court books); Limestone Co. (marriages before 1832 missing): and Lawrence Co. (Book B begins 1828: part of Book A in State Archives.) Although Madison Co. has copies of all its marriage books sInce 1809, some licenses and returns are NOT recorded in books now at the courthouse; some records are copied incorrectly. Few, if any, counties can guarantee that ALL licenses or bonds are recorded in their present-day marriage books.

LIMESTONE COUNTY, ALABAMA, DEEDS OF GIFT, 1819-1825

These Deeds were abstracted from Deed Record 1, 1819-1825, in the Probate Judge's office, Limestone County Courthouse in Athens, Alabama, during September 1972 and February and March 1973 by Helen Bowling McKnight of Huntsville, Alabama. All items in the Deed book were abstracted and will be presented in Valley Leaves according to the type of document recorded.

Deeds of Gift conveyed property, frequently slaves, from one person to another, usually a relative. The property was not purchased; the conveyance was made "for the good will, love, affection", etc., the grantor had for the grantee. Occasionally, as in a gift to a married woman or minor children, a Trustee was named to be responsible for the property.

# GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA by James Arthur Thomason

(As published in the 1945 and 1946 issues of The Guntersville Advertiser and Democrat. This series began in Valley Leaves, Vol. 4, No. 1, Sept. 1969.)

Chapter 63

ter 63 "History of Arab" (May 29, 1946)
ST Thompson first kept the mail in a truck. Later he made a cage, with boxes running alphabetically. His son J R Thompson, Baileyton Rt 1, has the cage.

Mr Thompson kept a few goods in his dwelling house where he kept the office and he built a store house and kept the office and a few goods.

He kept the postoffice till 1893, when Dr M L Hinds was appointed post master. He served about a year and R J Riddle was appointed. He and J W Powell were partners in a store. They dissolved partnership and built a new store house.

Later on the building burned. Mr Powell was sleeping in the store house. Miss Rose

Thompson discovered the fire.

Russell Rice was the fourth post master and Arab was made a money order office during his administration. Feb. 11, 1924: F P Archer, was postmaster. G L Camp was postmaster, his time expired Feb. 9, 1936. Then came Leon Hinds, the present postmaster. His wife, Mrs. Flora Ann Hinds, served while he was in the army.

Those that have been clerks in the office: Jesse Knight, W L Gregory, D C Swords, Mrs Julia Hinds, J W Powell, Mrs G L Camp, Mrs Dona Riddle, Miss Bessie Hinds, Cecil Solley and others.

The first rural route out of Arab, 1905. A H Riddle, Arab Rt 1; W D Holder on Arab Rt 2: R L Cox Rt 3.

A H Riddle carried the mail on Rt 1 till 1908 and D C Swords till 1940. Ernest Black carried the mail on Union Grove Rt 3 20 years and was transferred from Union Grove Mar. 1,

J B Hipp was carrier on Union Grove Rt 1 and then A 0 Thompson carried it awhile. It was made Arab Rt 4 and then they consolidated 4 Arab routes into 3. A 0 Thompson took the place of W D Holder when he retired from Rt 2. Ernest Black went on Rt 1, when D C Swords

R L Cox was transferred to Philcampbell and J C Hinds came from Philcampbell to Rt 3 carried it till his death. J L Cox, a substitute, carried it till Haden Copeland was appointed.

Ernest Black's mother was Mrs Mary Briscoe Black. She was 90 years old Feb 25, 1945. His father W A Black, was 80 years old July 6, 1928. He died in 1928, was buried at Mt. Tabor church, Morgan County. Ernest Black married the first time Miss Eliza Barclift in 1927. She died in 1936 and he married the second time to Mrs Shelton.

S T Thompson was elected county commissioner of the first District. He would assess delinquent tax. He ran a store where the bank of Arab is. His son, D T Thompson, sold out to him and went to Cullman and put up a store.

Stephen Hopkins one of the descendants of Stephen Tuttle Thompson, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, the third generation, is living now.

Arab was incorporated in 1892. The late S T Thompson got a Mr Thos. Kennamer to pass a law to not allow any whiskey sold near the church.

The first mayor was appointed by T A Street, probate judge. J R N Thompson was the first mayor. R J Riddle was the first mayor to be elected by the people. There were about 30 years for which there isn't any raecord of officers.

"History of Diamond" (June 5, 1946)

The Indian grave yard was under the house where Coe Allen lived and another not far from the church on the late Beed Woodall place. Two tribes of Indians lived in this community.

There was a log church at the foot of Brindlee mountain near Mink creek called Center

D W Jarrett who lived near the old church, operated a government distillery. Folks would swap a bushel of fruit for a gallon of brandy.

Mr Jarrett came from North Carolina to Blount county, married there, and moved to Brindlee mountain, in 1883. They bought a house and lot, lived there till their death .

E R Murray was a cousin of Mr Jarrett. He married Miss Sarah Crews, a sister of Mrs Jerrett. Mr Murray came from Blount county and lived near the Champion Farris grist mill. He sold his place and moved to Sand Mountain. He married the second time to Mrs Petit.

Both Mr Jarrett and Mr Murray, fought in the Civil War.

They moved the place of the old church to a place where Gus May owns, fronting the Griffin cemetery. In 1890, they built a frame building where the present church and school building are. It is the same building except they built a room to that house. (To be continued)
