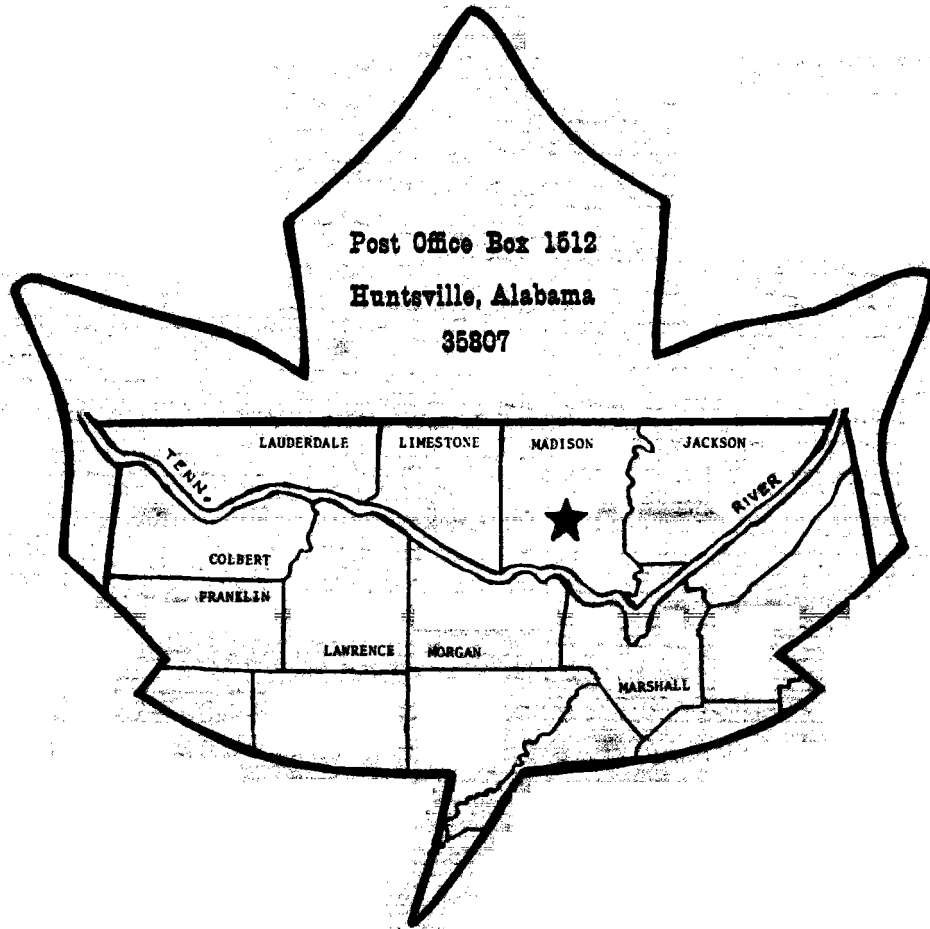

The very materials which disappear or are destroyed by one person may prove to be the one item which would solve the problems of another. Public records should be public, yet the misuse of so many records has forced the personnel of these storehouses of history to lock them away, hide them or limit their availability.

During this time preceding the celebration of our nation's Bicentennial, let us strive to be the "good guys" and provide our harried officials with one group which will support their preservation efforts. Some positive steps which we can take are: (1) protect and treat with care the records with which we have contact, (2) share materials which we have obtained, (3) respect restrictions imposed by authorities, and (4) call the hand of a thoughtless or careless person. Let's make sure that those whom we encounter in our research can greet us with, "So glad to see you!"

MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA MARRIAGE BOOK, 1836-1846

(Pages 1 -25)

Records on pages 1-46 of this original 285-page book were abstracted on 20 March 1974 in the courthouse in Guntersville by Mrs. Roy J. Cochran and Mrs. William B. McKnight of Huntsville, Alabama.

Interpretation of the spelling of names may differ; the names are sometimes spelled differently in the licenses, the returns, and the index (which is incomplete, with the pages beginning to tear around the edges.) Marshall County is one of the few counties that still has its original marriage papers. A few original papers may be missing, but some marriages not recorded in the books may be found among the original papers which also name the bondsmen and sometimes include a parental letter of consent to the marriage.

The first entry in this book is a notation of an application for letters of administration; pages 30 and 31 contain authorizations for two Methodist ministers to solemnize marriages in Marshall County, Alabama. The remainder of pages 1-46 contains marriage records. (Some names and dates were checked with originals.)

Mary's husband, Wiley Gallaway was a school teacher for many years, then was Clerk of the Lawrence Co. Court in the 1830's and '40. Wiley Gallaway died in 1864 in Waxahachie, Texas. GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA
by James Arthur Thomason

(As published in the 1945 & 1946 issues of The Guntersville Advertiser and Democrat. This series began in Valley Leaves, Vol. 4, No. 1, September 1969.)

Chapter 69 "History of Arab" (July 10, 1946)

The first merchant of Arab was Stringer Woods. The building was built out of hewn logs, the house stood where the Bank of Arab is now. W. H. Leak said when he bought a sack of flour from Mr. Woods in 1885 he had to go three miles to the late Henry Lusk's to get a \$20 bill changed. Mr. Woods sold out to the late D. T. Thompson. The house was destroyed by fire, and a frame building was built.

Then came as merchants: Rice and Goodwin, Russell Rice, C. T. Goodwin, W. J. Goodwin, D. F. Davis, Riddle and Smith, Riddle and Powell, D. H. Coker, Rice and Martin, Riddle and son, Thompson Mercantile Co., J. E. Canon, W. M. Tompkins, James Gregory, J. T. Allen, J. G. Carter, Fielding Bros., T. P. Fielding, W. A. Luther, Luther and Taylor, Luther and Amos, Jesse Camp, Alfred Dendy, F. M. Perkins, Linn Bros., Lewis Tompkins, James King, David Moon, C. W. Hewett, Nona Farrow, W. M. Isom and son, J. W. Harper, J. R. Colvin, A. L. Clark, W. L. Clark, Knight Bros., Ducketts, J. T. Knight, Jesse Knight, Riddle and Co., L. A. Camp, M. F. Bishop, William Harrison, F. H. McDaniel, P. D. Feemster, Ike Whisenant, M. L. Rice, G. M. Weaver, J. N. Stone, Robert Walker, Farmers Exchange, Marion Harper, H. M. Skidmore, Mrs. M. L. Skidmore, L. G. Camp, Rice Hardware Co., Stamps Hardware., J. D. Medlock, R. F. Thrower, Thrower's and other, Arab Hardware and Furniture Co., T. W. Riddle, J. G. Cater, W. H. Black Furniture Store, Elrod and Abner Hardware Store.

Drug Stores - Hinds and Bro., R. L. Rice, Griffith and Lindsey, W. H. Griffith, Selma Hewett and the Lindseys, Wooten and Dickson, Dr. J. H. Maples in the 90's kept drugs.

Blacksmiths - Tubbs, Mashburn, M. L. Camp, Mart Moore, W. T. Croft, J. M. Miller, Joe Duncan, Sprigel, Charles Hayes, Hunt and Knight, J. C. Hunt, L. M. Knight, Smiley Smith, James Ellenburg, T. McGuire, George Couch, John Bettinger, Obe Vest, J. M. Thomas, Mr. Chandler and probably others.

The first phone line was built from Warrenton to Arab by James Fuller.

The first phone line built from Arab to Guntersville was in 1908. Russell Rice operator. The late Walter Thompson kept the first switch board. At one time they could ring 315 or 320 phones from the switchboard.

Those that have kept the switchboard: Walter Thompson, Russell Rice, A. D. Graham, Luther Porch, E. W. Pesnell, J. E. Oliver and now a Mr. McDonald.

The first steam gin run near Arab was at the Brashier's Spring in 1886. It ginned 56 bales of cotton. The boiler of the engine sprang a leak, and the late J. W. Riggins, a blacksmith, patched it for \$10.00. This is the boiler that exploded in 1889 at Arab.

J. R. N. Thompson put up the first gin at Arab, as well as the first steam grist mill.

George Couch, a blacksmith, married Polly McWhorter one of the triplets of the late Mr. & Mrs. Moses McWhorter. The other two named Molly and Dolly, married and had families but I failed to get who they married.

Chapter 70 - "First Schools in Marshall County" (July 17, 1946)

According to traditions, or history, undoubtedly the first school established in Marshall county was the Creek Path Mission school founded in 1820 by the Presbyterian church. Its site was where the present residence of James Russell is now three miles south east of Guntersville. The locality is still known as the "Old Missionary". The school throughout its entire history was used for the education of the Cherokee Indians. John Brown, the father of Col. Richard (Dick) Brown was the chief influence among the Indians leading to the founding of this school. The school was opened by the Rev. Daniel S. Butrick in March 1820 and Rev. William Potter was long its principal. In this school taught the noted Indian girl, Catherine Brown, and her brother David. John Arch, a full blooded Cherokee preacher, was also instrumental in the founding of this school. It ceased with the removal of the Cherokees west of the Mississippi about 1838.

The second school established in the county was also for the Indians. It was founded by the Methodists in 1822 and the school house stood in a grove in the rear of where now stands the residence of the late Henry M. Long in South Guntersville. That's the home where Miss Flora and Hoyt Long live on the corner of Dunlap Ave., across from the Carl Johnson garage. It stood on the road or Indian trail leading from Gunter's Landing to Spencer's Spring (Warrenton). This school was opened Dec 29, 1822 by Rev. Andrew J. Crawford with 12 pupils. Others who taught in this school were: Rev. Richard Neely 1823-25; Ambrose F. Driskill 1826, who was presiding elder of this district as late as 1871; George W. Morris 1827, James B. McFerrin 1828-29 who later became one of the greatest preachers in Methodism; Dickson C. McLeod 1830-31; Thomas Loyd, 1832; Jeremiah Williams 1833; Johnson Fields, a native Cherokee, 1834, and Marshall Yell 1835. This school ceased with the removal of the Cherokees west of the Mississippi. Little was done towards a school system till 1856 when Benjermon F. Porter was elected county superintendent of education.
