

Bro. Hampton W. Kelly - born ca 1810 in Madison Co., Ala.; baptized Sept 1848 by Bro. R. H. Taliaferro, died 15 June 1865.

Sister blank Shanklin - born 1827 in Madison Co., Ala.; daughter of Bro. Wm. Eastland (who was long a member of this church, since a member of Mt. Zion Church, an off shoot of Enon, died at age 82 years). She married ca 1847 Mr. S. J. Shanklin; died April 1862 of consumption.

Sister Sarah Martin - born 1804 Pittsylvania Co., Va.; married 1820 Bro. Thomas Martin (who was long a member of Enon & who died Jan 1859); she came to North Alabama in 1822; died March 1863.



About the year 1814, when General Jackson's army was making its way north—ward after the battle of New Orleans, it passed through the beautiful Tennessee Valley, crossing the river at Colbert Shoals. There were many among the veterans who had held the city of New Orleans with the strength of an army of giants, impregnable against the fearful onslaughts of the British army, who became enamored of the beauties and promises of the fair South, and went back to their cold northern homes, only to be discharged, and gathering together their effects returned to this country and planted new homes.

With the advent of these new immigrants the Tennessee Valley began to blossom as the rose. New communities were formed, new cities were laid out, new towns were built – and where Jackson's army had found a wilderness to cut its way through, Jackson's disbanded soldiers soon made a prosperous, populous and polished civilization.

It was about this time that the first families settled on the north bank of the [Tennessee] river at the foot of Colbert Shoals, and established the nucleus of what afterwards became one of the most thriving points on the Tennessee River, and still later took the name of Waterloo. Those early settlers, as was afterward proven, were unfortunate in judging that the river's edge was preferable to the plateau bounded by verdant hills a half mile back, for a settlement.

First Settlement

The very first settlers at this point, according to our present historian, were John Webb and Jack Briscoe, who probably landed and decided to make their homes here in 1816. They were, however, soon followed by William and James Witherspoon and Dr. Bumpas, ancestors of many present residents of this section. These men and their families at once established a mercantile business on the river bank, which gradually grew and finally spread out until here was the distributing point of a wide scope of country.

Following close on these came also the two men, Hussey and Limerick, and a little later, James Johnson, who became a hotel keeper and general merchant, and made this point widely known by his aggressive way of doing business.

In 1828 or 1829 came James Humphrey, son of another survivor of the battle of New Orleans – a Kentuckian from Barren County, who had come to this section several years earlier and settled near Huntsville, but in the years named removed to Waterloo. Mr. Humphrey brought with him money and enterprise, and the Landing (as it was then known) gained new prominence. He was not afraid to invest his means, and soon new enterprises began to come prominently forward.

First a wharfboat was established, and for many years through this boat was

transferred more freight than through any other on the Tennessee River. Next, new storehouses, new warehouses and a hotel sprang up; and finally several years later a tanyard came prominently before the public and did a prosperous business in the hands of the Humphrey family.

All this time, James R. Humphrey operated over the shoals of the Tennessee River a line a keel-boats between Waterloo and the landings at Florence and Tuscumbia, which carried annually enormous quantities of precious freight for distribution through all of north Alabama. This keel-boat line originated many years before with a man named Drum, but was developed and made a great success by Mr. Humphrey and his colleagues.

These keel-boats were large boats built after the manner of a steamer's hull, and propelled by means of long poles in the hands of strong men. The industry at that time gave employment to a great number of men whose families were located at the Landing here. These men would walk in a line along the boat's edge with one end of the poles to their shoulders and the other in the water, pushing with all their might, and when they had reached the boat's stern would be turned back in succession by the pilot.

Rev. W. J. Webb, who now lives near Waterloo, has given the names of some of the officers of keel-boats and steamers that plied the Tennessee in those early days. Among others he mentions as pilots and copilots: Tom Payne, Bob Glass, Kim Bledsoe, William P. Johnson, Newt. Moore, --e Ray, James Martin, Sam Milligan, and some years later Capt. P. D. Roddy, whose home was at Chickasaw and who afterward became famous as a Confederate general; Capt. Christian of Tuscumbia, and Capt. John Till, father of our fellow citizens Capt. James and Messrs. John and Cart Till.

Later on, we are told, some of the early settlers, among them Dr. Bumpas, Webb and Briscoe, the Witherspoons, Mr. Chandler (father of Mr. William G. Chandler, now of Gravelly Springs), Dr. Collins and others, moved back from the river and settled among the hills and along the creeks. But the business of the town and most of the people remained at the Landing. Had that business and those people been on the high plateau where Waterloo today stands and overlooks the highest river in the memory of man, this would have been one of the most thriving and populous cities in the South.

GENERAL HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA by James Arthur Thomason

(As published in the 1945 & 1946 issues of The Guntersville Advertiser and Democrat. This series began in Valley Leaves Vol. 4, No. 1, Sept 1969.)

Chapter 75 - "History of Diamond" (August 21, 1946)

John Pearson Smith, the father of S. T. Smith, came from Virginia to Tennessee. He lived at Nashville, when they had the Indian messacre, and later came to Alabama.

He was a contractor and graded the Southern Railroad from Woodville to Gurley. In those days they used a broad axe to hew timbers. There weren't any saw mills.

S. T. Smith operated a horse power gin. He worked farm mules and a yoke of oxen to the sweeps that drove the gin.

The late T. J. Anderson operated a horse power gin at the same time. W. G. and J. E. Ienn operated the gin.

- G. T. Smith bought the first steam engine in this community to run a gin with. It was an Eclipse engine, bought from Moore & Handley, of Birmingham.
- G. T. Smith, Samuel Henry, Jasper Smith and S. T. Smith ran traveling threshers.
- G. T. Smith and Miss Arah Griffin were married at Tuscaloosa in 1864. He was home on a furlough.
- S. T. Smith came to Marshall county from Madison in 1883. He had been conscripted for the Army while teaching school.
- F. T. Smith said, "I preached at Oak Grove (DeKalb County) where my father, S. T. Smith was wounded. They were on the way from Fort Payne to Chickamauga."

 John Henry Foster carried the mail on foot from Diamond to Red Hill.

Others who were postmasters were B. P. and L. P. Johnson and V. H. Copeland. Those that have been merchants at Diamond: J. W. Sinquefield, Joseph Ables, Solomon Ledbetter, Henry Bodine, W. T. Prichett, L. P. Johnson, B. P. Johnson, Jesse Standley, Mack Boling, Copeland and Linn, J. E. Linn and might have been others.

Those that ran blacksmith shops were S. D. Harper, J. W. Riggens and J. W. Noble.

- W. A. Hartsfield and S. D. operated a gris mill and shingle mill by steam power. J. W. Noble and William Smith operated a saw mill and the Hamilton Bros. bought them out and operated the mill.
- W. A. Hartsfield and Jasper Smith ran a steam power traveling thesher. The engine was mounted on wheels. They carried the engine, from place to place. Mr. Hartsfield bought a yoke of oxen from the late J. M. Thomason, named "Mike" and "Charley". They finished up a crop at T. J. Anderson's and started to Charles Bell's to thresh a crop of wheat.

They had up steam and they blew the whistle to let them know they were coming.

They had to pass by the Hartsfield home to go to the Bell farm, and when they got in front of the house, the oxen pulled out and wouldn't go any further.

W. A. Hartsfield moved from this community to Rock Springs on Sand Mountain and ran a gin.

The reader is reminded that Franklin County has had two totally destructive fires and one partially destructive fire, the last fire occurring in 1956. As a result of one of the fires (when the county seat was at Belgreen) only one tract book was saved. A clerk happened to be working on that book at home at the time of the courthouse fire. Therefore, Franklin Co. records are very scarce and TVGS is indebted to Mrs. Evans and the Franklin County Commission for making these marriage records available to us.

Following is an abstract of a form filled out by Samuel B. Kirby, Postmaster of Hillians Store on July 27, 1867 to "enable the Topographer of this (Post Office) Department to determine with as much accuracy as possible the relative positions of Post Offices so that they may be correctly delineated on its maps".

The (P. O. Dept.) name of my office is Hillian's Store. It is situated in the N. E. quarter of Section No. 20, in township 6 south, Range 5, County of Marshall, State of Alabama. This office is 1 mile from the Tennessee River, and 1½ mile from South Sauta Creek on the south side of it. The nearest office on route No. 6660 is Langston (if reestablished), 3½ miles away in a N. E. direction from my office. The nearest office on the other side is Meltonsville, 6 miles in a S.W. direction from this office. The name of the nearest office off the route is Dodsonville, 6 miles in a North direction. Guntersville is 17 miles Southwest direction from this office. Scottsboro is 17½ miles North of this office.

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JACKSON CEMETERY Lawrence County, Alabama

This cemetery was recorded by TVGS member Miss Nadine Shelton of Moulton, Alabama, and contributed by her sister TVGS member Mrs. D. M. Sivley of Hartselle, Alabama. Their grandparents, Andrew Jackson and Lucinda (Milam) Shelton; great-grandparents, Reuben and Jane Henry (Jackson) Shelton; and great-grandparents, Rebecca (Weathers) and James Jefferson Jackson are buried here. There are many unmarked graves.

The cemetery is in the north ½ of section 6, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, located southeast of Fairfield church on county highway 22 east of Moulton. There are seven graves with rock covers with no names. All stones with inscriptions were copied. "Aunt Hattie said that Rebecca Jackson's mother was buried east of Rebecca's grave. That it had been ploughed over."

Book reviews

The J. N. Jennings Family of Tennessee, Kentucky and Arkansas written by Harold R. Blevins. 1974, paper cover, 8 1/2 x 11, mimeographed on bond paper, 28 pages including 14 family group sheets. Available for \$3.00 post paid, from Harold R. Blevins, 514 Jeffrey Drive, N. W., Huntsville, AL 35806.

Mr. Blevins, a TVGS member, has compiled a short family history documenting selected descendants of John Nelson Jennings, born about 1810 in North Carolina. The Jennings family migrated through Tennessee, living in the Marshall County area and settled in Arkansas in the 1860's. Other family names include Troxler, Wammack, Morris, and Stilwell. A rather thoughtful idea, Mr. Blevins has bound in a blank family group sheet for interested purchasers to enter their own data.

The Civil War Comes to Dade County, compiled and edited by Nathaniel Cheairs Hughes, Jr. 1975, soft cover, 8 1/2 x 11, 203 pages. Available for \$10.50 post paid, from N. C. Hughes, Jr., 107 McFarland Ave., Chattanooga, TN 37405.

More than just a Civil War history, Dr. Hughes has published a collection of primary source data for Dade County, Georgia. Located in the extreme northwest corner of Georgia, Dade County is bordered on the west by Alabama and the north by Tennessee. The contents include the 1860 and 1870 Censuses and from the 1880 Census, an enumeration of heads of households. Also included is a compilation of six Confederate Units raised in the County. An excellent name index has been prepared and for the benefit of those with Smith and Jones ancestors, given names are included.

This notebook of information on descendants of Joseph Halbrooks and allied families was published in an effort to get others of this group, now scattered over the nation, to contribute additional information about themselves and their ancestors. Many dates, listings from 1775-1972, and places are given. Bible, cemetery, census, and marriage records are quoted.

Leaves of the Jernigan Tree, by Verna Thomas Jernigan, soft cover, 63 pages, 5x8, mimeograph, includes family index, \$3 from author, Box 366, Manchester, Tenn., 37355.

Much interesting information concerning Elizabeth (1779-1858), Alexander C. Jernigan (1779-1864), and their descendants is presented in compact form. Some lines extend to the present generation. Data on some ancestors and siblings of Alexander and miscellaneous Tenn. Jernigans is included. Footnotes are poorly arranged. The author states she has "records and documents to substantiate" facts presented which "the reader is welcome to see."
