

# Editor's Leaf

Genealogical publications are expensive because only a relatively few copies of any given book are printed. The more copies of a book printed the less each book costs since a great portion of printing expense is the time taken setting up the machinery in preparation of printing. Rising paper cost is another contributing factor in the drastic rise in the price of books in recent months.

Occasionally in the genealogical publications field an enterprising individual with \$\$\$ dancing before his eyes sets up shop and publishes genealogical material at outrageously inflated prices. Sometimes that material is an outright theft of material from a legitimate source. Fortunately, those unscrupulous individuals, or companies, do not stay in business long but their mere existence is harmful to the legitimate individual, society, or company that tries to put out quality material at a reasonable price.

We at Valley Leaves want to save our readers as much money as possible and give value in return for dollars spent. One way we can do this is to inform our readers of publications we do not feel they would be happy with if purchased.

## LET THE BUYER BEWARE

In December, 1969, TVGS published a 100 page, fully indexed, Special Edition of Valley Leaves. This book sells for \$5 per copy. Fifty pages of this Special Edition were devoted to republishing a "Later History of Madison County, And, Incidentally, of North Alabama," a series of newspaper articles from The Huntsville Independent in the 1880's and written by Judge Thomas Jones Taylor. In these articles Judge Taylor referred to "The Early History of Madison County." The "early" series was published in The Alabama Historical Quarterly in 1930 and 1940.

In December, 1976, W. Stanley Hoole and Addie S. Hoole (Confederate Publishing Company of University, Ala.) republished both the "Old" (12 chapters) and "New" (17 chapters) histories in one small volume entitled, "A History of Madison County and Incidentally of North Alabama 1732-1840." This book has 121 pages, NO INDEX, and sells for \$15. per copy. It is a beautifully printed and bound book and would be a nice addition to a casual library, however, if you have any intention of purchasing it please keep in mind that Valley Leaves already published well over half the material in it in their Special Edition which sells for \$5. and is fully indexed.

"The Scott Scanner" is a Scott family quarterly published by Kenneth G. Lindsay of Kenma Publishing, a Division of Enterprise Associates of Evansville, Indiana. Their \$17.95 annual subscription rate promised to cover four 40-page books plus free queries. For that price one would expect the page size to be at least as large as those in Valley Leaves. They are half the size.

Twenty seven pages of the first issue were devoted to Rev. John Scott of Virginia and his descendants—with a promise of more of the same in future issues. Credit for the article is given to Kenneth G. Lindsay as compiler EVEN THOUGH portions of the article were copied verbatim from the work of Rev. Horace Edwin Haden which was first published in 1891. Reverend Haden's work was republished in 1966 in a 745 page book, plus full index, entitled Virginia Genealogies, by the Genealogical Publishing Company of Baltimore and sells for \$15.

At Mr. Lindsay's prices Virginia Genealogies should cost over \$100 and your yearly subscription to Valley Leaves should cost \$53.40.

(Apparently the newspaper later became the Tuscumbia Times.) The 1833 issues were abstracted and contributed to VALLEY LEAVES by Helen Bowling McKnight.

Authority heretofore given to my brother Robert B. Patterson to transact all my business is hereby revoked. Rich'd. B. Patterson. (Dated 1 May 1833)

Page 3, Col. 5 Franklin County Orphans Court - in vacation - 25 April 1833. Curtis Hooks, administrator of William W. Parham, dec'd... applies for settlement of estate. (ad dated 25 April). Michael Dickson, clerk.

Page 3, Col. 6 Monies due for Sale of Property belonging to estate of the late George H. Miller became due the 31st inst. Jonathan Barclay, Asa Messenger, Admr. (dated 30 April)

Page 4, Col. 3 Last Call - to settle estate of P. G. Godley. C. McLaren (dated 16 March 1833) Jesse Godley, administrator

NOTICE: Many individuals have been trespassing on my lands near Tuscumbia... cutting and taking timber, etc... will take legal measures. Wm. Cooper, Jr. (dated 25 Jan 1833)

Page 4, Col. 4 Have established a gin shop in Tuscumbia. G. P. Hanks (dated 23 Feb. 1833)

Page 4, Col. 5 Administrator's Notice. Make payments and file claims against estate of William Crawford, deceased. Franklin Crawford, Admr. (dated 16 Feb. 1833)

Administrator's Notice. Undersigned qualified on 27 Feb. 1833 as administrator of Jane Taylor, dec'd. Present claims within time prescribed by law, being 18 months from said 27 Feb. 1833. N.J. Pride, Admr. (dated 16 March 1833)

STRAYS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

Taken up by Richard B. Patterson 4 miles East of South Florence (a mule) (dated 7 July 1832)

Taken up by Col. Benjamin Reynolds, agent for Chickasaw Nation (a horse). (dated 21 Dec. 1832) teste: M. Dickson, CCC (dated 6 April 1833)

## JACKSON COUNTY PROBATE RECORDS

The earliest probate record in Jackson County is a large red volume entitled, "Will Record K" and begins in 1855. This particular book should be entitled "Probate Records" since, at least in the beginning of the book, there are no wills—only probate proceedings. According to personnel in the Probate office the Jackson County courthouse was burned and many of the records were burned including the early will books.

The first 20 pages of this book are missing. Each entry is not numbered in the original book but I have numbered them here as a convenience to the reader. Abstracted by Dorothy Scott Johnson.

The Judge of Probate in all cases, unless otherwise noted, is John G. Dixon.

1. Page 21. The first page in this book begins: ". . . of July, 1855. Thomas Wilson, Attorney in fact for their guardian Thomas Loyd who resides in Arkansas." This is all that is left of the written record in that case since the first 20 pages are missing.
2. Page 21. Jan. 22, 1857. Annual Settlement for year 1856 in the estate of John Holland, decd., James P. Holland, Administrator. Gross: \$115.62 less \$7.20 to John D. Davis; \$9.30 to J. D. Russell; and \$3.10 judge's fee. Net \$96.02.
3. Page 21. March 18, 1856. Insolvency Claim by Patrick Ragland, administrator of estate of Jefferson Fulcher, deceased. Claims against estate: \$1300. - Credit: \$24. - Balance outstanding: \$1276. Ragland avers that estate is "greatly insolvent" and prays the court to act accordingly.
4. Page 22. March 25, 1856. Margaret Starkey (signed by "X"), admx. of estate of John T. Starkey, deceased. Court ordered admx. to sell certain lands of the estate at public auction which she did on March 26, 1856. Margaret Starkey, admx., purchased the property (not listed) for \$2000. Sworn to and subscribed May 3, 1856.
5. Note: This entry is somewhat confusing in that it begins on Page 22 and is completed on Page 31. It appears that Pages 23 through 30 were tipped into this book and are possibly part of the first pages in the book. I am giving this entry in its entirety.

Page 22. "The undersigned by leave as the Administrator of the estate of Leonard Cardin, Decd., late of said county, to submit for your approval the following report of the sale of the slaves belonging to the estate of the Decendant to wit:

"Eliza & her three children to Johnathan Latham - \$2050.00 and took his notes therefore with E. C. Williams & Thos. Latham, dated 11th March '56 & due 12 months after date,

"Preston the negro man sold at the same time to James Hunter for \$1314.00, and took his note therefor with James F. Graham and Wm. C. Berry dated and due as above stated.

"Jane the Negro Girl to Margarett Cardin onto[?] the same time and place for \$900.00, took her note therefor with Wm. C. Berry and . . ." [Note: rest of sentence missing.]

Page 31. ". . . Joseph Berry . . . above set . . ." Said sale held at residence of the late Leonard Cardin on March 10, 1856. Signed by John Berry, Margaret Berry, and James S. Cardin. The land of the estate sold same day and purchased by James S. Cardin for \$3700. on 12 month credit with two securities and with estate retaining a lein until property paid for. Cardin failed to comply with order of sale and real estate now considered unsold. Heirs asked Probate Court for another time to sell real estate. Signed by John Berry, Margaret Cardin, and James L. Cardin, administrators of Leonard Cardin, deceased. Dated May 8, 1856.

6. Page 23. Note: Pages 23 and 24 are quite battered and yellow and appear to be stuck into this book with Scotch tape. The edges have crumbled away and because of this I have copied it here verbatim with the ellipsis (dots) showing the missing words.

". . . to the same corner or stake, thence . . . River to the further side of the . . . to an Elm & Ash; thence . . . out and . . . the beginning, so as to embrace said two . . . one fourth of fl[?] Section 17 of Township 4, Range . . . one half of said production [?] being entered . . . his [her?] uncle Sublett and the other half by . . . us N. Clark, and transferred by said Clark . . . va Finley and John R. Coffey, this being . . . portion transferred to said Finley containing . . . one hundred and twenty eight acres more or less; and Addison White appearing to be the highest bidder and the best bidder at said sale at the . . . of \$7550.00 . . . and he having made his note for that amount . . .

George H. Harris and William L. Shelton as . . . ties, payable on the 18th day of February 185 . . . on therefore report said sale as the Law . . . Sworn and subscribed to before me . . . day of March, 1856. J. G. Dixon, Judge of Probate." Signed by James Manely.

7. Page 23. In the estate of Thomas J. Russell, deceased, the administrators, J. C. & Miles Russell, sold the real estate at public auction on April 19, 1856 to \_\_\_\_\_ Roulston for \$1800. [Description of sold land not given.]
  8. Page 24. Appraisal and sale of personal estate of Dr. A. Lilly, deceased. The appraisal was done on May 5, 1856. The estate sale was also held in May. Buyers were Robert M. Lilly (medical and miscellaneous books, medicine jars, and one hand saw); Arthur Frazier (2 axes, 3 planes, and 3 augers); M. C. Dwyer (tenant saw and one lot of corn); and John Redman (2 hoes and 3 harrows).
  9. Page 24. July 18, 1856. Appraisal of personal property of Allen Christian, deceased. Property consisted of one gin head, corn, fodder, bee stands, baging, rope, 22 bales of cotton, and salt. Appraised by S. S. Jones and T[?] C. Compt[?].
  10. Page 25. Dec. 15, 1855. Rebecca McMahan Estate, with William McMahan, Administrator. On Dec. 15, 1853[?] the admr. sold, on the premises of Murray Tally, at public auction, the real estate of Rebecca McMahan:

  13. Pages 26 and 27. Sale of personal property of M. Parks, deceased. Purchasers were: T. D. Frazier, (saddle); M. P. Brown (oil cloth); R. C. Parks (a small Bible); James M. Parks (bed and stead); John Oneal (clothes chest); C. L. Lipton (cow, calf and steer); and J. G. Dirks (one fire shovel). John G. Darks, administrator. Sworn to on Nov. 17, 1855.

14. Page 27. Sale of Estate of R. T. Hodges, deceased, by John L. Hodges, administrator. Purchasers:

"Dr. to this amount of money that came into his hands due said wards from the Estate of Daniel Lewallen their guardian father, [net] \$176.49." Expenses in the estate were \$18.68 to Joseph Minor, guardian at law; \$10. judge's fees; \$4.00 to R. C. T. Gill, printer's fees. Certified July 31, 1855.

## SOME 1871 MARRIAGES FROM THE LAUDERDALE TIMES

Some issues of this Florence, Alabama, newspaper from 1871-1888 are available on microfilm at the University of Alabama library at Tuscaloosa. The print is small and difficult to read on the film. In March 1974 and August 1976 Helen Bowling McKnight copied marriages from the 1871 issues and graciously donated them to VALLEY LEAVES. The film is titled "Florence Gazette" which was apparently a later name of the newspaper.

Lauderdale County, Florence, Ala. Feb. 12, 1886. After an illness of several months, Hon. Neander H. Rice, ex-Secretary of State, died at his residence here last Sunday evening aged seventy-six years. He was born in Illinois, but came to Florence more than fifty years ago. He was at one time Mayor of the town, and at his death was an Attorney and Notary Public. He leaves no family, his wife and children having preceded him to the grave several years. His remains were placed beside those of his wife in the Florence Cemetery, and the services conducted at the grave by the Masonic order.

**LOCATION:** On the old Lee Highway approximately 1/4 mile from the center of Rogersville in Lauderdale County, Alabama. The road is paved and the cemetery is on the left of the road. It stands on a hill across Weaver Branch from the site of the Weaver homestead. Go west on the old Lee Highway. It was compiled in November, 1974, and is copied here in its entirety.

This is a very old cemetery and it now has vast spaces where graves have undoubtedly been but time has taken its toll of them. Many stones are eroded and are very, very difficult to read. In parenthesis are the maiden names of those persons who were kin to Mrs. Ayers' father, William Joseph Weaver, Jr. who is buried in Birmingham, Alabama.

### CHAPTER 89

November 27, 1946

"The Berrys and Others Of Red Hill."

James Berry ran a saloon at Red Hill, ran a horse power gin and a ground hog thresher. E. P. K. Berry and Welles Brown ran a blacksmith shop at Red Hill where they built wagons.

R. A. Berry, now 85, lives among his children. He married the first time a Miss Campbell, the second time Miss Hattie Nichols and the last time a Miss Hamilton. He is a son of the late E. P. K. Berry.

Another son, P. M. Berry, lives on the old home-  
stead at the foot of Brindlee mountain in Brown's  
Valley and his daughter, Mrs. Alice Berry Vaughn,  
lives in Big Spring valley.

N. B. Berry, a son of E. P. K. Berry married Miss Martha Maze. Both are dead. They had 10 children: Miss Ethel Berry married J. B. Brookshire; Emma Lou married Houston Stephens; E. H. Berry married Lillian Savannah Thomason; Gordon Berry married Ruby Morton; Rev. S.G. Berry married Miss Opal St. John; Taft Berry married Miss Edna Chandler; Mamie Berry married Frank Bailey. She is dead and a son, Erskine Berry, is married and lives in Texas. A daughter, Ruth Berry, married Conrad St. John a son of W. P. and Mrs. Belle Gilbreath St. John. Another son, Linus, died as a baby.

B. R. Berry's children, Henry, Leroy, Charles and some girls are living.

E. P. Berry's children are F. F., Robert, Yancy, Thomas, and Malcomb.

Mrs. Mary (Sis) Berry NeSmith, a daughter of James Berry, has some children living: Mrs. Genett Maze, Mrs. Johnnie Lumsden, Guntersville 1; William NeSmith, Douglas, Frank NeSmith, Brown's Valley near Ebells church, and Thomas NeSmith on Arab 3. I tried to get their family record from the Bible but failed.

The late Manning Brookshire's parents came from Kentucky in the 30's. He was born on the road. He married three times — Berry, Johnson and Rains.

A. H. Brookshire, a son, married a Bailey and a Lumsden; S. C. Brookshire, a son, married a daughter of James Holly; Mrs. Bettie Brookshire married C. C. Cox; Miss Mattie Brookshire married James Billingsley. She is a widow and lives in Arkansas. She is the last of the family living. A. B. Brookshire, a son, married Miss Maude Dagnell.

### CHAPTER 90

December 4, 1946

"N. L. Kennamer, Swearengin Merchant."

(The following is from the Kennamer family bulletin by Willard C. Kennamer of New York).

Nelson Lafayette Kennamer, son of David and Kitty Lewis Hodges Kennamer and great-great grandson of Harris and Rachel Kennamer, was born in Kennamer Cove Dec. 29, 1859.

He was married in 1880 to Mildred Drake Jones, born 1864, died 1891, daughter of Rufus H. and Mary Ann Wilson Jones. Children: Lettie Irene, Eliza Myrtle and Annie Mable.

He was married in 1893 to Mary Shirley Woodall, born 1870, died 1923, daughter of Albert and Rebecca Kennamer Woodall. Children: Alma Farris, Veda Bertie, Roy Clifford, Treva Trixie, and Albert Nelson.

He lived near his father in Kennamer's Cove a short time, then built a house about a mile south of Woodville, residing there until 1897 when he moved to Swearengin on Gunter Mountain.

After clerking in the store of his father and Jacob L. Kennamer in Woodville he ran a general dry goods business at Swearengin several years previous to 1935. His farming interests were extensive. He has been an active member in the Church of Christ since 1884. He is a leader in his community and active in its affairs. He takes special interest in the Kennamer Family Association and attended all of the eighteen annual reunions.

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### CHAPTER 91

December 11, 1946

"Experiences Of A Young Preacher."

The first appointment I had after I was licensed by the Methodist church to exhort was at Hill's school house. There was a large crowd at my first service (a lot of folks came out of curiously) and it excited me somewhat but that burden was removed. My subject was "Watch."

In 1901-03 I had appointments at Warrenton, Diamond, Brashier's Chapel, Mt. Olivet and Rice. Mt. Olivet was near the farm of Thomas A. Street, probate judge, and he came to church. He listened attentively and tears ran down his cheeks. How small I felt trying to preach before him! But I studied it over. He was just a man. I spent some happy hours at his home. I supplied Pine mountain

circuit as a pastor in 1905.

That year at the district conference I stood an examination on a course of study for admission on trial. I had to go by transfer boat and train from Guntersville to Athens. The hotel there was full and we had to sit up all night. The next day I was so sleepy I could hardly hold my eyes open. The two committees I had to go before laughed at me for having my eyes half closed but I got by the examination somehow and was admitted on trial. I was read out for the New Hope circuit.

When I started there a big rain came up and I turned off and went to the top of Georgia Mountain to spend the night with Uncle Jim Cooley Sr. and Aunt Sallie and an orphan girl, Mattie, that they had reared. They lived where Mr. and Mrs. T. P. Eubanks live now. I was crippled in my leg and could hardly walk and Uncle Jim rubbed my leg with liniment before I went to bed. It burned like pepper but next morning I could walk all right.

The first couple married was George Hill and Miss Emma Lemley. When I started on the ceremony my voice was pretty high but it lowered before I got through. My second couple was at church in Cloud's Cove (Madison County) - Thomas East and Mrs. Lizzie Powers. I forgot to have them join right hands.

In 1906 I assisted Rev. J. J. Sandlin, pastor of Paint Rock Circuit, at Mt. Shade on Gunter mountain. Kirklands, Whitakers, Laws, and others lived in this community. J. L. Wiles, now Dr. Wiles, was the school teacher.

Bro. Sandlin and I went home with a young lady named Law for dinner at Claysville. Miss Law rode with me. Bro. Sandlin said: "You are all right, you have the Law on your side."

At the close of the meeting we started to New Hope through Kennamer Cove, at Butler's mill the Paint Rock river was over the bridge. Bro. Sandlin rode the pony and I crossed in a boat. He looked funny riding the pony and her pulling the buggy.

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## CHAPTER 92

December 18, 1946

"He Sang, And Got Out Of The Army"

Years ago there was a postoffice at Manchester, between Georgia mountain and the Tennessee river, at a location that is now mostly covered by the lake. John Zastrow, a German, was the post master. It was near "Ft. Deposit," as the Yankees called it.

G. B. Seibold was postmaster at Guntersville, when this office was discontinued. The office was supplied from Guntersville.

Mr. Zastrow married the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. T. P. (Parks) Fielding, Miss Mattie Fielding. He died in 1901. Rev. W. M. Yarbrough conducted the service.

Col. C. C. NeSmith attended to the telephone at Manchester. James Watkins Fennell, M.D., D.D., lived in this community. He came from Winchester county, Va. He was the father of C. G. Fennell, editor of the Guntersville Democrat.

W. G. Jordan of Guntersville, married into the

Fennell family and owned the Dr. J. W. Fennell place till the TVA bought it.

This was given by the late C. G. Fennell:

"The Wedgeworth family lived at Beard's Bluff. Once when Bill and Joe Wedgeworth were at home on furlough they were down on the Tennessee river fishing. Their furlough papers were at the house in their coat pockets. The Yankees captured them and wouldn't let them go to the house and get their furloughs and carried them north and put them in prison."

Dad Deloach lived on the Jordan place.

R. C. (Uncle Richard) Bolton, who lived in this community, had come with his mother and step-father to America from England when he was 14. He married Miss Vina McMinn. He canvassed Marshall county on a pony for public office.

I visited the home in the 90's and got Uncle Richard to sing a song called "Blue Tail Fly." He was comical. He would sing and wave his knife open. You would think he was going to cut you. He sang the song in the Civil War and they freed him from the army.

When the Bolton family came to Marshall county they were coming through the Tennessee river bottoms where there were a lot of pumpkins. They thought they were muskmelons and ate a lot of them and had the colic.

About 1901 Rev. E. L. Roy held a meeting at Mt. Olivet. Misses Mary and Julia Street came to church at night; had a lot of rich pine split up fine and they lighted the pieces of pine to give us light. Rev. Roy and the writer accompanied the Street sisters home and spent the night.

Beginning in this issue Valley Leaves will carry, in abstracted form, the deeds and other instruments recorded in Deed Book "A" in the Morgan County, Alabama, court house. Abstracted by Dorothy Scott Johnson.

- Page 1-3 July 15, 1820. Thomas D. Crabb, 1st part; Alexander Bateler, 2nd part; James B. Graham, 3rd part all of Cataco County, Alabama. Crabb owes Bateler \$5000 of which \$2000 is due on 7-9-1821, \$2000 due 7-9-1822, and \$1000 due 7-9-1823. To secure Bateler against loss Crabb conveys to Graham, as trustee, personal property as security. The personal property consists of 5 Negroes, horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, household and kitchen furniture (itemized), & "the whole of Crabb's library consisting of 62 volumes." If Crabb fails to pay indebtedness then Graham to sell property at private or public sale. If debt is paid then this Deed of Trust is void.
- Page 4-6 Deed of Trust. March 5, 1821. Thomas Sharp, 1st part; John Sharp, 2nd part; Thomas Hodges, 3rd part, all of Cataco County, Ala. Thomas Sharp owes John Sharp \$155 and to secure said debt Thomas deeds to Thomas Hodges, as trustee, his personal property consisting of livestock, plantation tools, and all his household and kitchen furniture (itemized.) If Thomas Sharp fails to pay debt then Thomas Hodges, at John Sharp's request, to sell property. If debt paid then this deed void.
- Page 6-7 Deed of Trust. March 12, 1821. Saml. M[?] Echols (debtor) of 1st part; Middleton Faid[?] (trustee) of 2nd part; and Iasiah Minter (creditor) of 3rd part. Samuel M. Echols owes Iasiah Minter \$150 which is due 3-15-1822. As security he puts up a bond, given by Russell Maichbanks in favor of Echols and dated 3-12-1821. to make title to 50 acres of land (West part of SW/4 Sec. 34-6-2W). Echols uses land to secure debt. If debt not paid then land to be sold to pay debt, but if debt paid this deed is void. Received and recorded 6-5-1821.
- Page 7-8 Proof of Freedom. At a quarterly court held for Cumberland Co., Va. on May 23, 1814, Sally Johnson, daughter of Phillis Johnson, about 18 yrs. of age, common size, having produced to the court satisfactory proof of her claim to freedom, she having regularly served twice with Catharine Matthew, formerly Catharine Angled; she is therefore entitled to all that free Negroes and Mulattoes are by law entitled. November 9, 1822. Signed by Miller Woodson, Clerk.
- Page 8 Power of Attorney. August 28, 1820. Franklin County, Tenn. Frank James of Franklin Co., Tenn. appoints Greenville Bennett of Cataco Co., Ala., his attorney in fact to transfer and sell land belonging to James in Cataco County, Ala. Ack. by E. Russell, clerk of Franklin County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions. Certified by Samuel Hanley, Presiding Justice.
- Page 9-11 Last Will and Testament of Samuel Liles of Cataco Co., Ala. Dated: June 23, 1821. Probated: Sept. 18, 1821.  
To son Peyton five Negroes (including one old Negro man, Jim, to be maintained.)  
  
"I do also give unto my Son Peyton H. Liles the whole and entire management of my estate until Thomas Liles becomes of lawful age or sooner if Peyton H. Liles should think proper, and to have all the proceeds after paying all my just debts, to manage as if it was his own; William Liles and Thomas Liles to be supported out of it."  
  
To daughter Mary High, wife of Robert High, one featherbed and furniture and sundry articles and one horse and saddle.  
  
To Discan Stanback,\*five Negroes, in trust for Mary High "during her natural life, and after her decease to give in fee simple to the heirs of her body; but it shall be the duty of my trustee to permit the Negroes to remain in possession of my daughter and her husband, Robert High,

\*Could be "Dixon" Stanback; the writing is difficult to interpret.

unless he thinks it will be advantageous to my Daughter, and her children, by taking them and hiring them out."

To son William, he lends five Negroes during his lifetime and if he should die "before he has any lawful heirs of his body, I want all the property that I have loaned him and all he would heir from my estate, to be equally divided between my two sons Peyton H. Lyles and Thomas Lyles."

To son Thomas, five Negroes.

Balance of estate (household and kitchen furniture and stock of all kinds) to be divided equally between Peyton, William, and Thomas or those of them that survive.

Named son Peyton H. Lyles, and Joseph Sykes, executors.  
Witness: Joseph Sykes, William Elliott, and William L. Wallace.

Page 12. May 1, 1821. Indenture of Bargain and Sale. John Patterson sold to Thomas Jinckings for \$320, 160 acres in the Illinois Territory in the Military tract laid off by an Act of Congress, the land being the NW/4 of Sec. 29-2N-5W. Acknowledged before Robert Tapscott, J.C.C. Received for recording Sept. 18, 1821, Thos. McElderry, Clerk.

Page 13-15. September 26, 1821. Deed of Trust. On Feb. 15, 1821 Jonas Oakes became indebted, by a note, to Wilson Oakes (both of Morgan Co., Ala.) in the amount of \$400 which note was due on March 1, 1821. To secure debt, Jonas conveys to Wilson Oakes, and Jacob Webb (as trustee - also of Morgan Co.) the following personal property (itemized): Livestock, plantation tools and household furniture. If debt not paid by Dec. 25, 1821 then Jacob Webb to sell property and pay debt. If debt is paid by then, then this deed void. Signed by Jonas Oakes (by his mark), Wilson Oakes, and Jacob Webb. Acknowledged 9-26-1821 and received for recording 10-2-1821.

Page 15-16 Will of Sarah Black of Morgan Co., Ala. Dated: Sept. 21, 1821. Probated Oct. 2, 1821. Being weak in body but perfect in mind and memory she wills that her debts be paid out of her estate and that she be interred in a decent manner according to the discretion of her executor. 1st - gives to my eldest son, Alexander Black, one penny. 2nd - gives to my dau., Margaret McCrary, one penny. 3rd - gives to my dau., Jane Peebles, one penny. 4th - gives to my son, George Black, one penny. 5th - gives to my son, William Black, one penny. 6th - gives to my dau., Rachel Barnes, one penny. 7th - gives to my son, Robert Black, one penny. 8th - gives to my grandson, William Patton, two sheep. 9th - gives granddaughter, Sarah Patton, one bed and furniture. 10th - gives grandson, Andrew Patton, two sheep. 11th - gives daughter, Nancy Patton, one mulatto Negro girl and all and singular my real and personal estate. ROBERTS CEMETERY

This cemetery was surveyed in the fall of 1975 and contributed by Mrs. Preston Payne, 1011 Dripping Springs Road, NW, Cullman, Alabama 35055. This is apparently the site of the W. C. Roberts family cemetery, however, it must have been used by other members of the community since there are approximately 20 more unmarked graves here. This cemetery is not cared for and the stones are gradually being destroyed. It is located in the Neel Community three miles west of Hartselle in the "V" created by Iron Man Road and the Danville to Decatur roads intersecting. Is in the approximate center of the W/2 of Sec. 3-6-5W. Located on the Alvin C. Childress farm.

# Book Reviews



McALPIN NEWSLETTER, by Doris McAlpin Russell, Editor and Compiler (8600 Hickory Hill Lane, SE, Huntsville, Alabama 35802) Published tri-annually by Mrs. Russell. A maximum of eight 8-1/2 x 11 pages each issue - \$2. per year.

The first issue of this newsletter consists of five pages chock-full of family information plus one family group photograph reproduced clearly with individuals easily recognizable. These descendants of Alpin, King of Scotland c. 787, are fortunate to have a dynamic and professional researcher to lay the groundwork for research on this family in America. Mrs. Russell gives information on family reunions, recites family legends, and gives proven lines of descent. This newsletter is bound to be one of the bargains of the year for those researching the McAlpin family tree.

LAMAR FAMILY, by Nathaniel D. Lamar, 8-1/2 x 11, Xerox, 38 pages (printed one side only), soft cover, spiral binding. Copies may be purchased from author: Route 2, Rogersville, Ala., 35652, for cost of reproduction (currently \$4.) Not indexed and no Table of Contents.

This beautifully typed and laid out book includes the ca. 1660 coat of arms of Thomas Lamar and a map of Medieval France showing the Lamar ancestors' homeland in Anjou (now France.)

Mr. Lamar has not only compiled a genealogical record of his family but has included some interesting historical revelations of Colonial America. This book is well written and well documented. One chapter each is devoted to the Lamars of Maryland, Georgia, Kentucky, and Alabama. There are several ancestor charts that clearly show lines of descent. A lamentable fact is that this excellent work is not indexed nor is there a Table of Contents.


