Some issues of a Florence, Alabama, newspaper titled "Florence Gazette, 1871-1888" are available on microfilm at the University of Alabama library in Tuscaloosa. The print is small and difficult to read on the film. In March, 1974, and August, 1976, Helen Bowling McKnight of Huntsville copied Deaths from the 1871 issues at the library at the University. Apparently the newspaper later became the Florence Gazette but this particular issue is The Lauderdale Times. Contributed by Mrs. McKnight.

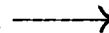

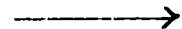

C. Houston and Thomas McElderry). Wilson to have possession of property until default. If payment not made upon Casner's demand, then Houston to sell property and pay Casner. Book Reviews



FROM ACROSS THE RIVER by Mrs. Marjorie S. Kent of Athens, Ala., and Mrs. Cornell Allred of Bellflower, California. 8-1/2 x 11, mimeographed, soft cover, 205 pages plus 24 pages of full index. \$10.35. May be ordered from Mrs. Kent at 604 First Street, Athens, Alabama 35611.

This book is a record of the Legg, Coffman, Shelton, and related families. Related families include Adams, Adkins, Easter, Haney, Sims, Peterson, Smith, McKinney, Summers, Arledge, Tindall, Spencer, and Meals. The Legg and Coffman families in America are traced back to the mid-18th century and the Shelton family to the early 19th century.

The authors are careful to state only facts and do not embellish or guess. After each chapter they give the sources for the information contained in that chapter. Even though many family histories are traced back much further than is done in this book, I feel this is one of the better histories I've seen. It not only gives genealogies but also incorporates family documents into the book. For instance, John Legg's personal property inventory is listed as found in Jefferson Co., Tenn. The authors also abstracted old newspapers (1872-1924) and include articles mentioning any of the above families. For anyone researching these Limestone County based families this book is a must.

FRONTIER CLAIMS IN THE LOWER SOUTH, Compiled by Richard S. Lackey with an introduction by John D. W. Guice, 1977, 6x8, 72 pages, soft cover, indexed. May be purchased from Polyanthos Inc., P. O. Drawer 51359, New Orleans, La. 70151. \$12.50

This book contains a compilation of claims against the U. S. Government for losses of property by residents of Clarke, Baldwin, Mobile, Washington, and Monroe counties in the Mississippi Territory during the Creek Indian War of 1813 and 1814. These claims were filed in 1815 and the originals are in the House of Representative Records at the National Archives. As far as can be determined these records have previously been unpublished. In addition to the claims, Mr. Lackey has included a number of letters to and from Judge Harry Toulmin which serve to justify these claims.

This book is a good reference source for genealogical and historical data on the early settlers in southwest Alabama. The information given sheds new light on the lifestyle of these early frontiersmen.

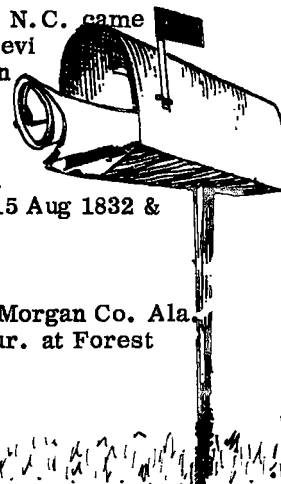
