

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

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# Editor's Leaf



Concluding Volume 15 has been a struggle. Indexing makes this last issue especially difficult. Contributors are named in each issue and without them, we would have a difficult time. We appreciate all material sent to us for publication. It is hard to explain how one item is used for publication rather than another. Many factors influence the selection of material for Valley Leaves. Material which is READY for publication will usually be used before that which requires a great deal of work. The amount of SPACE AVAILABLE for each county and in the entire magazine has some influence. The amount of MATERIAL AVAILABLE has much to do with use of submitted articles. If you submit something from a county on which we have little, we may use it right away, if it fits space available, or save it, using everything from that county sparingly. The TIME PERIOD covered by the material has influence, depending on whether or not other items are available. The ACCURACY of the material which you submit will have more to do with use than any other factor, for if we have reason to feel that it is not accurate we will wait until it can be checked. This delay can be indefinite, for in the case of the present editor, out-of-town courthouses are virtually inaccessible since full time employment restricts trips for this purpose and the time available for checking. The SUBJECT covered has influence, since we try to submit a well-rounded magazine. Sometimes the difficulty of how to present the material may be a problem. Oftentimes material relating to one person or one family is submitted with the obvious intention of trying to contact people interested in the same name. Unless there is a LESSON learned or HELP provided as an example, this type of material belongs in the query section. Occasionally, an article will be used because there is nothing else available, and every rule stated above will be broken. This is where the editorial selection occurs. Sometimes, even being editor doesn't get the magazine just like you would like to have it! And sometimes we have so much "good stuff" we don't know what to use first!

Indexers Vonda Dihm, Margaret Cowart, Dot Johnson and Roy Cochran joined me in preparing the index for this volume. You will find that we have tried to keep the length of the index within reason, not being as thorough as we would have liked. For instance, within the section on each county you will not find the county or the county seat indexed. We did not index the residences of contributors, although we did index their names. Please forgive us for not preparing the June issue as fast as previously. We hope that a full name index is worth the delay!

# North Alabama

## NORTH ALABAMA STATE MILITIA OFFICERS 1820

This is the second and concluding part of the presentation of militia officers in 1820 as contributed by Mrs. Richard H. Gilliam, Jr., Huntsville, Alabama. The information is taken from Military Register, State Militia, Vol. I, 1820, a book in the Military Room of the Alabama Archives, Montgomery, Alabama. The 1820 commissioned officers for all of the Alabama counties in existence at this time are in this register; however, only the North Alabama counties of Blount, Lauderdale, Cataco (Morgan), Madison, Lawrence, Limestone, Jackson and Franklin were copied for Valley Leaves. The first part was published in Volume 15, Number 3, March 1981.

AN EARLY MADISON COUNTY SCHOOLArticles of Agreement

The following "Articles of Agreement" was found in the estate file of Christian A. Johnson [No. 150] located in the Records Room in the basement of the Madison County Courthouse. Because of its historical significance we have chosen to copy it verbatim. Copied and contributed by Dorothy Scott Johnson [no relation to Christian A. Johnson.]

"Articles of agreement entered into this twenty sixth day of December, one thousand, eight hundred, and thirty one Between W. Graves Bouldin, of Madison County, of the one part; and the undersigned subscribers of the Counties of Madison & Limestone, of the other part—all of the State of Alabama.

"Witnesseth that the said W. Graves Bouldin, doth hereby covenant & agree to teach a School at the present residence of said Bouldin, in a House to be built by the said Bouldin & said subscribers & to commence on or before the first monday in February next for the term of ten months—and the said Bouldin, doth by these presents bind himself to attend strictly to said School, with assiduity and sobriety & teach five days in each week (Saturdays, & Sundays, & the ordinary holy-days excepted) and promises to teach spelling, Reading, writing & Arithmetic, to the best of his skill and ability, and in consideration of the above mentioned services, the undersigned subscribers promise to pay said Bouldin, at the expiration of said School, the sum of ten dollars pr scholar subscribed individually by us.

"And for the regulation and management of said School, the subscribers are at liberty to choose one Trustee, the scholars over fourteen years old a second & the said Bouldin, a third, whose duty it shall be, as often as they, or a majority of whom may think it expedient, to inspect and examine into the affairrs & management of said School, and see that the same be conducted as institutions of learning should be.

"In testimony whereof the parties have hereunto set their names and annexed the number of Scholars subscribed by each—the day & year first written."

Page two consists of the names of the subscribers and the number of children enrolled. You will note that some of the subscribers had 1-1/2 children in school; this probably meant one child full time and one child half days. This list is copied verbatim.

That he with the other members of said Company enlisted to serve for and during the war - & left Huntsville about the first of November A.D. 1835 for Texas. That he went to & arrived in Texas Dec 1st, '35 & was fully mustered into the service of Texas on the 25th day of December A.D. 1835 at Washington on the Brazos & continued in said service & performed all his duties as a soldier until about the first of March A.D. 1836 when being in bad health and confined to his bed he was furloughed by recommendation of the Surgeon Dr. William Mottley as being a confirmed invalid at Refugio Mission Texas. That he returned to Alabama & by reason of his ill health was never enabled to re-enter said service. That he has never received any pay, lands or other consideration for his services in the Armies of Texas and thinks that he is justly entitled to same.
