
Map of Revolutionary War Patriots buried in Madison County, Alabama (1976). \$1.00

BESSIE KING RUSSELL, TVGS charter member, introduced many of us to Huntsville history and to the history of our families. The Bessie K. Russell Branch Library was named in her honor. Mrs. Russell, teacher and librarian, died December 10, 1981 at the age of 86 in Sacramento, California, at the home of her son. She was buried in Maple Hill Cemetery in Huntsville. Bless you, Miss Bessie, for what you have meant to all of us.

MILO B. HOWARD, JR., Director of the Alabama Department of Archives and History, and a native of Montgomery, died November 3, 1981. Mr. Howard was the speaker at the first TVGS workshop shortly after he became Director in January 1967. We all mourn the tragedy of his death at 48.

MICROFILM FOR THE HUNTSVILLE HERITAGE ROOM becomes more important to us as Federal lending ceases. TVGS is contributing the 1900 U.S. Census Soundex for Alabama to the Heritage Room and encourages individual contributions whenever possible.

CONSTITUTION HALL PARK. Grady Kennedy, TVGS representative to the Alabama Historical Commission, reminds us that Constitution Hall Park in Huntsville will open in late Spring of this year. This historic complex features reconstruction of the building at the site of the first State Constitutional Convention in 1819. The Director/Curator of the Park, Daniel J. Hoisington, is interested in locating descendants of the signers of Alabama's first Constitution. Sounds like old times, doesn't it? DECATUR COUNTY

The exact location of the Decatur/Jackson County line remains elusive but it was in trying to locate it that negative photostats of the township plats of the Decatur County area were ordered. The public surveys of this land were conducted in 1822 and 1823 but annotations as late as 1888 are included. Located and secured by Catherine Gilliam, this information was transcribed by Dorothy S. 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

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

- 4. My father Roland Gooch son of James Gooch born April 22, 1778 died August 29, 1850, aged 72 years, 4 months, 7 days. Blessed are they that die in the name of the Lord.
- 5. Susan C. Gooch born June 23, 1833 died July 3, 1912. The Gates of Heaven For Her Shall Open Wide.
- 6. N.M. Gooch born February 2, 1822 died December 20, 1901.

1907 CONFEDERATE CENSUS: LIMESTONE, MORGAN & MADISON COUNTIES, ALABAMA, by Dorothy Scott Johnson. 1981. Published by Johnson Historical Publications, 2409 Gaboury Lane, Huntsville, AL 35811. 8½ x 11", soft cover, 67 pages, including index. Price: \$8.00 plus \$1.00 for postage and handling.

Mrs. Johnson, one of North Alabama's most prominent genealogical and historical researchers, has given us another very useful publication, the transcription of the 1907 Confederate Census for Limestone, Morgan and Madison Counties. Along with names and places of residence, general information includes birth dates and places as well as information about Service records. Also, Mrs. Johnson has thoughtfully included a copy of the 1907 Act which called for the enumeration of the Confederate Soldiers then residing in Alabama.

ALABAMA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MAGAZINE, Volume 14, Numbers 1-4, 1980. Dues of S12 annually includes 4 issues of the Magazine and free queries to Mr. Bobby Walker, Treasurer, 728 37th Place North, Birmingham, AL 35222. 8½ x 11", 80 pgs.

This volume contains abstracts from state newspapers; the 1830 Perry County census; Abstracts of Selected Acts, Alabama Legislature, 1851-1852; Abstracts of Shelby County Will Book B, 1818-1841; Alabama Divorces Approved by State Legislature, 1818-1868. We found the Abstracts of Acts of Alabama to be very accurate but were disappointed in the Divorces which were not.

TROUP COUNTY, GEORGIA AND HER PEOPLE, Introductory Issue, Oct 1981, published quarterly by Family Tree Publications, 125 Vernon St, LaGrange, GA 30240. 8½ x 11", \$16.00. Indexed.

This first issue contains early history of Troup County; Troup County Marriages, Book A, 1828-1837; Will Book 1, 1832-1848; Deed Record A; information on early Troup County residents and queries. Future issues planned will include Census records, Family Bible records and pictures. Commercial advertising is included. Certainly people with Troup Co. connections will want to subscribe.

FAMILY LINKS - PAST AND PRESENT, Volume 1, Number 1, January 1981. Published three times a year in January, May and September by the Irish Genealogical Association. Initial membership fee, \$50.00 U.S., renewals \$25.00 U.S. 8" x 12".

This new journal with slick paper and colored pictures is an ambitious undertaking with an aim "to encourage and assist those members who wish to visit Ireland to trace their family history and to provide a personalised research service for those unable to do it themselves." This first issue contains an introduction to Irish genealogical research and an in-depth article on the Upper Ards Peninsula, County Down and its people. Additional information about tourism in Northern Ireland is included.

A STUDY OF METCALFS (ANDREWS & SMITH) by Clayton G. Metcalf. 1979. 408 North Rawls St., Enterprise, AL 36330. 6 x 9", hard cover, 647 pages including index. Price: \$20.00.

Mr. Metcalf has attempted in this one volume to bring together a great deal of information and material on Metcalf families - including all spellings. The author has not attempted to tie all families together. His own paternal line is covered quite extensively with anecdotes and pictures. Mr. Metcalf has included a lot of personal information which makes for a very readable family history.

SCRIPSIT by Virginia Hooper Barton. 1979. 8½ x 11", soft cover, 147 pages including index. No price given. Published by Thompson Printing Co., Albertville, AL, P.O. Box 550, Albertville, AL 35950.

This limited edition is a bibliography about people of Marshall County, Alabama. Books, magazines, periodicals and trade publications were covered but to be listed, an author must have been born, or lived at some time, in Marshall County. Mrs. Barton has provided not only a bibliography but also has many interesting tidbits about the authors covered.
