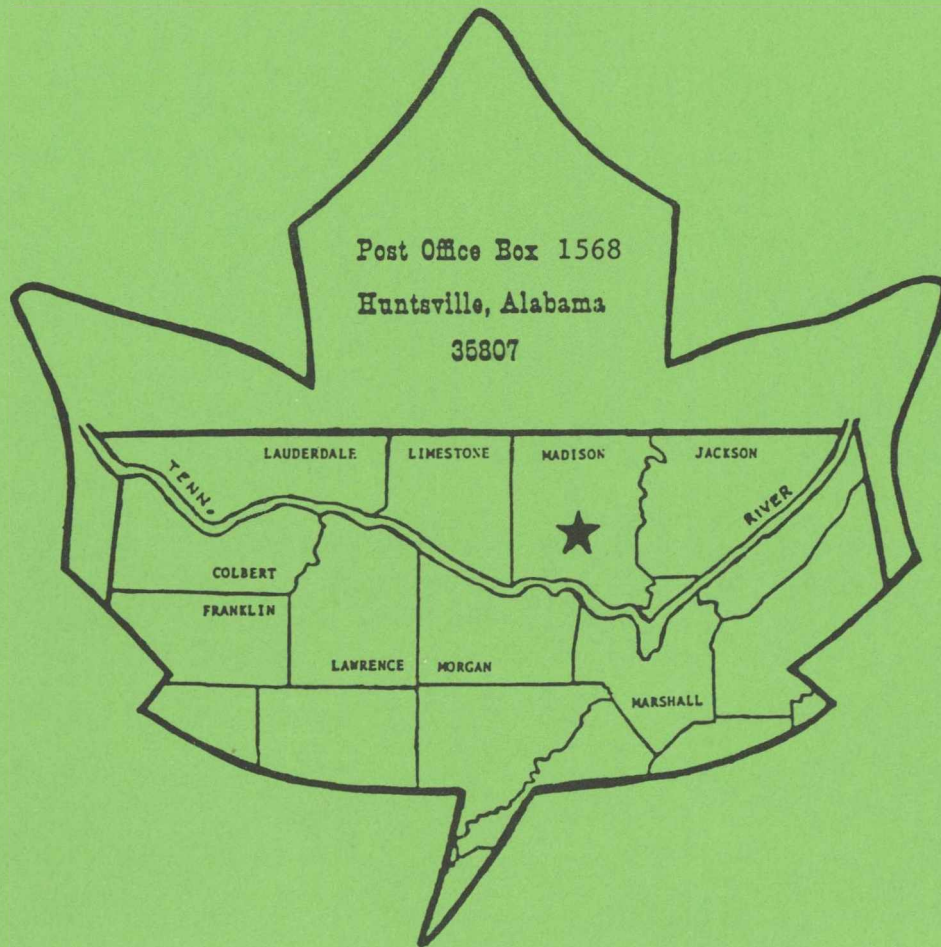

Note the words "happy" and "joy." Those two words have exemplified the work of our members for almost 26 years as we pulled together to achieve the purpose of the Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society. Let me recount some of our deeds:

° Have raised the standard of genealogical research by conducting educational programs presented by nationally- and internationally-known genealogists;

° Have provided assistance to the Huntsville-Madison County Public Library Heritage Room by contributing publications and microfilm finding aids for family research. Recently, the Director of the Heritage Room spoke at a meeting of the society, at which time she said that a "ball-park figure" of the society's contributions throughout these years total \$100,000;

° Have promoted the collection and preservation of the early records of the Tennessee Valley and Alabama by publishing early records from nine counties in North Alabama;

° Have "performed other things" [words from our bylaws] to carry out the purposes. Members have volunteered regularly in the Heritage Room; they have assisted in presenting educational lectures; they have extracted and printed privately the obituaries from a 1983-1984 local newspaper [names of deceased and survivors totaling 6,000] of those persons who were born before recording of vital statistics was required in Alabama; they have indexed and privately printed the early marriages of Lawrence County, Alabama, as published but not indexed in 1962, such indexing totaling over 11,000 names;

° Are presently working in the recently-acquired records from the Law Library to make these early Madison County records easily available for research on the third floor of the library;

° And many other efforts too numerous to list in allowed space.

Such deeds do not go unrecognized by fellow genealogists and the interested public who come to the Heritage Room to undertake and pursue their family research. We take pride in what has been achieved and look forward to the years ahead as we encourage other generations to take up the banner. As a charter member, I say, "Thank you, TVGS members."

Golden, Pvt. James T. Enlisted 1 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Green, John A.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Jackson Co., Al: John A. Green, born Dec. 25, 1884 in Larkinsville. Entered service as a private in fall of 1862 at New Market in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry. "Captured in 1864. Took oath in 1865. Served two years. Was a resident of Princeton, Ala. in 1907.

Grizzle, Pvt. M. D. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. "Died of disease Mar. 19, 1863."

Gullatt, Pvt. J. C. Enlisted 20 May 1862 at New Market. Captured at Cumberland Mountain, Tenn., 11 Oct. 1863. Sent from Camp Morton, Ind. to City Point, Va. for exchange 4 March 1865.

Gullatt, James Preston

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Jackson Co: James Preston Gullatt, born Dec. 25, 1844, in Bellefonte, Ala. Entered service as a private in March 1861 [!] at Bellefonte, Ala. in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry. "Was taken prisoner a few days after Battle of Chickamauga and sent to Camp Morton Prison Indiana. Was exchanged at Richmond, Va. April 1, 1865." In 1907 he was a resident of Hollywood, Ala.

Haynes, Pvt. John R. Enlisted 20 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. Captured at Fort Donelson 4 Feb. 1862; sent to City Point, Va. for exchange 11 Feb. 1863. Admitted to General Hospital, Richmond, Va. 22 Feb. 1863. Released from hospital 27 Feb. 1863. Captured at Lafayette, Ga. 15 Sept. 1863. Released on oath at Nashville ca. Oct. 1863.

Haynes, Pvt. Stephen O. Enlisted 20 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. Captured in Jackson Co., Ala., 21 Aug. 1863. ("Taken at his home. Tried to avoid capture."). Sent to Camp Chase, Ohio. Transferred to Rock Island, Ill. 2 March 1865.

Hereford, Pvt. Robert Strong.

Tennessee Confederate Veteran Questionnaire, 1922: Robert Strong Hereford was born 19 July 1847 near Meridianville, Ala. Enlisted at Warrington, Marshall Co., Ala. in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry. Served through April, 1865.

Hewlett, Pvt. Thomas. Enlisted 1 Dec. 1862 at New Market. Surrendered at Citronelle, Ala. 4 May 1865 with Co. B; paroled at Gainesville, Ala. 14 May 1865. (A Huntsville resident.)

Higginbotham, Pvt. R. M. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Captured at Knoxville, Tenn. on 18 Dec. 1863. Sent from Rock Island to City Point, Va. for exchange 24 March 1865.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Jackson Co, Al: Morgan Higginbotham, born in 1836 at Bellefonte, Ala. Entered service in 1862 in Jackson Co. in Co. C, 4th Ala. Cavalry. Continued until close of war. Was "taken prisoner and exchanged." Was a resident of Carnes, Ala. in 1907.

Hill, Pvt. G. W. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market. Roll of Feb-April 1863 notes "Prisoner of war. (Ret'd to command.)" Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Hopkins, Pvt. T. B. Enlisted 20 Nov. 1862 at Laverne, Tenn. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Houston, Pvt. A. T. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Houston, Pvt. H. J. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Houston, Pvt. W. P. Enlisted 20 May 1862 at New Market. Captured at Maysville, Ala. 29 Aug. 1863. Transferred from Rock Island, Ill. for exchange 2 March 1865.

Jordan, Pvt. Fleming. Captured on Sand Mountain 2 Jan. 1862. Released on oath at Camp Chase, Ohio 13 June 1865. (Resident of Madison Co., Ala., complexion fair, hair black, eyes gray, 5' 8", age 27).

Jordan, Pvt. William. On roll for Oct-Dec. 1863. No further information. [Note: A Private William Jordan enlisted 17 Sept. 1862 in Co. A at Montgomery, Ala. and served through the war. He was paroled at Montgomery, Ala. 30 May 1865.]

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co: William Moore Jordan, born April 26, 1846 in Madison Co., Ala. Entered service in Sept., 1863 in north Georgia in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry and continued until the surrender. 1907 resident of Maysville in Madison Co., Al.

Keck, Pvt. G. P. Enlisted 16 Aug. 1862 at New Market. No further information. [Note: This is probably a misreading of T. R. Mock.]

Kelley, Sgt. T. L. P. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Killed in action at Lexington, Tenn. on 18 Dec. 1863.

Kelly, Pvt. F. J. Enlisted 5 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co: Fleming Jordan Kelly, born Nov. 25, 1844 in Madison Co., Ala. entered service in Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry and continued until the surrender in May 1865. Resided at Ryland in 1907.

Maples, Pvt. W. J. Enlisted 16 Aug. 1862 at New Market. Transferred to former command March 18, 1863.

Mason, Pvt. James M. Enlisted 20 June 1862 at New Market. Surrendered at Citronelle, Alabama 4 May 1865 with Co. B. Paroled at Gainesville, Ala. 14 May 1865 (resided at Spring Hill, Marengo Co., Ala. [See next page for remainder of this entry.]

Pvt. James M. Mason (-continued-)

Rev. James Monroe Mason, Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was 16 when he enlisted. He later wrote an account of the death of General McCook. See the *Huntsville Historical Review*, Vol. 2, No. 4 (1972), pp 3-15.

Mason, Pvt. J. W. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market; captured at Parkers Cross Road, Tenn. on 31 Dec. 1862. Died 22 March 1863 at Camp Douglas, Ill. of pneumonia.

Matheny, Pvt. J. N. Enlisted 15 Feb. 1863 at Columbia, Tenn. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Mayhew, Pvt. Henry C. Enlisted 1 Aug. 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Mayhew, Cpl. Theodore. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Captured at Huntsville 13 July 1863. Released from Fort Delaware, Del. on oath 14 June 1865. (Resident of Madison County, complexion sallow, hair dark, eyes brown, 6')

McClung, Pvt. F. A. Enlisted 1 Feb. 1863 at Unionville, Tenn. Surrendered at Citronelle, Ala. 4 May 1865 with Co. B. Paroled at Gainesville, Ala. 14 May 1865.

McDougle[McDougal], Pvt. John W. Enlisted 16 Aug. 1862 at New Market. Deserted 14 Dec. 1864. Took oath at Nashville 24 Feb. 1865 (Resided Lincoln Co., Tenn., complexion fair, hair brown, eyes hazel, 5' 7", single.)

Mead, Pvt. Samuel. Roll of Oct-Dec. 1863 notes "Absent sick." Oath taken at Knoxville, Tenn. on 3 Jan. 1864.

Medlin, Pvt. Richard. Enlisted 1 Feb. 1863 at Columbia, Tenn. Captured at Huntsville 24 Oct. 1863. Transferred from Camp Morton, Ind. to Fort Delaware, Del. 19 Nov. 1864. Released on oath at Fort Delaware 20 May 1865 (Resident of Madison Co., Ala., complexion light, hair sandy, eyes blue, 5' 8").

Miller, Pvt. J. J. Enlisted 1 Aug. 1862 at New Market; present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Miller, Pvt. Joel. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. No further info. [Same as J. J.].

Miller, Pvt. W. C. Enlisted 23 Feb. 1863 at Unionville, Tenn. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Mock, Pvt. T. R. Enlisted 16 Aug. 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Morris, Pvt. William P. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Roll of Feb-April 1863 notes: "Absent wounded. Ret'd. to command." Captured in Jackson Co., Ala. 25 Jan. 1865. Died March . . . [date faded], 1865 at Camp Chase, Ohio (pneumonia). Buried in grave No. 165, "1/6 mile South of Camp Chase."

Nimmo, Pvt. W. H. Enlisted 10 Aug. 1862 at New Market, Ala. Roll of Feb-Apr. 1863 notes "Sick in Hospital (Ret'd). Captured in Madison Co., Ala. 10 Oct. 1863. "Transferred for Exchange Feb. 19, 1865" from Camp Morton, Ind. to Point Lookout, Md. Admitted to General Hospital No. 9, Richmond, Va. 1 May 1865. 30-day furlough from 8 May 1865.

O'Neal, Pvt. G. W. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Roll of Feb-Apr 1863 says "On detached service, Blacksmith." Roll of Oct-Dec. 1863 states "Det'd. into Med. department." From 19 July 1864 listed as a blacksmith in "the field Army of Tenn." Surrendered at Greensboro, N. C. 26 April 1865. Paroled 3 May 1865 (Resident of Madison Co., Ala. "On special duty.")

Pickett, Pvt. W. H. Enlisted 6 July 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 December 1863.

Potts, Pvt. J. R. On muster roll for 31 Oct to 31 Dec. 1863. No further information.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Jackson Co., Al: John Robert Potts, born Nov. 23, 1844 at Gurley, Ala., entered service as a private June 1, 1863 at Uniontown, Tenn. in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry. "Captured at Huntsville, Ala. in fall of 1864. Few days later was paroled." A resident of Paint Rock in 1907.

Powers, Pvt. J. N. Enlisted 1 Sept. 1862 at New Market, Ala. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Proctor, Pvt. J. W. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Jackson Co., Al: James Wilborn Proctor, born Nov. 28, 1837 in Bellefonte, Ala. entered service in Spring of 1862 in Jackson Co., Ala. in Co. C, 4th Alabama Cavalry. "Paroled at surrender 20th day of May 1865 at Whites Landing, Ala. with Col. Norwood. A resident of Scottsboro in 1907.

Proctor, Pvt. S. D. Enlisted 1 Feb. 1863 at Unionville, Tenn. Captured at Larkinsville, Ala. 27 Aug. 1863. Name on undated list of POW's "paroled and permitted to stay at home."

Province, Pvt. J. M. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Deserted and reported at Murfreesboro, Tenn. 22 June 1863. Oath taken 1 July 1863. "Sent across Ohio River on oath [by] order Genl. Boyle."

Province, Pvt. R. M. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Deserted and reported at Murfreesboro, Tenn. 22 June 1863. Oath taken 1 July 1863. Oath taken 1 July 1863. "Sent across Ohio River on oath [by] order [of] Genl. Boyle."

Pruit, Sgt. V. Green. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market as 5th Sgt. Listed Feb-Apr. 1863 as a Private. Surrendered at Huntsville 2 May 1865. Oath taken at Nashville 4 May 1865 as Sgt. (Resided Madison Co., Ala., complexion fair, hair dark, eyes hazel, 5'11", has family.)

Putnam, Pvt. D. T. Enlisted 20 June 1862 at New Market. "Transf'd to 26th Ala. Inf. Regt. by order Col. Russell, April 15, 1863."

Robertson, Pvt. George M. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Captured near Franklin, Tenn. on 2 Sept. 1864. Paroled 26 May 1865. A Huntsville, Madison Co., Al. resident.

Robertson, Pvt. T. P. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. "Discharged on account of disability April 1, 1863."

Robinson, Cpl. C. A. Enlisted 1 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. as 2nd Cpl. Listed July-Aug. 1864 as patient (a Sgt.), General Hospital, Marion, Ala.

Robinson, John J.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co., Al: John J. Robinson, born April 8, 1848 at Huntsville, Ala. "entered service as a private in July, 1862 at New Market, Ala. in Captain Frank Gurley's Company; in about four days was sent home on account of being under age. Re-enlisted as a private in February, 1865 in the 4th Ala. Cavalry and continued until the close of war." In 1907 was a resident of Huntsville.

Rogers, Pvt. G. D. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co., Al: George Dallas Rogers, born May 2, 1844 in Madison Co., Ala. entered "service as a private in 1862 near Nashville, Tenn. in Co. C, 4th Ala. Regiment, and continued until February, 1865." Was a Gurley resident in 1907.

Rountree, Pvt. S. L. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market. Feb-Apr. 1863 in Co. K. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Sanford, Pvt. F. M. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. No further information.

Sanford, Pvt. J. B. Enlisted 15 March 1863 at Unionville, Tenn. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Saxon, Sgt. A. M. Enlisted 20 May 1862 at New Market as 3rd Sgt. Listed Feb-April 1863 as a Private. "Died of disease Sept. 1863."

Scott, Pvt. R. T. Jr. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Feb-April 1863 was "absent on furlough." Captured at Lookout Mountain, Ga. 15 Sept. 1863. Released at Cincinnati, Ohio on oath 9 October 1863.

Scruggs, Pvt. B. Pope. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Surrendered at Citronelle, Ala. 4th of May 1865 with Co. B; paroled at Gainesville, Ala. 14 May 1865.

Shelby, Anthony Bouldin.

1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co., Al: Anthony Bouldin Shelby, born Dec. 10, 1845 at Cluttsville, Madison Co., Ala. Enlisted in April 1861 at Huntsville in Co. I, 4th Alabama Infantry. Discharged in July 1862 as under age. Re-enlisted "in Sept. or Oct., 1862 near Uniontown, Tenn. in Captain Frank B. Gurley's Co., 4th Ala. Cavalry, Russell's Regiment and continued until the close of war. Surrendered at Marion, Alabama in April, 1865." In 1907 was a resident of Huntsville.

Smock, Pvt. R. A. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market. Present through 20 Oct. 1862.

Spelce, Sgt. William K. Enlisted 1 Sept. 1862 at New Market at 2nd Sgt. Feb-April 1863 listed as Private. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.

Starkey, Pvt. George M. D. Enlisted 20 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. Surrendered at Stevenson, Ala. 13 May 1865. Oath taken at Nashville 14 May 1865. (Resided Jackson Co., Ala., complexion fair, hair light, eyes blue, 5' 9½")

- Starkey, Pvt. William C. Enlisted 1 March 1863 at Uniontown, Tenn. Surrendered at Stevenson, Ala. 13 May 1865; paroled at Nashville 14 May 1865 (Res. Jackson Co., Ala., complexion fair, hair light, eyes blue, 5' 9")
- St. Clair, Pvt. P. P. Enlisted 20 Dec. 1862 at Columbia, Tenn. Feb-April 1863 listed "Sick in Hospital (Ret'd); present through 31 Dec. 1863.
- Street, Pvt. W. J. Enlisted 1 July 1862 at New Market. On "Roll of Stragglers" who surrendered at Citronelle, Ala. 4 May 1865. Paroled at Mobile 20 May 1865.
- Strong, Pvt. C. W. On muster roll of 31 Oct-31 Dec. 1863. No further information.
- Taylor, Pvt. J. M. Enlisted 5 July 1862 at New Market. Roll of Oct-Dec 1863 notes "Absent, wounded." Captured at Clear Creek, Ala. 17 Aug. 1863. Released on oath at Fort Delaware, Del. 14 June 1865 (Resident of Madison Co., AL., complexion fair, hair dark, eyes blue, 5'8")
- Thompson, Sgt. Fowler. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market at Pvt. "App't. 4th Sergt. April 1, 1863." Captured, place and date not noted. Admitted to General Hospital No. 9, Richmond, Va. 2 March 1865 as Paroled Prisoner. Transferred to Howard's Grove Hospital, Richmond on 3 March 1865 ("opacity of cornea"); retired as disabled 27 March 1865 ("... permanently disabled for field service and unfit at present for any duty on account of Blindness, the result of variola [small pox], with which he suffered while a prisoner, the left eye will probably be restored in the course of time." Born in Jackson Co., Ala., age 24, 5' 5", complexion fair, eyes grey, hair dark, occupation farmer.
- Tiller, Pvt. A. J. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Captured near Whitesburg, Ala. 21 July 1864. Released on oath at Camp Chase, Ohio 15 May 1865 (Resident of Madison Co., Ala., complexion dark, eyes grey, 5' 10")
- Tipton, Pvt. Benjamin E. Enlisted 15 Aug. 1862 at New Market. Admitted to St. Mary's Hospital in Dalton, Ga. 24 April 1863 ("Febris Typhoides"). Returned to duty 12 May 1863. Present through 31 Dec. 1863.
- Tipton, Pvt. Lafayette. Enl. 16 Sep 1862 at New Market. On Oct-Dec '63 roll listed "Absent-sick."
- Vest, Sidney A.
1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Morgan Co: Sidney A. Vest, born Nov. 28, 1846 at Huntsville, Madison Co., Ala. Entered service as a private in April, 1862 at New Market, Ala. in Capt. Gurley's Company, 4th Ala. Cavalry and continued until captured in 1863. Re-enlisted as private in March 1863 near New Market in 7th Ala. Cavalry and continued until June, 1864. In fall of 1864 joined Roddy's escort near Triana. Resided Hartselle in 1907.
- Weaver, Pvt. John B. Enlisted 16 Sept. 1862 at New Market. Feb-Apr. 1863 listed "Sick in Hospital (Ret'd)." Surrendered at Citronelle, Ala. 4 May 1865 with Co. B, paroled at Gainesville, Ala. 14 May 1865 (Resident of Huntsville, Al.)
- Wells, Pvt. George W. Enlisted 20 May 1862. Roll of Feb-Apr. 1863 notes "On detached service." On rolls through 31 Dec. 1863.

PLEASANT TAYLOR CLAIM Southern Claims Commission

Affidavit

That on or about the 23rd day of March, 1865 Pleasant Taylor was passing through the village of Frankfort and was halted by a squad of United States soldiers under command of General Wilson. His command, or a division of it, was then passing through the village and took from Taylor one roan mare worth \$125.

Taylor stated that on the same day there was taken from his residence 500 lbs. of bacon worth 20 Cents per pound and 1000 binds or bundles of fodder taken by United States soldiers. The same was removed to the main army where it was encamped at Frankfort. They then marched south.

Mr. Taylor stated he was unable give the name and rank of the officers or the company or regiment to which they and the soldiers belonged nor could he state which company or regiment took his property. He further states they took 75 bushels of corn worth \$1 per bushel. The claim is for the following property:

500 pounds bacon -	\$100
75 bushels of corn at	\$1
1000 bundles of fodder -	\$20
One bay mare -	\$125.
Total claim	\$320.

On 25 February 1873 depositions were taken at Frankfort, Franklin County, Alabama, of Pleasant Taylor (claimant), William Rikard, Senior, Robert C. Reed, Malinda Taylor (colored) and David Wesley Taylor. Depositions were scheduled to be taken of Mrs. Samira Rikard, Joseph C. Taylor and Francis Taylor but due to their illness, or illness in their family, they could not be taken.

Pleasant Taylor Deposition Claim No. 2670

Pleasant Taylor is 66 years of age, a resident of Franklin County, Alabama and a farmer by occupation. From April 1, 1861 to June 1, 1865 he resided where he now lives, about two miles west of Frankfort in Franklin County, Alabama on his own land. His farm embraced about 300 acres of which 40 acres were in cultivation and the remainder was woodland. He did not change his residence or occupation during the war.

Taylor stated he was only in the lines of each of the armies as they were changed

to include his residence during the war. He took an amnesty oath at Frankfort, Alabama sometime in the fall of 1865.

Mr. Taylor stated that in March, 1865, one portion of the United States Army, commanded by Major General J. H. Wilson was on its march south through Frankfort, Alabama where claimant happened to be when it arrived.

Claimant Taylor was detained from the evening of its arrival until the next morning when it departed. He was released without taking an oath of any kind.

During the war, Confederate Soldiers often came to claimant's farm and took

corn and fodder for the use of their armies. He does not recall the dates and never received pay for the property.

Mr. Taylor stated he was never threatened to his face but had been informed that in 1864 one Mitchell and two other Confederate soldiers went to his residence while he was absent and abused his family and threatened to take his stock because of his Union sentiments.

They went off without taking the stock. Claimant was also informed by others of threats against himself and his property on account of his sentiments. Union men were generally threatened with injury during the war.

During the war, claimant was remote from the Union Army and was so situated as to be prevented from intercourse with it or its soldiers except when they were occasionally on the march through his neighborhood. On those occasions they took property indiscriminately from Union men as well as others, leaving claimant without ability to contribute.

Claimant Taylor aided the Union cause when he could safely do so by urging men in the Confederate Army and those liable to conscription, to go into the Federal lines and join the Union Army.

He also aided the families of Union soldiers, who resided in his neighborhood, to get to the Federal lines. With his wagon he took three Union families at one time and one family at another time, to Iuka, Mississippi (about 35 miles distant) where they could get transportation into the Federal lines.

The families taken were those of William Morris, George Conoway and David Hughes who were Union soldiers. The other family was that of the widowed mother of the said William Morris.

Three of Pleasant Taylor's sons, all now residents of Franklin County, were conscripted into the Confederate service. They were John F. Taylor, Absolem S.

Taylor, and Joseph C. Taylor. They all deserted and rendered nothing but compulsory service while in said army.

Claimant Taylor also had one nephew, Blackwell Malone, conscripted into the Confederate Army but he, too, deserted. Mr. Taylor kept him at his house for some time after he deserted and advised him to go into the Union Army. He left Taylor's house saying he was going into the Union Army but Taylor never heard of him again.

Mr. Taylor stated his feelings were for the Union and its cause from the beginning and that his language, when he found it safe to speak, was always in accordance therewith. He stated, "I exerted my influence and cast my vote in favor of the Union cause. I advised my neighbors to vote against secession and I so voted. The vote at the precinct at which I voted I think was 300 for the Union and 9 for secession, I voting with the majority.

"The Ordinance of Secession was not submitted for ratification to a vote of the people in Alabama. I would have voted against such ratification had it been submitted. After the Ordinance of Secession



was adopted in the State of Alabama, I adhered to the Union cause and did not go with the State."

Mr. Taylor stated his mare was taken at Frankfort, Alabama and the other property was taken from his residence, about two miles from Frankfort. When the items were taken from his residence his wife, Nancy Taylor,

now dead, his daughter Frances Taylor, his son Wesley Taylor, and a Negro woman named Malinda Taylor were present besides the soldiers.

Taylor did not ask for a receipt or voucher and none was offered to him. He left Frankfort immediately after his mare was taken. There had been no battle or skirmish nearby before the property was taken.

Taylor stated the bacon was good and sound, well-cured—as were the sides, shoulders and hams. The mare that was taken was a dark roan, aged 6 years, of medium size and good order.

Twenty “middlings, 6 hams and 4 shoulders of bacon” were taken. Claimant Taylor estimated the middlings would average 20 lbs. each, the hams 14 lbs., and the shoulders 14 lbs. each. The corn was estimated at 75 bushels. Ninety-five bushels were on hand before the army came and only 20 bushels were there when they left. The fodder had been hauled from the stack in the field a few days before and counted: there were 1000 bundles and all were taken.

Mr. Taylor stated he was a farmer and had considerable experience estimating quantities of produce from bulk and was satisfied he had not overestimated the quantities.

William Rikard, Senr., Deposition
As to Claimant's Loyalty.

William Rikard, Senior, was 62 years of age, a farmer, and a resident of Franklin County, Alabama. He is not related to claimant Pleasant Taylor but claimant's wife, “who died about 25 years ago was my sister-in-law.” Rikard has no interest in this claim. [Note: Some genealogical confusion is caused by Rikard's comment that Mrs. Taylor has been dead about 25 years. These depositions were taken in June, 1871 and even though Taylor states his wife is dead at this time, she was alive in March, 1865 when the troops

took her property. There had to have been either two marriages for Taylor or Rikard's memory was faulty as to the number of years she had been dead.]

Rikard's acquaintance with claimant commenced over 40 years ago and they were intimate throughout the war. Rikard lived within 3/4 mile of Taylor during the war and saw him as often as once or twice a week, if not oftener.

They often conversed about the war, its causes and progress. Rikard was an adherent of the Union cause and was so regarded by the claimant.

Taylor always declared he was opposed to secession, the war, and the Confederacy. He said if the Confederacy was established he would leave it; that he would not live in it. He said the war was caused by secessionists and bad men.

William Rikard, Senr., stated he also knew Taylor was a Union man because he aided families of Union soldiers to get into the Federal lines. Mr. Rikard assisted Taylor “in carrying, with our wagons, to Iuka, Mississippi the families [of] Henry Rikard, David Hughes and Grandison Williams, Federal soldiers, so as to enable them to get to the Federal post at Glendale, Mississippi.

Mr. Rikard, Senr., stated, “From declarations of hostility to secession, the war and the Confederacy made to me as well as from the fact that he was notoriously a Union man . . .” Taylor could not have established his loyalty to the Confederacy if it had been maintained as a separate Government.

Rikard stated he was well acquainted with the mare taken from Taylor by Union soldiers; that the mare was a dark roan, about 14 hands high, heavy set, about 5 years old, in fine order, of good qualities, and worth \$150.

Deposition signed William Rikard, Sr., by his mark.

Robert C. Reed Deposition
As to Claimant's Loyalty

Robert C. Reed was 52 years of age, a resident of Frankfort, Franklin County, Alabama. He was a farmer and clerk in the office of the Judge of Probate.

Reed is not related to the claimant but has been acquainted with him since 1853. Said acquaintance was intimate throughout the war. Reed resided within two miles of Taylor during the war and saw him as often as once in two weeks, sometimes oftener. Reed stated he, too, was an adherent of the Union cause and was so regarded by Taylor.

Reed knew the claimant's sympathies and opinions to be in favor of the Union cause because they were members of the same political party.

[Note: Reed's testimony closely followed and reinforced that of Mr. Rikard and will not be repeated here.]

Malinda Taylor Deposition (Colored)
As to the Taking of Property

"My name is Malinday Taylor, my age is from 35 to 37 years, I think. I do not know my exact age. I reside in the county of Franklin and State of Alabama. I am a house keeper and cook. I was formerly a slave of claimant—was emancipated by the war. I am now in the employment of and reside with claimant. I have no interest in his claim.

"I was present when all of the property specified in claimant's petition was taken except the mare. He rode said mare off one morning in 1865 while the Federal Army commanded by General Wilson was on its march through Frankfort, Alabama and came back next morning afoot without said mare."

Malinda stated that some time "in the month of March, 1865, I think about the 22nd or 23rd of said month, . . . a large

body of soldiers from said Army, in number about 400 or 500, came to the residence of claimant about two miles west of Frankfort where I was then residing and took and carried away the bacon, the corn and the fodder.

The soldiers were on the place about three hours during which time the property was taken. The property was carried in the direction of Frankfort where a portion of said army encamped the following night."

Malinda did not follow the persons who took the property or see it after it left the place.

She said she heard the officers say they had to take the property to feed that night. The property was taken between 3 and 6 o'clock p.m., and none of it was taken secretly.

Malinda Taylor signed with an X.

David Wesley Taylor Deposition
As to the Taking of Property

David Wesley Taylor was 24 years old, a farmer and a resident of Colbert County, Alabama. He is a son of claimant but has no pecuniary interest in the claim. He was present when all of the articles of property specified were taken except the mare.

David Wesley lived at his father's residence at the time the property was taken by the soldiers and saw it taken.

Also present, beside David Wesley Taylor were "Mrs. Nancy Taylor, Frances Taylor and Malinda Taylor besides small children."

[Note: David Wesley Taylor reiterated what has already been stated by the claimant and Malinda Taylor and it will not be repeated here.]

Remarks by R. S. Watkins, Special Comm'r.

"It being made to appear to me that in consequence of Sickness, either of themselves or families, that *Susannah* Rikard, Joseph C.

Taylor and Frances Taylor, witnesses named in Claimant's application to take testimony, Said Witnesses could not attend for examination.

"I permitted Claimant to Substitute for them as witnesses Robert C. Reed, Malinda Taylor (Colored) and David Wesley Taylor and examined them."

**An Act Concerning Paupers:
Afay Gill, Michael Tacket, and Luther Hovater.**

An act to authorize the Court of County Commissioners of Franklin County, to make appropriations for the relief of certain persons therein named.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Alabama in General Assembly convened* That the Court of County Commissioners of the county of Franklin, be, and they are hereby authorized to appropriate out of the County Treasury, if they deem it advisable, the same amount that is now allowed for the support of paupers in said county, for Afay Gill, Michael Tacket and Luther Hovater, without requiring them to be kept in the Poor House of said county. Approved 7 Feb. 1856.

HARRIS SHELTON ESTATE LEDGER

This is the account book of Harris Shelton with entries dating from 1855 through 1858. All entries deal with leather work and most are for repairing shoes, boots and saddles. One entry was for medical bags for John B. Cook, a physician at Bellefonte. The accounts were meticulously kept complete with an index, probably made by the administrator of the estate since some of the accounts are noted as being from "the old ledger" and some from the "new ledger." In the back of the book were six loose ledger sheets showing a list of accounts to January 1861 and the amounts due from each. From the names of his clients, one must assume Shelton lived somewhere west of Bellefonte, the then county seat. From the large number of accounts one must conclude that Mr. Shelton enjoyed considerable popularity in his profession.

This ledger is important as many names are listed that are not readily found elsewhere. It is also important as it predates the Civil War during which time so many records were destroyed. Only the index has been copied. Copied and contributed by Dorothy Scott Johnson.

The following is the Bible record of Jesse Vann and his wife, Mary "Polly" Glover. Mary "Polly" was the daughter of Revolutionary soldier, Benjamin Glover, who settled in Madison County. Jesse Vann was the son of Thomas Vann and Martha Buchanan, early Madison County settlers.

The Bible itself is in the hands of a Mrs. Herston of Marshall County. She tore out the Family pages and gave them to Kim Ivy of Athens, Alabama. Those pages were photocopied by Roy Maynard and contributed to *Valley Leaves*. The date on the title page was 1820.

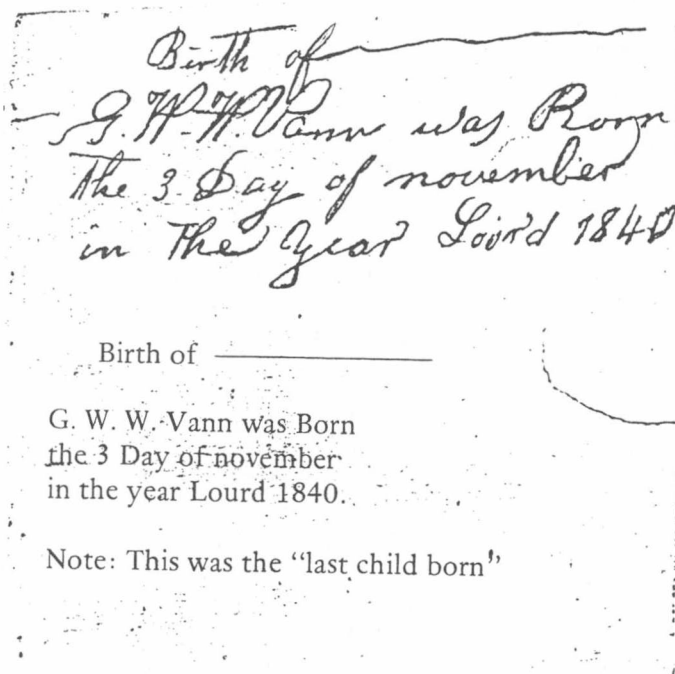

The following newspaper article was located and contributed by William Stubno, a Huntsville historian. It was found on page 2 of the 17 November 1832 issue of *Southern Statesman*, a newspaper printed in Jackson, Tennessee.

DISTRESSING EVENT

Huntsville, Ala. Nov. 8 [1832]

On Monday night last, immediately after supper at the Bell Tavern in this place, a quarrel ensued between Mr. William Lewis of this County and a man by the name of John Perry. Perry, being pressed upon retreated a few paces, drew a pistol and fired as Lewis was in the act of striking at him with a chair. Perry immediately retreated through a back door and made his escape.

The room was much crowded at the time—it being on the eve of the races—and

Perry (who mounted a favorite race horse), although quickly pursued, has not yet been heard from.

Lewis was desperately wounded—the balls (of ounce size) having penetrated his left side—and on Tuesday evening, all efforts of the ablest surgeons proved unavailing, he expired.

In these days nothing but death is the issue of the slightest provocation between man and man. How deplorable! That wives are to be made widows and children orphans from this wreckless and bloody use of the pistol and the dirk.

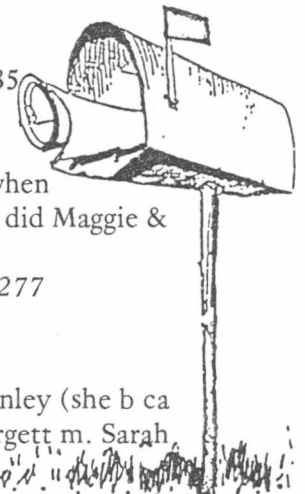
