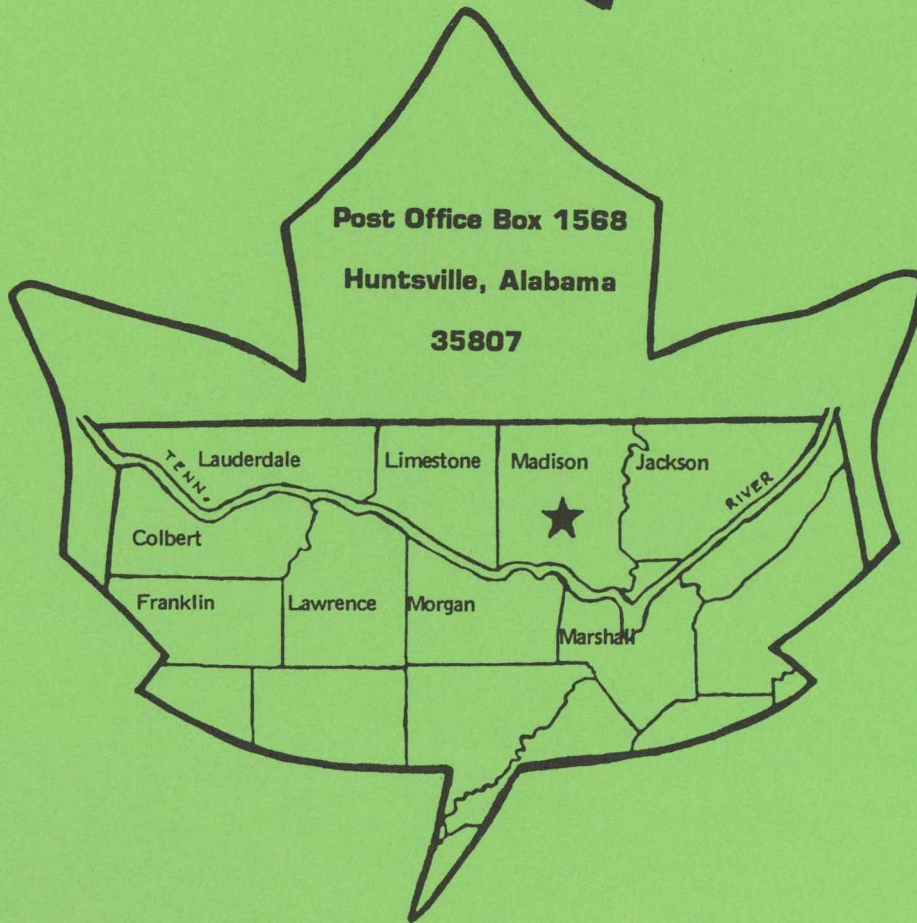

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HERE & THERE

In the September 1992 issue I wrote about Huntsville a hundred years ago — asking if any readers had souvenirs from the Chicago Exposition, which opened in October 1892. Here's Sue Farris Rossman's letter, who lives in Tullahoma TN:

Among many items that have been passed on to my husband after his parents' deaths are four Chicago World's Fair souvenir spoons.

At the end of the handle is: 1893 — a likeness of Columbus — then 1492. In the bowl of each spoon there is a depicted a building:

1. Administration Building
2. Manufacturers & Liberal Arts Building
3. Transportation Building
4. Art Palace

Just a few months ago, I had the spoons mounted in a shadow box type frame which now hangs in our dining room.

Mrs. Rossman, what a wonderful treasure you have — thank you so much for sharing this bit of history with us.



Here's part of a letter from Mr. Nelms of Farragut, TN:

For the past few years I've had the good fortune to correspond with Judge Paul C. Boethel of Hallettsville, TX...who wrote an interesting history of his area — Lavaca Co TX — near the site of the Goliad Massacre.

I've been able to provide the Judge (now in his 80s) with some information about Isaac D. Hamilton (an ancestor of mine) from Lawrence County, and whose brother James Hamilton, was an early settler of Madison Co., Mississippi Territory.

Isaac escaped the Massacre, along with one Zachary Brooks. The Judge has been attempting to determine what became of Zachary.

On 5 May 1850, Zachary patented 777.7 acres, north of Moulton (Lavaca Co TX). The deed recorded in Lavaca Co (dated 6 Nov 1858) was prepared in Lawrence Co AL, and acknowledged in Morgan Co AL, recording the sale by Wm. Points and Emily Points "of Morgan Co."

Deed notes that land being sold was "(land) to which Emily Points is entitled as heir of said Z. Brooks, dec'd."

Our speculation is that Emily was a daughter of Zachary, although no relationship was stated in the deeds.

The Judge reports that they've found no evidence that Zachary ever occupied the tract of land granted to him. The thought is that he may have returned to Alabama and, possibly there's a record of administration of his estate recorded in Morgan County.

I'd love to pop down to Morgan Co to check estate records myself, that not being possible I hope to interest someone down there to join the hunt.

The Fergusons have produced a valuable research tool. The text is easy to read and well arranged. Enough of the data from the wills is included in the abstracts so that the text is full of names, places and details of property and daily life in early nineteenth century North Carolina.

Tax lists are well labeled and easy to use. Each section has an introduction that provide a wealth of information facilitating the use and understanding of the will abstracts and tax lists.

The excellent index includes place names as well as individuals.

WARD'S BATTERY

Part 2

Well-known Civil War historian, Charles Rice, has graciously contributed the following article based on military service abstracts of "Capt. Enlisted 3 Feb 1863 at Huntsville; in hospital at Mobile, Jun 1863; 30 day furlough from hospital 6 Oct 1863, failed to return; captured 24 Oct 1863 at Woodville, Ala.; died 2 Dec 1863 at Camp Morton, Ind., of typhoid pneumonia; buried in Green Lawn Cemetery, Grave #552.

Aday, Francis M., Sgt.

Enlisted 10 Oct 1862 as private; promoted to Quartermaster Sergeant, 3 Mar 1863; deserted 28 Jul 1863.

Akard, Christopher Columbus, Pvt.

Enlisted 28 Feb 1863 at Huntsville; Mar-Apr 1863 on detached service at Mobile; deserted 29 Jul 1863; returned to duty 9 Sep 1863 under Presidential Pardon; captured 23 May 1864 at Adairsville, GA; sent to Rock Island Prison; joined Union Army to obtain release from prison.

Source: 1907 Confederate Veteran Census, Madison Co: Christopher Columbus Echard, born 25 Dec 1837 at Decatur, Ala. Entered service as a private in Aug 1861 at Mobile, Ala. in Ward's Battery and continued until captured at Caswell, Ga. Sent to Rock Island Prison and was released from prison just before the surrender. Resided in Huntsville in 1907.

OLD TOWN GRAVEYARD

This ancient Russellville burial ground is located at the corner of North Washington and West Cleveland Streets about three blocks from 'downtown.' It is behind the Church of Jesus Christ and covers approximately half a city block. The graves are in 13 long rows, neatly marked with unlettered fieldstones except for the graves listed below. Most of the marked graves are covered with box tombs, inscribed on the lid of the box. Those inscriptions still legible are extremely weathered and difficult to read.

The earliest known graveyard in Russellville was the Sevier Cemetery sandwiched between two houses on North Jackson Street. The graves of Gen. This regiment, commanded by Colonel Josiah Patterson of Morgan County, Alabama, was organized at Tusculumbia in December 1862. Early in January, 1863, the regiment was ordered into Middle Tennessee and skirmished at Chapel Hill – the extreme left of General Bragg's army.

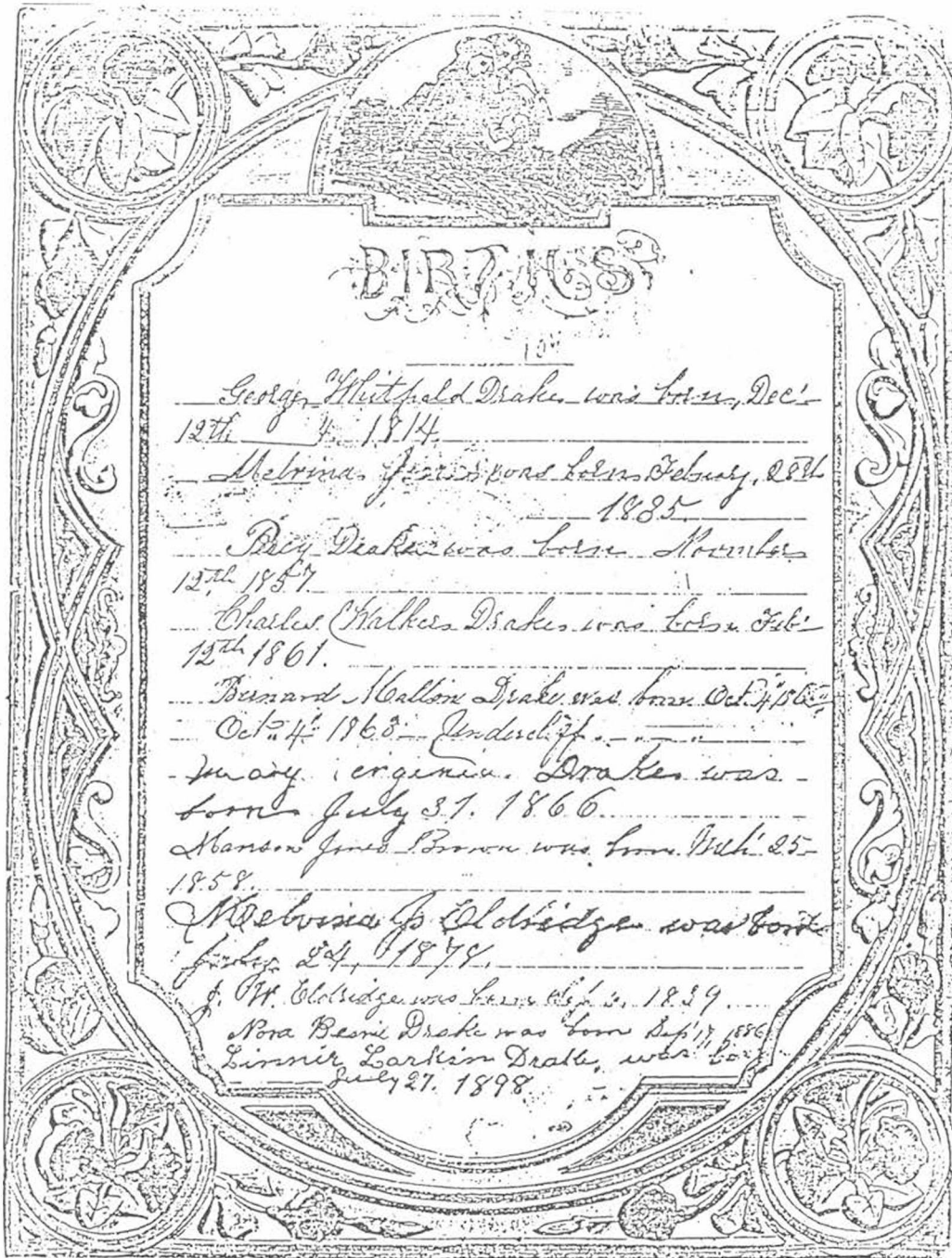

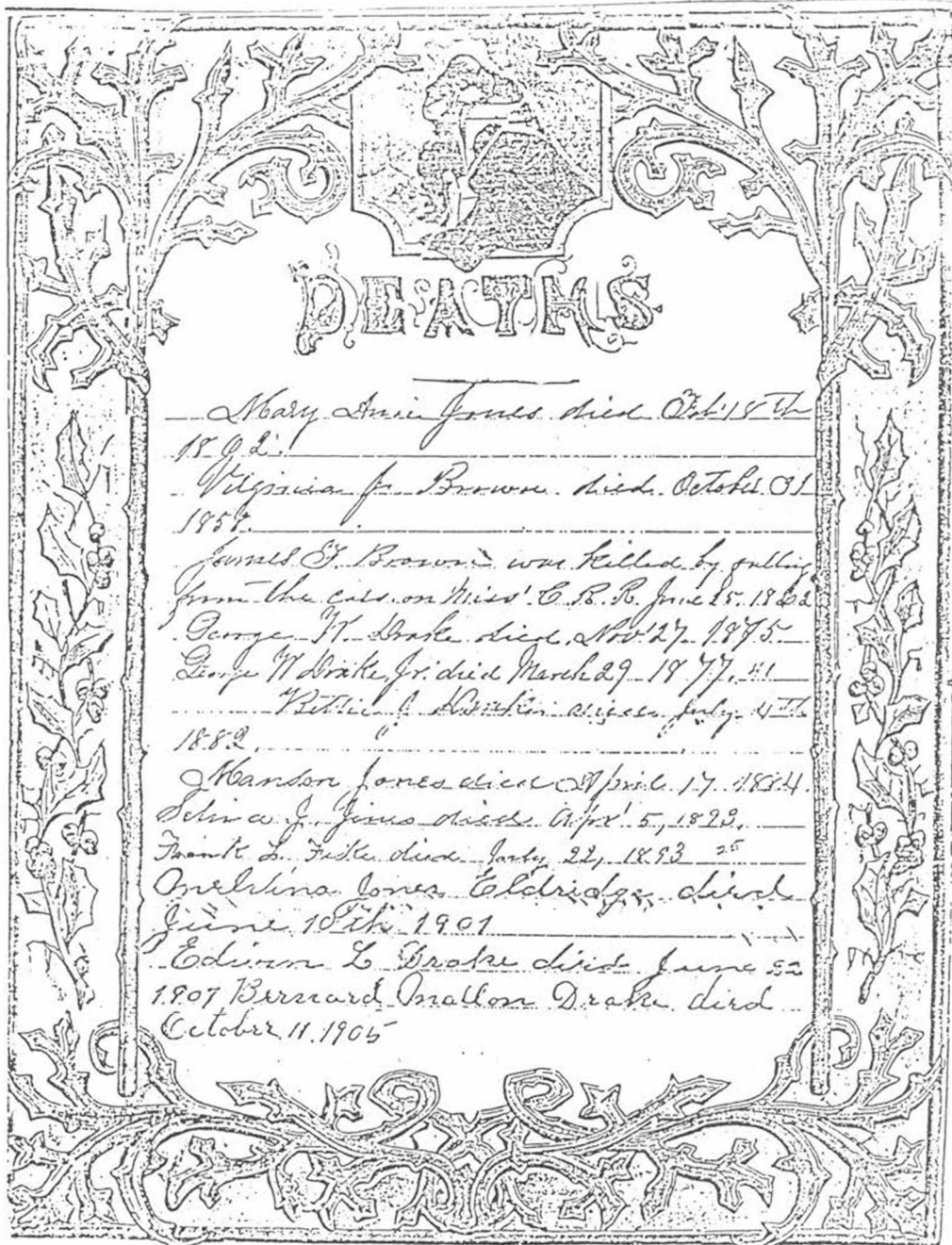

SKIDMORE'S CHAPEL CEMETERY

Part 2

The earliest records of Ruth community originate with Dallas Polk Briscoe, born 23 Nov 1843, in Apple Grove of Morgan County.

Dallas was only 17 when he rode away to the Civil War, on a three-year-old horse named Hardy. Hardy brought Dallas back to Apple Grove safely.

Hardy was 30 years old when he died in 1887. Neighbors thought Briscoe should 'just drag Hardy off and let the buzzards eat him.' But Briscoe considered Hardy a dear friend who deserved an honorable burial. He hired help to dig a grave for Hardy on Hog Branch, which runs in front of Ruth Baptist Church.

In 1878 Briscoe with wife, Alice Evans, son John and daughters Sallie Bet and Mattie Mae, registered a claim to 160 acres of land on Brindlee Mountain in Marshall County at the Huntsville Land Office. The land was called Ruth for the book of the Bible.

Briscoe built a country store in 1888 and a post office in 1890, serving as postmaster until the post office was moved to Joppa. (Article says that the Joppa post office was still open at time the article was written.)

The first mail carrier was Bee Rutledge, who delivered the mail on horseback, every Wednesday and Saturday.

George Bishop was the first teacher in the one-room log school built in 1890 on the acre of land donated by Briscoe. The townspeople named the school Briscoe in his honor, but he asked them to change the name to Ruth.

The first church, Spring Hill Baptist Church was organized on 2 Aug 1891, meeting initially in the schoolhouse. Later the school was moved to a central location. George Cleckler gave land for the school and a Methodist church; Spring Hill Baptist bought the old school building.

On 26 Sep 1893, the church was renamed Ruth. First pastor was J. E. Weaver, the clerk was G. W. Bishop, and the Sunday School superintendent was W. M. Barber.

Dallas Polk Briscoe, founding father of Ruth Community, died 28 Sep 1896 at age 53.

In 1894 Ruth joined the Marshall County Baptist Association. The Baptist Young People's Union was established in 1922.

In 1976, Lenard and Wynelle Hayes organized the building of a pastorium for the church's first full-time pastor, Rev. John Garrison.

On Jan. 7, 1977, Sallie Bet Briscoe Weaver, one of the first writers for the *Arab Tribune*, died at the age of 89.

The first wedding to be held in Ruth Baptist was the granddaughter of 'Aunt' Sallie, Allie Faye Weaver, who married Randall Ashburn, who became the pastor of Ruth Baptist on 23 Mar 1977.

From 1891 to 1980 Ruth Baptist grew from 24 members to 328.

This regiment, commanded by Colonel Josiah Patterson of Morgan County, Alabama, was organized at Tusculumbia in December 1862. Early in January, 1863, the regiment was ordered into Middle Tennessee and skirmished at Chapel Hill – the extreme left of General Bragg's army.

For complete introduction, see the December 1992 issue of *Valley Leaves*. That issue also included rosters of two of the four companies from Morgan County, Company D and Company G. The other two companies from Morgan County, Companies I and L, were in the March 1993 issue.

In addition to the four companies from Morgan County, there were two from Lawrence County, two from Marion County, one from Marion/Franklin County, one from Fayette County, and one from Tuscaloosa County. 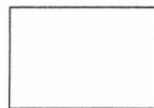
