Nelson, born and died Feb. 23, 1936, was infant of Arthur and Marie (Jones) Bibles. Arthur was son of Walter and Elizabeth "Lizzie" (Baker) Bibles of Grundy Co., Tennessee.

Marie was daughter of Nelson G. and Agnes (Handy) Jones of Tracy City, Grundy Co., Tennessee. Nelson Jones was a tax collector for Grundy Co.. Marie was born in 1909, graduated from high school and moved as a young woman to Merrimack, Madison Co., Alabama, and worked in the office of Merrimack Manufacturing Co. She had an uncle, George Handy, who lived there.

Arthur and Marie Jones married Feb. 20, 1932, in Madison Co., Alabama. They became the parents of two children, Melrose and Nelson. Melrose married James A. Coleman, Jr. and Nelson N., their second child.

On July 10, 1972, Marie Bibles married Noble Van Graham in Madison Co., Alabama. Noble worked for the Department of Internal Revenue.

Minnie Ricketts was the wife of William Birmingham. They probably married in Franklin Co., Tennessee. Claude, Wade married Elamae Tucker), Jasper, Hubert, Belle, who married Joe Tucker Dec. 2, 1916, and Mattie, who married a Gann were their children.
