Ruth Bell was Ruth Bell Green, daughter of Barzella J. and Talitha Green.

Her father was a coal miner in Grundy Co., Tennessee. She was the wife of John A. Crick. Both John and Ruth were from Tracy City, Grundy Co. Tennessee. Their children were Lee Jefferson, John Thomas, Audrey, Hillery and Maggie Crick.

When the family moved to Huntsville in early 1900s, John was a woodchopper by profession. Ruth Bell kept house and their children worked in Merrimack Mfg. Co. John died during the flu epidemic of 1918. Ruth died March 25, 1937, of flu and pneumonia. Her grandchild, Freddie Mae Carden, died the same day Ruth Bell died of the same diseases.
