

Adkins, Gertrude, 1934-1936. Double stone for Gertrude & David.  
Adkins, David, 1945-1946. Faces east.  
Gibbs, H. L., 1935. Concrete block, hand lettered. Flat on  
ground, faces west.  
Burgess, Delpha Marie, 1903-1943. "A tender mother and a faithful  
friend." Faces west.  
Hymer, Ida, Nov. 11, 1885-Nov. 5, 1944. "Sunset and evening star  
and one clear call for me: and may there be no moaning of  
the bar when I put out to sea." Faces west.  
(About 8 ft. withour stones from Hymer to Lemley stone.)  
Lemley, Harry F., 1887-1935. "Gone but not forgotten." Faces  
west.  
(About 14 ft. with no stones from Lemley to Locke stone.)  
Locke, Ollie, 1886-1935. She was a kind and affectionate wife, a  
fond mother and a friend to all." Large stone, overturned,  
1997. faces east.

#### Driveway

(About 10 ft. from drive to Gault.)  
Gault, Bettie, Apr. 14, 1887-Feb. 8, 1920. "Mother""Gone but not  
forgotten." "The one we loved is sleeping here, our dear  
mother." Faces east.  
(About 11 ft. from Gault to Locke.)  
Locke, Mrs. Susie, Sept. 14, 1870-Oct. 26, 1929. "Our Mother."  
"A tender mother and faithful friend." Faces west. Stone off  
base, 1997.  
Locke, John F., Oct. 4, 1862-July 2, 1918. "Our Father."  
"Gone but not forgotten." Faces west. Stone off base, 1997.

#### ROW 7.

(About 12 ft. from fence to Cantrell stone.)  
Cantrell, Lem, 1884-935. Faces west.  
(About 12 ft. from Cantrell to Spurlock grave.)  
Spurlock, Jamess Haden, 1907-1949. "Gone to a bright home where  
grief cannot come." Faces west.  
Spurlock, Louis, Jan. 21, 1934-Feb. 26, 1942. Printing on top of  
stone, facing west. "A little flower of love that blossomed  
but to die, transplanted now above to bloom with God on High."  
Epitaph on base.  
Spurlock, Lecil, Oct. 25, 1885-Apr. 24, 1935. "His memory is  
blessed." Faces west.  
Woodall couple buried in family plot bounded by concrete bars.  
Woodall, Abe F., 1858-19\_\_\_. Double stone with Rhoda J. Woodall.  
Woodall, Rhoda J., 1867-1935. Faces west.  
(About 34 ft. with no stones from Woodall and driveway.)

Wilkes, Roland, 1933-1934. Flat stone, faces west.  
(About 23 ft. with no stones from Wilkes to Young's grave.)  
Young, Eugene, April 26, 1936-April 28, 1936. Stone broken. Flat  
on ground. (1997)  
(About 24 ft. with no stones between Young and Johnson.)  
Johnson, Pearl M., Aug. 4, 1880-Dec. 20, 1934. "JOHNSON" across  
top of stone. "She was a kind and affectionate wife, a fond  
mother and a friend to all." Faces west.  
(About 13 ft. with no stones from Johnson to Walker stone.)  
Walker, Hubert, 1892-1949. "God's ways are just." Faces east.
