 Drawhorn, C. B., Mar. 6, 1898-Jan. 7, 1927. Broken off base.
 Faces west.
 Herran, M. B., Feb. 22, 1903-Mar. 17, 1919. "We will meet again."
 Off base, lays on ground. Faced west.
 Roden, C. L., 1911-1915. Missing, 1997.
 Small grave surrounded by concrete bars, no stone.
 (About 40 ft. with no stones from small plot to north fence.
 ROW 36.
 Cobble, Durell, Apr. 5, 1924-Mar. 19, 1925. "Budded on earth to
 bloom in heaven." Stone broken. Faces west.
 Brown, Marion, Dec. 25, 1905-Dec. 3, 1927. "Forever with the
 Lord." Faces west.
 Young, Emma Rose, Aug. 5, 1925-Aug. 5, 1925. "Our darling."
 Faces west.
 Turner, Jessie Lee, No date. "In minary (sic) of Jessie Lee
 Turner." "Gone but not forgotten." Hand written. Stone off
 base. Faces west.
 Small cement marker, no lettering.
 Watson, Rogers R., Mar. 6, 1925-Sept. 26, 1925. "Darling we miss
 thee." Faces west.
 Neill, Hattie E., Feb. 12, 1875-Nov. 5, 1927, wife of
 J. M. Neill. "Our mother" above name. "Faithful to her trust
 even unto death" below dates. Faces west.
 Neill, John M., Jan. 15, 1870-Jan. 18, 1937, husband of Hattie E.
 Neill. "Our father" over name, "Faithful to his trust even
 unto death" below dates. These two in a family plot enclosed
 with cement borders. Faces west.
 Singleton, Willie May, Mar. 29, 1894-Dec. 21, 1925. "A loved on
 from us has gone but not forgotten." Faces west.
 Driveway
 Woodard, Sam J., 1860-1921. Double stone with Sally Woodard. Flat
 stone, faces west.
 Woodard, Sally A., 1866-1925. Shares stone with Sam Woodard.
 Faces west.
 (About 27 ft. with no stones from Woodard to Shafer stone.)
 Shafer, Martha, July 4, 1861-July 21, 1925. "My dear mother,
 gone but not forgotten." Faces east.
 Shafer, Alfred, Mar. 19, 1863-April 20, 1920. "Gone but not
 forgotten." Stone broken. Faces east.
 ROW 37.
 Carlton, John M., Nov. 6, 1869-July 12, 1925. "At rest." Faces
 east.
 Williams, Lizzie, Apr. 16, 1889-Apr. 23, 1931. Faces west.
 Tripp, Arthur M., Apr. 7, 1878-Aug. 2, 1928. "Dearest Father thou
 hast left us here, thy loss we deeply feel, but 'tis God that
 hath bereft us, He can all our sorrows heal." Faces east.
 Whitely, Mary E., Nov. 1857-Jan. 9, 1926. "Mother." Cement marker,
 hand written. Faces east.
 (About 36 ft. with no stones from Whitely to drive.)
 Driveway
 (About 31 ft. with no stones from drive to Goodwin stone.)
 Goodwin, B. C., Aug. 19, 1846-Aug. 29, 1920. "Father." Broken.
 Faces west.
 (About 20 ft. with no stones from Goodwin to Moore stone.)
