Early in 1995, I realized that at one time everyone in Merrimack Village knew the people who were buried in Merrimack Cemetery. Now the neighborhood had changed. Many had died or moved away and the newcomers were not connected to the textile mill. I felt a need to learn about these people before it is too late.

Who were they? Where did they come from? Who were their parents? Who were their children? What caused their deaths?

The history of the cemetery is the history of the village.

Other than talking with people, I have used sources available to anyone: reference books, census records, Huntsville City Directories, Alabama Death indexes and old newspapers found in Heritage Room, Huntsville Public Library, marriage records and Honorable Discharge Records from Army, Navy and Marine Corps and Voter's registration List found in Madison County Probate Office, third floor, Madison County Courthouse, Offices of Maple Hill Cemetery, Huntsville Memory Garden and Valhalla Memory Garden.

One of the greatest pleasures of this research has been in talking with the helpful people who have the answers.

#### BRIEF HISTORY OF THE MERRIMACK CEMETERY

The building of Merrimack Manufacturing Co. of Huntsville was begun in 1899. The company began operation in 1900.

The Merrimack Cemetery was available to the people who were employed by the company. The earliest death date on a tombstone is November 22, 1902, (Etta May Cornutt) followed closely by December 18, 1902, (Isaac Brooks). Since death records were not kept in Alabama before 1909, and obituaries were not always printed in the newspapers in the early 1900s, and many graves are not marked with a stone, but with wooden markers that have deteriorated, it is difficult to be certain of any earlier dates of death.

Mr. E. F. DuBose, Principal of Joe Bradley School, came to Merrimack Village as a teacher in 1921. School children would tell him that their pet had died. When asked what they did with the body, they said they just threw it in a hole in the cemetery. Mr. DuBose went to the cemetery and found large sinkholes where graves had been and trees growing out of the graves. He talked about this with mill management who let him use the labor of Bill Edwards, a Black employee of the mill, and they provided soil for filling the holes. Mr. DuBose and Mr. Edwards worked all of the winter of 1921, cutting down trees and filling graves, until the cemetery was in better shape. Mr. DuBose is sure there were no stones left fallen into the graves.

There have been stories of the existance of a plot of the cemetery showing places and names of those buried there. I talked with Mr. Owen Hammett about possible cemetery records kept by the mill office. Mr. Hammett said there are no burial records. If an employee wanted to bury a family member there, Mr. Hammett would write a permit on a slip of paper. That person would give it to the undertaker. The mill office did not keep a record of burials. At times a family would bury a loved one, especially in the case of a premature infant, in the night without benefit of undertaker or permission from the mill management.

When I phoned the Springs Industries, Inc., in Fort Mill, South Carolina, the company who bought Huntsville Mfg. Co. from Lowenstein Co., an attorney talked with me about records they might have kept and said he had looked in the files and found no cemetery records.

There must have been some system of allotting plots to families at one time for family plots do exist. Some are indicated by concrete posts with the family initial inscribed on the top of four posts surounding an area. Others are fenced in. Many others are marked off by concrete bars or brick set in the ground.

Mr. Lem Speck farmed on the land now occupied by the Milton Frank Stadium and the grove of pine trees. When people needed to have a grave dug, they callled on Mr. Speck and he would pace off the site, then someone would dig the grave.

In January of 1946, M. Lowenstein & Sons purchased Merrimack Mfg. Co. and the textile mill was called Huntsville Mfg. Co. The village was then called Huntsville Park. The cemetery was named Huntsville Park Cemetery.

The Lowenstein Company gave Joe Bradley School and the

demetery to the dity of Huntsville.

When the cemetery was given to the city no records went with it. The mill tried to give the cemetery to the county and to the city earlier than 1951, when it was given to the city. Neither accepted because it was almost full and there was no room for expansion.

Vandals have abused the cemetery over the years. At one time people found many tembstones piled in the middle of the property. A group of concerned families worked to put stones in their original places. Some mistakes may have been made, but it is believed to be in proper order.

In later years the Boy Scout Troop One, sponsored by Merrimack Mill and later by Huntsville Mfg. Co., cleaned and cared for the cemetery as a community project.

Some of the older tombstones are made of concrete with inscriptions scratched on with some simple sharp pointed tool. Most of these were made and inscribed by Wade Arthur Birmingham.

A driveway, not paved but free of tombstones, goes from east to west in the middle of the cemetery. However there is no way to keep going and return to the street. All cars must back out. That driveway has been moved from where it was originally placed. In the fence on the southwest side are two log fence posts. At one time, before the Holiday Homes development was built, this was another entrance or exit to the cemetery.

For years there was no fence at the front of Merrimack Cemetery. One was put up before 1995. On March 30, 1998, a four foot tall granite stone was put at the fence beside the driveway, with the name MERRIMACK CEMETERY, CIRCA 1900 engraved on its polished front. #### PEOPLE IN MERRIMACK CEMETERY

ACKLIN, JETTIE FAY, DEC. 1936 - 3 MAY 1937. NO STONE ACKLIN. THOMAS, JR. DIED DEC. 13, 1934. NO STONE

These were children of Thomas and Nellie (Johnson) Acklin who lived at 257 A. St. at the time of Thomas, Jr.'s death. When Jettie Fay died they lived on Athens Highway but Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Johnson, grandparents lived at 257 A. St, Merrimack. The burial was May 4, 1937.

Thomas and Nellie married Nov. 20, 1934, in Madison Co., Alabama. Thomas was born about 1912, in Alabama.

Nellie was born about 1916, in Georgia. Nellie's parents were Ernest and Pearl (Johnson) Johnson. Pearl Johnson died Dec. 20, 1934, and is buried in Marrimack Cemetery.

ADDISON, MINNIE, 1903 - 1926. (ROW 28)

Minnie was a daughter of John and Daisy Addison. John died in August of 1929, in Madison Co., Alabama.

John was born in Alabama about 1862. Daisy was born about 1885, in Mississippi.

In 1920, Minnie and twin sister Andie were the only children in the home with their parents. The twins were born 1903, in Mississippi.

ADKINS, DAVID, 1945 - 1946. (ROW 6)

ADKINS, GERTRUDE, 1934 - 1936. (ROW 6) ONE STONE FOR BOTH CHILDREN

Sam Adkins married Liddie (Lydia) Camp Dec. 22, 1923, Madison Co., Alabama. Sam's mother was Rose Adkins of Jackson Co., Alabama.

Liddie was from Sparta, Coffee Co. Tennessee. Her parents were James Wiley Camp and Becky Tennessee "Tennie." Nash. She was born Oct. 13, 1908.

Sam and Liddie Ann had nine children. Robert L., the first child was born when she was sixteen and Sam was twenty-two. The others were Bertha Pauline, Helen Louise, Hazel Ruth, Pearl Jean, Leida Gertrude, David Lee, Joyce and Hattie. David died of Leukemia. Cause of Gertrude's death was unknown.

Sam planted a Dogwood tree near the graves of their babies and in 1996, it still enhances the beauty of the cemetery.

Liddie had tuberculosis in the 1940s, and spent some time in the Tuberculosis sanitarium, but was alive in 1996.

In January of 1950, Liddie married William Lanier, son of William E. and Mary (Wiley) Lanier who was born July 17, 1880. Mr. Lanier was husband of Lenora Grace (McMinn) Lanier who died in 1948, and is buried in Merrimack Cemetery.

ADKINS, ROBERT LEE, 1930 - 1932. (ROW 21)

This was the first child of Ruby and Fred Adkins. In 1936, they had two children. Fred died before 1940.

Ruby (Hays) Adkins, daughter of Felix and Josie Hays, and Fred Adkins were the parents of Robert Lee.

Ruby's family moved to Huntsville in 1929, from Darden, Henderson Co. Tennessee. Her parents are also buried in Merrimack Cemetery.

ALLEN, EVELYN MAXINE, NOV. 22, 1926 - NOV. 11, 1927. (ROW 21) Evelyn was the first child of Dell L. and Thelma (Biggs) Allen. They married May 19, 1923, in Madison Co., Alabama. Dell was a son of Orrin and Annette Allen of Georgia.

Thelma was daughter of James E. and Mary Jane (Pruitt) Biggs of Cullman, Cullman Co., Alabama. Thelma's first husband was a Mr. Tillery, and she had a child, Hilda Bell, in that marriage.

Other children of Dell and Thelma were Joyce Ann and Harold Dell Allen.

Dell Allen was born June 28, 1900, and died in June, 1966. Thelma (Biggs) Allen was born March 7, 1901, and died in March, 1984.

This was a daughter of Lou Vena (Roberts) and Jordan Allen. Lou, born 1890, died 1985, was daughter of Mary (Anderson) and James L. Roberts. who married in 1879.

Jordan was a son of Samuel and Polly Allen from Mount Pleasant, Maury Co., Tennessee.

Lou and Jordan Allen had twelve other children. They were Tiny and Tina (twins died early), James Henry, Annice L. married Mr. Fergerson, Cynthia, born 1909, married Guthrie, Lilly, married Watson, then Yell, Ruby Leon, married Jones, then Barnett, Ruthie, married Himes, Macey Edward, killed in WWII, buried in Georgia, Jesse William, Molly married Ramano, and Polly, born 1926, married Johnson.

ANDERSON, ELMA INELL, SEPT. 7, 1924 - MAY 31, 1928. (ROW 27) ANDERSON, RAYMOND E., MAR. 13, 1922 - JAN. 22, 1923. (ROW 27)

These were children of Claude and Hattie (Graham) Anderson. Other children of Claude and Hattie were Paul Lee, Elsie, Ruth, Vivian, and Robert Earl.

Claude was son of Robert Lee and Mary Mavoleen (Hyman) Anderson. Hattie, was daughter of Elijah L. and Lucy (Culver) Graham of Jackson Co., Alabama. Elijah L., born Jan. 1873, was son of Harriett and Martin Van Graham of Lim Rock, Jackson Co. Alabama.

Lucy was daughter of Andrew Culver, a minister in Lim Rock, Jackson Co., Alabama. Claude was born Feb. 15, 1891, and died Mar. 3, 1989.

Hattie (Graham) Anderson was born Oct. 30, 1901, and died

Mary Mavoleen Hyman married Robert Lee Anderson Feb. 3, 1898, in Madison Co., Alabama. They were the parents of Robert Claude, Ruby L., Mamie E., Flora B. and Fearl Anderson. Ruby Lee married Green Phillips Jan. 21, 1922, and is buried in Merrimack Cemetery. Claude married Hattie Graham and two of their children are buried in Merrimack Cemetery. Flora married a Mr. Davis. Mamie Elma married a Chaney, Fearl married a Mr. Tuck. Their first children were born in Owens Cross Roads, Madison Co. Alabama.

ANDERSON, MARY FRANCES MARTIN, 1873/4 - 1924. NO STONE

Mary Frances Martin, born in 1873, or 1874, was a daughter of Rufus Jake Martin and his wife Martha of Jackson Co., Alabama. She married Jerry Clemons Anderson in Jackson Co. in 1907. Jerry was son of John and Gillie (Yarbrough) Anderson. He married his first wife in Jackson county and moved to Texas. After a divorce Jerry was left with several children to rear. Gillie tried to help him with the children in Texas but after a while Jerry returned to Alabama.

After his second marriage to Mary Frances Martin, Jerry and Frances moved to Texas where their son was born in 1911.

Jerry died shortly before or after the birth of Johnnie Clemons Anderson.

Frances moved to Huntsville and worked in Merrimack Mfg. Co. She died in the summer of 1924. Her son John became a preacher and died in 1977.

This child was son of William and Annie Anderson who lived at 469 C St, Merrimack. William was employed in Merrimack Manufacturing Co.

This little girl was the second child of Henry L. and Martha Ellen (Throneberry) Archer. They married Sept. 30 1919, in Madison Co., Alabama. Their other children were Cordie, George, Susan, Dave, William, Mildred, Margaret, Mary and Betty Archer.

ARCHER, MALCOMB E., JAN. 18, 1942 - FEB. 9, 1942. (ROW 3) ARCHER, THOMAS J., JR., JUNE 24, 1937 - JULY 28, 1937. (ROW 3)

Thomas J. Archer and Emma Mae Elmore married 17 August 1935, in Madison Co., Alabama. Marriage was performed by S. S. Hacher, M.G. Thomas was 21 and Emma was 18. These were their only children.

Thomas and Emma divorced. Emma married Homer Mefford and had three daughters, Gerry (married Smith), Diane (married Jones) and Kathy (married Ogles).

Emma's parents were Richard Paris and Winnie Arizona (Herron) Elmore. Arizona was a daughter of Gabe Herron and his first wife. Both the Elmores and Herrons were from Putnam Co., Tennessee. The Elmore children were William Virgil, Emma Mae and Winnie Odell (married Harold Neymark).

Thomas was son of William Charles and Ida (Lowery) Archer. Ida was daughter of Thomas H. and Rebecca (Crossley) Lowery. Rebecca had six children. Compiler thinks this may be a child of Clarence and Nina (Allen) Baker. Clarence, an overseer in Merrimack Mfg. Co., was son of Thomas L. and Mary E. Baker. The Baker family was from New Hope, Alabama.

Stacie married James (Jim) Guthrie, son of Virgil Guthrie, also of Tracy City, on November 11, 1902. They had eight children, William, Irene, Cathleen, Pascal, Ruth, Jasper, James Edward, and Thelma.

Jim worked in the coal mines but was hurt on the job. In 1926, when Thelma, the youngest child, was 6 years old, Jim came to Huntsville and arranged to take a job with Merrimack Mfg. Co., and rented a house in the village.

The next weekend he moved Stacie and the five youngest children to their new home. After about a month, Jim left one Saturday morning saying he may be late coming in, for he was walking to town to try to find a job for the older of the children who moved with them. In the evening Stacie prepared Jim's favorite foods for supper and waited for him to return home.

He never came home. The whole community tried to find him, thinking somthing dire had happened to him. Men searched in gulleys and creeks between Merrimack and downtown Huntsville. Flyers asking for information of his whereabouts were distributed.

When he did not return, Mr. Kidd Lovell, the Personnel Manager of Merrimack Mfg. Co. called Stacie into his office and told her she could not live in the mill house because no one was working in the mill. She said she did not have a place to go. The children were too young to work in the mill. They agreed that if the older boy, Fascal, would work in the mill when he was old enough and if she could pay the rent in the meantime, the family could stay there.

And that is what they did. She did laundry for neighbors and in the nights she sewed for the public to make money for rent and to rear the children. All but Thelma did work in the mill when they became old enough.

January 30, 1938, Stacie died of cancer believing Jim had died when he had left home that Saturday twelve years before.

Actually he had moved to Kentucky with a woman. After Stacie died he visited, with his common-law wife and a child, the children who still lived in Tracy City, and the children from Huntsville went to the reunion.

Eva Lee and Dovie were daughters of William Leroy McCarver and Annie (Widner) McCarver. In 1920, William and Annie had six children, Ethel, born about 1906, Rosa, born about 1909, James, born about 1911, Estelle, born about 1914, Lillian, born about 1916, and Eva Lee, born 1920.

There is a confusion about Eva's records. At the time of Eva's death she was planning to marry Frank Wilson Long. On Jan. 6, 1920, she was said to be 11 months old. On her license for marriage she said she was born Jan. 22, 1920. The license is dated Jan. 6, 1941. The obituary was in the Huntsville Times, Jan. 15, 1941, but the tombstone says she was born Dec. 10, 1920, and her death was given as Dec. 30, 1940. The stone has been moved away from her grave and is near the entrance of the cemetery (1997) but compiler can not find anyone who knows where the grave is located.

She was the youngest daughter of Will and Annie Lee (Widner) McCarver. James Turk McCarver of Jackson Co., Alabama was the father of Will, James McCarver and Ada (McCarver) Davis.

James L. McCarver died April 22, 1937, at the age of 41. He had been ill for a long time. He was buried in Merrimack Cemetery. When his wife Cythia (Justice) McCarver died Apr. 13, 1954, there was no room for her grave in Merrimack so she was buried in Maple Hill and James was moved to Maple Hill beside her. His removal left room for Dovie, daughter of Will and Annie (Widner) McCarver, when she died.





## MERRIMACK CEMETERY LATER KNOWN AS HUNTSVILLE PARK CEMETERY

Location: Section 10-45-1W, approximately center of NE/4. Occupies about two and one-half acres at corner of Dunn and Clopton Streets. From intersection of Bob Wallace and Triana Boulevard travel south one long block to Dunn Street. Turn west. Travel to Clopton Street. Turn north. Cemetery is a few feet on west side of street. A drive, unpaved, runs west from the street into the cametery. This cemetery was provided by Merrimack Mill, once located on Triana Pike, for the employees of the mill. It was in use in the early 1700s and by 1750s was full. More graves do not have stones than do have stones. This is the third enumeration of this cemetery that this compiler knows of but new stones have been placed on old graves and some stones have been moved away or vandalized. The tombstones are enumerated from rows that run south to north. Rows are numbered from east to west.

Note: Immediately south of the entrance, beneath bushes is the tombstone for Eva Lee McCarver, Dec. 10, 1920-Dec. 30, 1940. Compiler cannot find anyone who knows location of the grave.
