## CHAMBLESS-BYRNE (Flint Baptist Church)

LOCATION: Section 17-3-2E - E/2 E/2 NW SW. This very old cemetery is located 1/4 mile north of the present Flint River Primitive Baptist Church west of Maysville, Ala. It is located on a tree-covered hill top.

A lady living very near this cemetery pointed out a spot near the cemetery on which she said had stood the first Methodist Church in Madison County. She was in error about the denomination as it was a Baptist Church, not Methodist. In his "A History of Methodism in Alabama" [published in 1893] the Rev. Anson West, D. D. says "The Baptists were there equally early. They were there at the beginning of things, and they were strong and numerous for the number of inhabitants in the county at the time. On Flint River, North-east of Hunt's Spring, at the house of James Deaton, October 2, 1808, they constituted a Church with eleven or twelve members, which Church they named Flint River. This was the first Baptist Church in the county."

Countless graves are scattered all over this hill and most of them are unmarked or marked with unlettered fieldstones.

CHAMBLESS - Stephen W. Chambless Died Oct. 4, 1851 aged 26 years & 8 months. Though he fell, he shall not be utterly cast down; for the Lord upholdeth him with his hand.
