Haden in buried in the Pickens Cemetery. Her tombstone states: “In Memory of Jane Pickens Haden – 1833 – 1867.” The late **William Drake** stated she had three noteworthy sons: **Wade Haden**, **Charley Haden** (an ambassador) and **Hugh Haden**. She died at Summitt, Marshall County, Alabama in mid-winter during an abnormally cold period. The Tennessee River was frozen over and she was brought back for burial in a wagon. Her brother lived here at the time and his dog howled throughout the night she died even though the family in Madison County did not get word of her death until many hours later.
