White. Mat White (“Uncle Mat.”) [Unlettered fieldstone. Mat White was around 72 years of age when he died in about 1942.]

Webster. [Unlettered fieldstone. This is the grave of Forrest P. Webster’s father.]

Webster. Mattie E. Webster. 1890 – 1923.) Note: Mattie E. was Mattie Esslinger before her
) marriage.

Webster. Forrest P. Webster. 1888 – 1943) Dbl. stone.

Unlettered fieldstone. [Probably not a Webster but do not know who.]

Webster. Edward Webster. 1911 – 1937. [Son of Mattie & Forrest Webster.]

Webster. Ervin Webster. 1922 – 1945. [The son of Mattie & Forrest Webster.]

Row 2, South to North.

Dalton. Illegible funeral marker. [This was Riley Dalton’s wife who died in the fall of 1969.]

Dalton. Unlettered fieldstone. [This is the grave of Riley Dalton’s son who died ca 1966, two or three years before his mother.]

NOTE: There appeared to be some unmarked graves in the remainder of this row but the Russells were not sure and knew no one buried there.

Row 3, South to North.

Vann. Hubert C. Vann. Nov. 3, 1895 – Feb. 19, 1970. Military footstone:)
 Hubert C. Vann, Ala., Pvt., U. S. Army, World War I. (dates repeated)) Dbl. stone

Vann. Jennie M. Vann. March 25, 1900 – June 19, 1975. [nee Craft.])

Vann. Unlettered fieldstone. [This is the grave of Hubert and Jennie Vann’s daughter.]

Christian. Horace R. Christian. Sept. 3, 1891 – Apr. 10, 1926.)
) Dbl. stone

Christian. Ida L. Christian. Dec. 22, 1893 – Sept. 17, 1978 [nee Esslinger])

Christian. Daddy. Charles M. Christian. Dec. 10, 1934 – Dec. 7, 1976. [This is the grandson of Horace R. Christian. Horace R. Christian’s daughter married a Christian (different family) and this is their son. The great-grandfather of the man she married was from “up North” and settled at Owens Cross
