Gardiner. In Memory of Sarah Gardiner, wife of David Gardiner. Born Oct. 29, 1812 – Fell asleep in Christ Sept. 15, 1871 and so has entered upon that rest that remains for the people of God. Heb. 4.9.

Torbett. Sacred to the Memory of Cynthia A., wife of H. A. Torbett. Born April 18, 1833 – Died in hope of a glorious resurrection in Christ April 1, 1855 Aged 21 Years, 11 Mo. & 13 Ds.

Gardiner. Sacred to the Memory of Dr. D. C. B. Gardiner. Died July 20, 1853 Age 22 Ys., 8 Ms., & 11 days. Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord. Son of David Gardiner.

Terry. Elisabeth C., wife of D. W. Terry. Born Oct. 6, 1850 – Died Dec. 2, 1893. [D. W. Terry m. Miss E. Council Torbett Oct. 16, 1873 by J. L. Harris, Minister of the Gospel. Bondsmen were Terry and Joseph A. Brown on 11 Oct. 1873.]
