Williams. James Louis Williams – April 9, 1940 – June 16, 1964

Williams. Clarence Desso Williams – Nov. 4, 1935 – Jan. 30, 1945

Williams. Laura Ann Williams Jan. 24, 1964 – May 4, 1964. Our Baby.

Note: There were four rock, rectangular above-ground tombs in this cemetery. It is uncertain who is buried there. One has a CSA marker No. 329 by it.. Confederate Veterans Record says Iron Cross No. 329 was marking the grave of **L. G. James** and that he was buried in Campground Cemetery in Big Cove. The 1907 Confederate Census shows **Lewis Good James**, born Sept. 27, 1832 at Scottsboro “in Bibb County.” [Note: Scottsboro is in Jackson Co., not Bibb.] He entered service in May 1861 at Boone’s Hill, Tenn. in Co. A, 32nd Tennessee and continued until Lee’s surrender.

Winkel. Leo Winkel. Born Dec. 29, 1930 – died . . . 194 [Note: This was hand-carved on a rock and was partially illegible.]

MOORE CHAPEL CEMETERY (HOLMES CEMETERY)

Location: Section 10-4-1E. E/2 E/2 SE SE. This ancient burial ground is located one-third mile south of Dug Hill Road at the edge of a subdivision called Twickenham Manor. The TVA maps list this as the Holmes
