Scott Cemetery

The following was a four feet tall sandstone obelisk. It is copied here exactly as it appears on the stone:

IN MEMO OF T R. THE SON OF J W & M A SCOT T DEP. THIS L IFE NOV. 2. 1855 AGE 2. YEA & 3 M. OTHS **Translation**:

In memory of
T. R., the son of
J. W. & M. A. Scott
Departed this life
Nov. 2, 1855
Age 2 years & 3 months

Note: The *Southern Advocate* of 28 Nov 1855 reported that Thomas Reuben, son of John W. and Margaret Scott, died on Nov. 2nd aged 2 years, 2 months, 2 days.
