### **Knight Cemetery**

Location: Section 36-3-2E. NW SE NW. Across Gurley Pike from Beason Spring and behind some trailer houses. Copied March 9, 1985. Two huge, old trees that once stood at two corners of this cemetery had been cut some time before. The two Jacks tombstones were new. There appeared to be two graves in this cemetery marked by fieldstones but they may have been only stones lying there at random. I was taken to this cemetery by Guy Haislip.
