has since been run out by Hunter Peel, containing about Two hundred end forty three Acres, likewise, the following magroes, and their future increase, Sophia a woman about Twenty nine years old and her three children, Isham, Rose and Sarah.

REDUN"

Item. I lend to my son in bew Henry Jordan, a certain piece or percel of Land containing about One hundred and Thirty Six Acres, it being the south west part of the above named Fraction of Land, during his life, and at his death, I live the said Land to be equally divided between my grand sons, William H Jordan, James B. Jordan, and Henry C. Jordan, children of my dee'd daughter Mary Jordan. It also give to my said grand sons, William H James B and Henry C Jordan One Negro Boy Paplin about Twenty years old. It is my will and desire that if either of my said grand sons should die before they come of Lawful age or marry that their portion of the Land and Hegro given to them shall go to the aurvivors or survivor.

Iten. I give to my grand son william I. Emmer Son of my daughter Louisa Summer (after the death of my wife Nancy)
the Quarter section of Land I purchased of Eldred Rawlins but if my said Grand son William I Summer dies without leaving Lawful Heirs or Weir of his body; It is my will and deaire that the said Quarter Section of Land should be equally divided between my grandeons, William H, James B and Henry C Jordan or the survivors of them. I also give to my said grand Son William I Summer, the following negroes and their future increase, John about Twenty Hirman about Twelve, Evelina about eight and Lucy about Twenty four years old. Also a negro man George should be prove to be my property in a suit now depending in the County Court of Madison County, With the same proviso, as to the Land that is if my said grandson, William I Summer dies Lawful heirs or Heir of his body, that the said Megroes shall be equally divided between the children of my Daughter Matilda Allen, or their Survivors. It is also my will and desire that the negroes given to my said grand son, William I. Summer should remain in the possession and disposition of my wife Nancy to manage as she may think proper during her life for the purpose of raising end educating my said grand Son,

Item. I lend to my daughter, Matilda Allen (after the death of my wife Nancy) Two Quarter Sections of Land being the place of my rasidema for several years past during her life and at her death to be equally divided between her surviving children to them and their Heirs forever. I also lend to my said daughter, Matilda Allen during her life the following Negroes, and their future increase Edy a woman about Twenty one years old and her child, Alex, Jerome a boy about nine and Caroline a girl about eight years old and at her death to be equally divided between her surviving children.
