MOORE were pained to learn last Friday evening of the death of this honorable and honored gentleman, which occurred at his residence near the city about six o'clock.... JUDGE MOORE was elected a member of the Board of the Huntsville Female College in the year 1850 and held that position up to his death. He was a man whom everyone liked.
