October 12, 1892

BRECKENRIDGE, and when last heard of was carrying dispatches between the lines.

January 26 1893

MR. JOHN HARRIS, a venerable and respected citizen of the Maysville Precinct, visited the city yesterday. He was anxious to transact his business quickly as he had promised to return to his mother as soon as possible. Noting his appearance, someone asked how old his mother was, and he replied she was 101 years of age. (Cameron Church, Hurricane Creek. JOHN HARRIS, October 5, 1824. October 20, 1917. February 16, 1893

MR. J. W. COOPER breathed his last at his residence on Randolph Street last night. Last week his children were called home and all
