ordered in Knoxville Register and in a Huntsville paper (note by  
P. P. JOHN HAMBLEN moved from Hawkins County, Tennessee to Madison  
County, Alabama).

October 17, 1823

Married in Athens on Tuesday the 7th instant by the REV. D. P.  
BESTOR, MR. ALEXANDER A. McCARTNEY, Editor of the Alabama Gazette to  
MISS JANE BEATY, both formerly of Huntingdon, Pennsylvania (1830 census  
Limestone County, Alabama ALEX. A. McCARTNEY 1 m 30-40, 1 f 20-30).

October 24, 1823

MAJ. FRANCIS W. ARMSTRONG of Mobile and formerly of this place is  
appointed by the President of the United States, Marshall of the  
state of Alabama.

September 24, 1824

Died the 5th instant in the State of Alabama, DOCTOR BENJAMIN  
HARRISON of Kingston after a lingering illness of ten weeks, leaving  
a wife and five small children.

October 22, 1824

Huntsville, Alabama bank robbed 13th ult.

April 10, 1826

Died Sunday, the 26th ult. in Florence, Alabama, MR. EDWARD S.  
CAREY, aged 25, one of the Editors of the Florence Gazette. His father  
and other relations reside in this county (volume 10, #503).

September 5, 1827

\$50 Reward: Runaway... the above reward will be given for his being  
returned to the subscriber living near Moulton, Lawrence County,  
Alabama. THOMAS KYLE

April 20, 1831

Married on the 5th April in Washington City by the REV. MR.  
MATTHEWS, COL. FRANCIS W(ELLS) ARMSTRONG of Alabama to MISS ANN M.  
MILLARD, daughter of MR. MILLARD, merchant of that city. (2nd wife--  
his 1st wife, ELIZ. AYLETT, died 1823 as a bride, in Mobile; From  
National Intelligencer, Washington, D.C. April 8, 1831, "COL. FRANCIS W.  
ARMSTRONG of Alabama and ANN M. MILLARD, daughter of JOSHUA MILLARD of  
this city were married April 5, by REV. MR. MATTHEWS")

October 5, 1831

Died in Jackson County, Alabama on the morning of the 16th of  
September after an illness of five days, MRS. MARY CLAYTON, consort  
of the late DANIEL CLAYTON, deceased, aged about 55 years.

November 16, 1831

Died in the 48th year of his age, in Lauderdale County, Alabama,  
(at his residence), on the 20th of September. ISAAC BROWNLOW, Esq.  
Parents of the deceased came from Rockbridge County, Virginia, in early  
life. They raised a respectable and intelligent family of sons, three  
of whom, viz: WILLIAM, JOHN and ALEXANDER, died officers in the  
United States Navy.
